- WHEREAS, qualified graduating seniors are given laundry 10
- 11 baskets, the goal is to fill as many as 40 baskets with college
- supplies to help seniors continue their academic success beyond 12
- high school, an initiative Mrs. Lillian Sims and the school 13
- 14 administration have made it their highest priority to ensure that
- these students continue to achieve their dreams; and 15
- 16 WHEREAS, Mrs. Lillian Sims is the Senior English teacher at
- Pisqah High School and in 2015 organized Mississippi's First 17
- Academic College Signing Day, inspired by watching a Pisgah High 18

- 19 School athlete sign a scholarship offer in front of his classmates
- 20 and the coaching staff of his new team; and
- 21 WHEREAS, enjoying the pageantry of the moment, Mrs. Sims
- 22 contacted the recruiters at the colleges where Pisgah's seniors
- 23 planned to attend, these recruiters sent T-shirts and set up
- 24 tables with each college's teacher alumni as their
- 25 representatives, she also invited parents and underclassmen to
- 26 watch the Class of 2015 "sign" with their colleges of choice; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Pisgah High School is a Class 2A public school in
- 28 Brandon, Mississippi, serving the northernmost corner of Rankin
- 29 County, with 400 students in Grades 7-12; and
- 30 WHEREAS, as a Title 1 school, many students face the
- 31 challenges of poverty, but the students are high achievers, as
- 32 indicated by the Mississippi Department of Education's designation
- 33 of Pisgah High School as a "high-performing" school for the last
- 34 four years, as well as earning recognition by U.S. News and World
- 35 Report for the past seven years and is the publication's National
- 36 Bronze Level School status, and last year, Pisgah High School
- 37 seniors earned a record \$3 Million in scholarship offers; and
- 38 WHEREAS, Pisqah High School has seen tremendous growth in
- 39 recent years, the 2016 Senior Class, consisting of nearly 60
- 40 students, will be the largest ever, the capstone of their time at
- 41 Pisgah High School being their "College Signing Day"; and
- 42 WHEREAS, The Clarion-Ledger covered the event with a photo
- 43 gallery and the students felt prodigious pride for their school,

- 44 the event furthered the message to both graduates and
- 45 underclassmen that academic achievement is an exceptional
- 46 achievement to be proud of; and
- WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 48 outstanding contributions to education like Mrs. Sims, who has
- 49 helped ensure her students continue to seek the immeasurable
- 50 rewards of higher education, in addition to bettering the lives of
- 51 her students, she has served as an excellent example for all those
- 52 serving as educators, and it is with great pride that we commend a
- 53 wonderful example for public schools in the State of Mississippi,
- 54 which has brought attention to a student record of achievement in
- 55 a most appropriate celebration:
