6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
8	to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds, for the
9	purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the
10	Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year
11	beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017
12	\$ 1,184,818,144.00.
13	SECTION 2. The following offices are supported by the funds
14	appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services,
15	the Office of Highways, the Office of Aeronautics and Rails and
16	the Office of Enforcement. Of the funds appropriated under the
17	provisions of Section 1, the following positions are authorized:

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2018 do not
exceed Fiscal Year 2017 funds appropriated for that purpose,
unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
2017 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2017
appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the

421	SECTION 52. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
422	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
423	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
424	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
425	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
426	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
427	SECTION 53. This act shall take effect and be in force from
428	and after July 1, 2016; and shall stand repealed from and after

June 30, 2016.

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
