## SENATE BILL NO. 2024

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-15-5 AND 73-15-20, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES 3 SHALL HAVE FULL PRACTICE AUTHORITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 73-15-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 73-15-5. (1) "Board" means the Mississippi Board of 7 Nursing. 8 9 (2) The "practice of nursing" by a registered nurse means the performance for compensation of services which requires 10 11 substantial knowledge of the biological, physical, behavioral, psychological and sociological sciences and of nursing theory as 12 the basis for assessment, diagnosis, planning, intervention and 13 14 evaluation in the promotion and maintenance of health; management of individuals' responses to illness, injury or infirmity; the 15 16 restoration of optimum function; or the achievement of a dignified death. "Nursing practice" includes, but is not limited to, 17 18 administration, teaching, counseling, delegation and supervision

The foregoing shall not be deemed to include acts of medical diagnosis or prescriptions of medical, therapeutic or corrective measures, except as may be set forth by rules and regulations promulgated and implemented by the Mississippi Board of Nursing.

26 "Clinical nurse specialist practice" by a certified (3)27 clinical nurse specialist means the delivery of advanced practice 28 nursing care to individuals or groups using advanced diagnostic 29 and assessment skills to manage and improve the health status of 30 individuals and families; diagnose human responses to actual or 31 potential health problems; plan for health promotion, disease prevention, and therapeutic intervention in collaboration with the 32 33 patient or client; implement therapeutic interventions based on 34 the nurse specialist's area of expertise and within the scope of 35 advanced nursing practice, including, but not limited to, direct patient care, counseling, teaching, collaboration with other 36 37 licensed health care providers; and, coordination of health care 38 as necessary and appropriate and evaluation of the effectiveness 39 of care.

40 (4) "Advanced nursing practice" means, in addition to the
41 practice of professional nursing, the performance of
42 advanced-level nursing approved by the board which, by virtue of
43 graduate education and experience are appropriately performed by

48 (5) The "practice of nursing" by a licensed practical nurse 49 means the performance for compensation of services requiring basic 50 knowledge of the biological, physical, behavioral, psychological 51 and sociological sciences and of nursing procedures which do not 52 require the substantial skill, judgment and knowledge required of a registered nurse. These services are performed under the 53 54 direction of a registered nurse or a licensed physician or 55 licensed dentist and utilize standardized procedures in the 56 observation and care of the ill, injured and infirm; in the 57 maintenance of health; in action to safequard life and health; and in the administration of medications and treatments prescribed by 58 59 any licensed physician or licensed dentist authorized by state law 60 to prescribe. On a selected basis, and within safe limits, the role of the licensed practical nurse shall be expanded by the 61 62 board under its rule-making authority to more complex procedures and settings commensurate with additional preparation and 63 64 experience.

(6) A "license" means an authorization to practice nursing
as a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse designated
herein.

holds the privilege to practice under the provisions of this
article and who practices nursing as defined herein. "RN" is the
abbreviation for the title of Registered Nurse.

72 (8) A "licensed practical nurse" is a person who is licensed 73 or holds the privilege to practice under this article and who 74 practices practical nursing as defined herein. "LPN" is the 75 abbreviation for the title of Licensed Practical Nurse.

76 (9) A "registered nurse in clinical practice" is one who 77 functions in any health care delivery system which provides 78 nursing services.

(10) A "clinical nurse specialist" is a person who is licensed or holds the privilege to practice under this article in this state to practice professional nursing and who in this state practices advanced nursing as defined herein. "CNS" is the abbreviation for the title of Clinical Nurse Specialist.

84 (11) An "advanced practice registered nurse" is a person who is licensed or holds the privilege to practice under this article 85 86 and who is certified in advanced practice registered nurse or 87 specialized nursing practice and includes certified registered nurse midwives, certified registered nurse anesthetists and 88 89 certified nurse practitioners. "CNM" is the abbreviation for the 90 title of Certified Nurse Midwife, "CRNA" is the abbreviation for 91 the title of Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist. "CNP" is the abbreviation for the title of Certified Nurse Practitioner. 92

No. 2024 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 16/SS01/R332 PAGE 4 (tb\rc) 93 (12) A "nurse educator" is a registered nurse who meets the 94 criteria for faculty as set forth in a state-accredited program of 95 nursing for registered nurses, or a state-approved program of 96 nursing for licensed practical nurses, and who functions as a 97 faculty member.

98 (13)A "consumer representative" is a person representing the interests of the general public, who may use services of a 99 100 health agency or health professional organization or its members 101 but who is neither a provider of health services, nor employed in 102 the health services field, nor holds a vested interest in the 103 provision of health services at any level, nor has an immediate 104 family member who holds vested interests in the provision of 105 health services at any level.

