HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 100

1 2 3 4	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND SUPPORTING THE CAREGIVERS TASK FORCE FOR PROVIDING THE EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES AND SKILLS NECESSARY TO PROVIDE SENIOR CITIZENS AND INDIVIDUALS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS THE APPROPRIATE AND ADEQUATE LEVEL OF CARE.
5	WHEREAS, family caregivers play a vital role in enabling
6	frail seniors, people with serious health challenges, persons with
7	special needs and others requiring assistance with activities of
8	daily living to remain in their homes; and
9	WHEREAS, enabling people to remain at home for as long as
10	possible is both more compassionate and more affordable than
11	institutional care, which comes at a high cost, often supported by
12	taxes; and
13	WHEREAS, in Mississippi, 800,000 family caregivers provide
14	373 million hours of care, an economic value of nearly 5 million
15	dollars valued at \$11.53 per hour; and
16	WHEREAS, by 2030, the percentage of individuals in
17	Mississippi over the age of 65 is expected to rise to 25 percent
18	or one in four individuals, with the 85-plus group the fastest
19	growing group, expected to increase to 147 percent by 2040; and

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- 20 WHEREAS, over 30 percent of adults 60-plus have one or more
- 21 disabilities, including disabilities that affect self-care; and
- 22 WHEREAS, medical advances allow millions to live much longer
- 23 with chronic illnesses, increasing the requirement for caregiving;
- 24 and
- 25 WHEREAS, the stress imposed on families by caregiving is a
- 26 health risk factor that warrants attention as a public health
- 27 issue; and
- 28 WHEREAS, caregiving imposes significant financial burdens on
- 29 both caregivers and employers, affecting the economy and
- 30 contributing to the impoverishment of families; and
- 31 WHEREAS, nationally, caregiver services were valued at 470
- 32 billion dollars per year in 2013; and
- 33 WHEREAS, the Alzheimer's Association estimates that one in
- 34 nine Americans aged 65 and older are affected with the condition;
- 35 and
- 36 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize
- 37 contributions to the health and well-being of Mississippians of
- 38 all ages and abilities such as that of the Caregivers Task Force,
- 39 which has worked tirelessly to ensure that the elderly and those
- 40 living with special needs receive the proper level of care in an
- 41 effective and dignified manner:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 43 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 44 THEREIN, That we do recognize and support the important role that

46	initiatives to provide the support and training needed to make
47	family caregiving more feasible, affordable and effective.
48	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we encourage efforts at the
49	state and national level to analyze population demographic trends
50	to determine both current and future service requirements for care
51	recipients and caregivers, and to permit data-driven policy and
52	program recommendations about our aging populations and the
53	workforce development needed to empower those who need care to
54	heal, age and live in peace.
55	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we encourage employers to
56	establish policies that recognize the impact that caregiving can
57	have on workers, encouraging employers to find ways to support
58	their workers during difficult family times, and we encourage the
59	creation of volunteer "Caregiver Corps" to provide nonmedical
60	assistance and companionship to frail elders and others with
61	disability at no public expense.
