- 3 WHEREAS, self-care is a lifelong daily habit of healthy
- 4 lifestyle choices, good hygiene practices, prevention of infection
- 5 and illness, avoiding unhealthy choices, monitoring for signs of
- 6 symptoms of changes in health, knowing when to consult a health
- 7 care practitioner and knowing when it is appropriate to self-treat
- 8 conditions; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the United States Food and Drug Administration deems
- 10 over-the-counter medicine safe and effective for the self-care
- 11 treatment of minor acute and chronic health conditions and
- 12 symptoms such as pain, the common cold, allergies and other
- 13 conditions that impact large segments of the population; and
- 14 WHEREAS, over-the-counter medicines are either developed as
- 15 new nonprescription medicines or switched from existing
- 16 prescription medicines; and

17	WHEREAS, over-the-counter medicines are self-care products							
18	that consumers purchase at pharmacies, supermarkets, retail stores							
19	and online; and							
20	WHEREAS, every dollar spent on over-the-counter medicines							
21	saves the United States health care system six to seven dollars							
22	each year totaling \$102 billion in annual savings; and							
23	WHEREAS, nonprescription medicines help to ease the burden of							
24	health care practitioners, eliminating unnecessary medical							
25	examinations that could be avoided with appropriate self-care; and							
26	WHEREAS, Mississippi benefits when its citizens practice							
27	appropriate self-care, do not unnecessarily visit health care							
28	practitioners and are empowered by higher self-esteem, improved							
29	health, and reduced use of health care services; and							
30	WHEREAS, Mississippi encourages its citizens to take							
31	advantage of self-care's potential to improve personal and public							
32	health, save personal and public treasury and strengthen the							
33	sustainability of the Mississippi health care system; and							
34	WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize							
35	self-care's potential as a shared opportunity for consumers,							
36	health care practitioners, policymakers and regulators:							
37	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF							
38	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRIN							
39	THEREIN, That we do hereby recognize the importance of improving