106 (14) "Privilege to practice" means the authorization to 107 practice nursing in the state as described in the Nurse Licensure 108 Compact provided for in Section 73-15-22.

(15) "Licensee" is a person who has been issued a license to practice nursing in the state or who holds the privilege to practice nursing in the state.

SECTION 2. Section 73-15-20, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

114 73-15-20. (1) Advanced practice registered nurses. Any 115 nurse desiring to be certified as an advanced practice registered 116 nurse shall apply to the board and submit proof that he or she

(a) Satisfactory completion of a formal post-basic educational program of at least one (1) academic year, the primary purpose of which is to prepare nurses for advanced or specialized practice.

123 Certification by a board-approved certifying body. (b) 124 Such certification shall be required for initial state 125 certification and any recertification as a registered nurse 126 anesthetist, nurse practitioner or nurse midwife. The board may 127 by rule provide for provisional or temporary state certification 128 of graduate nurse practitioners for a period of time determined to 129 be appropriate for preparing and passing the National 130 Certification Examination. Those with provisional or temporary 131 certifications must practice under the direct supervision of a 132 licensed physician or a certified nurse practitioner or certified 133 nurse midwife with at least five (5) years of experience.

(c) Graduation from a program leading to a master's or post-master's degree in a nursing clinical specialty area with preparation in specialized practitioner skills.

137 (2) Rulemaking. The board shall provide by rule the
138 appropriate requirements for advanced practice registered nurses
139 in the categories of certified registered nurse anesthetist,
140 certified nurse midwife and advanced practice registered nurse.
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142 ( \* \* \*3) Renewal. The board shall renew a license for an 143 advanced practice registered nurse upon receipt of the renewal application, fees and protocol or practice quidelines. 144 The board shall adopt rules establishing procedures for license renewals. 145 146 The board shall by rule prescribe continuing education 147 requirements for advanced practice nurses not to exceed forty (40) hours biennially as a condition for renewal of a license or 148 149 certificate.

150 ( \* \* \*4) **Reinstatement.** Advanced practice registered 151 nurses may reinstate a lapsed privilege to practice upon 152 submitting documentation of a current active license to practice professional nursing, a reinstatement application and fee, \* \* \* 153 154 documentation of current certification as an advanced practice 155 nurse in a designated area of practice by a national certification 156 organization recognized by the board and documentation of at least 157 forty (40) hours of continuing education related to the advanced 158 clinical practice of the nurse practitioner within the previous two-year period. The board shall adopt rules establishing the 159 160 procedure for reinstatement.

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162 (\*\*\*<u>5</u>) Practice requirements. The advanced practice 163 registered nurse shall practice:

164 (a) According to standards and guidelines of the165 National Certification Organization.

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169 (\*\*\*<u>c</u>) Advanced practice registered nurses
170 practicing as nurse anesthetists must practice according to
171 board-approved practice guidelines that address pre-anesthesia
172 preparation and evaluation; anesthesia induction, maintenance, and
173 emergence; post-anesthesia care; peri-anesthetic and clinical
174 support functions.

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176 (\*\*\*<u>d</u>) Nurse practitioners may not write 177 prescriptions for, dispense or order the use of or administration 178 of any schedule of controlled substances except as contained in 179 this chapter.

180 ( \* \* \*6) Prescribing controlled substances and medications. Certified nurse midwives \* \* \*, certified nurse practitioners and 181 182 certified registered nurse anesthetists may apply for controlled 183 substance prescriptive authority after completing a board-approved educational program. Certified nurse midwives \* \* \* certified 184 185 nurse practitioners and certified registered nurse anesthetists 186 who have completed the program and received prescription authority 187 from the board may prescribe Schedules II-V. The words "administer," "controlled substances" and "ultimate user \* \* \*" 188 189 shall have the same meaning as set forth in Section 41-29-105, 190 unless the context otherwise requires. The board shall promulgate 191 rules governing prescribing of controlled substances, including

Prescribing any 194 195 controlled substance in violation of the rules promulgated by the 196 board shall constitute a violation of Section 73-15-29(1)(f), (k) 197 and (1) and shall be grounds for disciplinary action. The 198 prescribing, administering or distributing of any legend drug or 199 other medication in violation of the rules promulgated by the 200 board shall constitute a violation of Section 73-15-29(1)(f), (k) 201 and (1) and shall be grounds for disciplinary action.

202 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 203 and after July 1, 2016.
