1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2017.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017

L1	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L2	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
L3	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife,
L 4	Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source funds
L5	collected by or otherwise available to the department for the
L 6	support and maintenance of the department, including the Museum of
L7	Natural Science and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the
L8	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017

20	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
21	above in this section, is appropriated out of the state excise
22	taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the
23	Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
24	July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017\$ 5,750,000.00.
25	The State Tax Commission is directed to set aside the amount
26	of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit,
27	out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other
28	petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside from
29	such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
30	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,

46	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
47	this act, the following positions are authorized:

53	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
54	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
55	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2018 do not

57	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
58	2017 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
59	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
60	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
61	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
62	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
63	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
64	this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2017
65	appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
66	exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at

- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in

- 92 **SECTION 5.** Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be
- 93 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred
- 94 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.
- Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of
- 96 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one (1) county to
- 97 another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on
- 98 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.
- 99 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 100 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain
- 101 complete accounting and personnel records related to the
- 102 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
- 103 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
- 104 maintained for Fiscal Year 2016. It is further the intention of
- 105 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
- 106 2018 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
- in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
- 108 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2017 budget request

- 110 **SECTION 7.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 111 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 112 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 113 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 114 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

192	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the
193	following amount shall come from the Department of Wildlife,
194	Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund No. 3465, for
195	the purpose of making improvements to the Pearl River Wildlife
196	Management Area\$ 50,000.00.
197	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated within this act, the
198	Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may enter into
199	cooperative agreements with the board of supervisors of any county
200	or any group or combination of counties for the purpose of
201	creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish
202	habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such
203	county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and
204	authorized, in its discretion, to expend funds from the general
205	county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse
206	to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost
207	of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the
208	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto.
209	Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered,
210	in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry
211	out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United
212	States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
213	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
214	such purposes.
215	SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee

or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use

217	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
218	Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for
219	any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
220	Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
221	It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
222	authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
223	with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,

Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of

One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) and to

enter into an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension

Service for a project specialist and related supportive cost.

SECTION 13. The department is authorized to spend up to sixty percent (60%) of revenue in the State Park Timber Endowment Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state parks.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
made without competitive bids.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred
Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be provided to fund the Youth
Participation Initiative for the purpose of educating children in
the areas of hunting, fishing, conservation, and safety.

SECTION 16. The fund created pursuant to Section 49-5-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and known as the "Fisheries and Wildlife Fund" shall be treated as a special trust fund. All funds derived from the sale of licenses, fees, fines and other revenues received by the department as provided by law, shall be deposited in the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. In addition, revenue derived from the sale of timber on wildlife management areas, refuges and preserves shall be deposited into an account established for such revenues under the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. The interest and any investment income earned on the fund shall be credited by the State Treasurer to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund and shall not be paid into the General Fund. Any unexpended funds remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse and shall remain in the fund. Nothing in this section shall prevent the use of said funds from maintenance and upgrade on wildlife management areas and state parks.

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- 267 **SECTION 17.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no
- 268 more than One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 269 (\$1,500,000.00) be expended from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the
- 270 purchase of any type of motor vehicle.

- 280 for hunting opportunities that existed on July 1, 2006, as
- 281 provided in Section 49-5-99(4).
- 282 **SECTION 20.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 283 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have
- 284 the authority to enter into multi-year contracts for the purpose
- 285 of placing a sign on such state park property under the
- 286 department's domain, in accordance with any applicable rules and
- 287 regulations. All proceeds generated from these activities shall
- 288 remain with the department and shall be deposited into the proper
- 289 special fund.
- 290 **SECTION 21.** It is the intent of the Legislature that from
- 291 the funds available to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and

- Parks, the department may purchase and pay premium(s) on property damage insurance on its motor vehicles, boats, trailers, real property improvements, buildings, furnishings, and such other assets as may be appropriate or practical, and/or as required by a granting entity.
- SECTION 22. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
 of Section 2, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
 (\$1,750,000.00) shall be designated for the purpose of defraying
 the operational expenses of Special Projects. None of these funds
 shall be used for "Personal Services".
- SECTION 23. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.
- 309 SECTION 24. The department is authorized to establish an 310 annual golf pass for Mississippi residents, as defined by Section 311 49-7-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, which will allow the holder of such pass to play golf at any golf course operated by the 312 313 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, at 314 reduced rates. 319	SECTION 25. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
320	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
321	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
322	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
323	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
324	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law

325 **SECTION 26.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 326 and after July 1, 2016; and shall stand repealed from and after 327 June 30, 2016.
