## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 86

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE 2 EXPRESSING THE INCUMBENT URGENCY AND NECESSITY CONCERNING AN 3 APPLICATION TO THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS FOR AN ARTICLE V 4 CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF THE STATES FOR PROPOSING AMENDMENTS 5 TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION WHICH IMPOSE FISCAL RESTRAINTS 6 ON THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, LIMIT THE POWER AND JURISDICTION OF THE 7 FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, AND LIMIT THE TERMS OF OFFICE FOR ITS OFFICIALS AND FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS. 8 9 WHEREAS, the founders of the Constitution of the United 10 States empowered state legislators to be guardians of liberty 11 against future abuses of power by the federal government; and 12 WHEREAS, the federal government has created a crushing national debt through improper and imprudent spending; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the federal government has invaded the legitimate roles of the states through the manipulative process of federal 15 16 mandates, most of which are unfunded to a great extent; and 17 WHEREAS, the federal government has ceased to live under a proper interpretation of the Constitution of the United States; 18 19 and 20 WHEREAS, it is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of our people, particularly for the generations to come, 21 86 ~ OFFICIAL ~ N1/2H. - 22 by proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States
- 23 through a convention of the states under Article V of the United
- 24 States Constitution to place clear restraints on these and related
- 25 abuses of power; and
- 26 WHEREAS, it is imperative in nature as state elected
- 27 officials tasked with the responsibility of preserving the
- 28 integral rights of citizens and inherent power of the state
- 29 sovereignty affirmed under the 10th Amendment of the United States
- 30 Constitution, that the State of Mississippi expresses its
- 31 compelling interest in the need for a Constitutional Convention of
- 32 the states for the matter herein specified:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 34 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 35 THEREIN, That the Mississippi Legislature, acting on behalf of the
- 36 entire populace of the State of Mississippi, hereby applies to
- 37 Congress, under the provisions of Article V of the Constitution of
- 38 the United States, for the calling of a convention of the states
- 39 limited to proposing amendments to the United States Constitution
- 40 that impose fiscal restraints on the federal government, limit the
- 41 power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and limit the
- 42 terms of office for its officials and for members of Congress.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this application shall be deemed
- 44 an application for a convention to address each or all of the
- 45 subjects herein stated. For the purposes of determining whether
- 46 two-thirds (2/3) of the states have applied for a convention

47 addressing any of the subjects stated herein, this application is 48 to be aggregated with the applications of any other state legislatures for the single subjects of balancing the federal 49 50 budget, limiting the power and jurisdiction of the federal 51 government, and limiting the terms of federal officials. 52 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this application to the 53 54 President and Secretary of the United States Senate and to the 55 Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, 56 to transmit copies to the members of the United States Senate and 57 United States House of Representatives from this state, and to transmit copies hereof to the presiding officers of each of the 58 59 legislative houses in the several states, requesting their 60 cooperation. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this application constitutes a 61 62 continuing application in accordance with Article V of the

Constitution of the United States until the legislatures of at

least two-thirds (2/3) of the several states have made

applications on the same subject.
