HOUSE BILL NO. 1657 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2017.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017
10	\$ 1,051,522.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Marine
14	Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending
15	June 30, 2017\$ 22,969,183.00.
16	Of the funds appropriated in this section, Three Million
17	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,050,000.00) is derived from the state
18	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products.

19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
20	this act, the following positions are authorized:
21	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
22	Permanent: Full Time 104
23	Part Time 0
24	Time-Limited: Full Time
25	Part Time 1
26	Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor shall be
27	furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Six Hundred
28	Dollars (\$600.00) per annum.
29	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
30	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
31	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2018 do not
32	exceed Fiscal Year 2017 funds appropriated for that purpose,
33	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
34	2017 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
35	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
36	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
37	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
38	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
39	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
40	this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2017
41	appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
42	exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
43	the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal

- 44 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 45 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 46 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2017 "Personal Services"
- 47 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 48 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 49 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 50 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 52 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 53 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 55 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 58 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 59 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 61 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 62 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 63 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 65 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 66 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 67 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

68	SECTION 4.	It is the intention of the Legislature that	the

78	SECTION 5.	In addition to all other sums heretofore

149	Each political subdivision receiving funds authorized in this
150	section shall be held responsible for complying with Section
151	29-15-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, and shall be subject to an
152	audit by the State Auditor and shall submit detailed reports
153	beginning June 30, and every six (6) months thereafter for the
154	duration of the project to the Department of Marine Resources on
155	how funds authorized in this section were expended.
156	It is the intention of the Legislature that any political
157	subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the
158	subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department
159	of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2016. All proposals
160	submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of
161	Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures.
162	Multiphased projects, multiyear projects, proposed projects with
163	high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking
164	funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated.
165	It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of
166	the tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual
167	amount of tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be

168 allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this section.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the commission shall place any special trust funds appropriated to the department in a special trust fund and the interest earned on the principal shall be credited to the special trust fund. Monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the special trust fund for use in the next succeeding fiscal year. The department may use the interest earned on the fund to pay reasonable costs for administering the fund and related projects.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Marine Resources has the authorization to move tidelands funds between approved projects upon request from entity and proper completion of Form TTF-6 documentation.

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain utilities for state furnished housing for any employees. Such

- 193 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, 194 cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 195 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance 196 with legislative intent. Such state furnished housing shall 197 include single-family and multi-family residences but shall not 198 include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities 199 shall be prohibited.
- 200 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 201 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 202 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 203 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 204 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 205 206 actions contrary to this provision.
- 207 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 208 of Section 2, the amount of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) 209 shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the 210 credit of the Budget Contingency Fund, as created in Section 211 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as 212 determined by the Treasurer's Office, and shall be made available 213 for the Coastal Map Revision Project.
- 214 The Coastal Map Revision Project is to revise the floodplain 215 maps that encompass Hancock County, Harrison County and Jackson 216 County to reduce the number of properties that are located in 217 special flood hazard areas with Base Flood Elevations and V-Zone

218	designations. The remapping effort will reduce the insurance
219	rates and costs of construction along the Mississippi Gulf Coast.
220	The Southern Mississippi Planning and Development District shall
221	use the money appropriated by this act to contract with an
222	engineering firm to perform the modeling and engineering services
223	required to complete the Coastal Map Revision Project.
224	SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
225	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
226	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
227	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
228	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
229	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
230	SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from
231	and after July 1, 2016.
