SENATE BILL NO. 2138

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-21-105, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REDEFINE "ABUSED CHILD" TO INCLUDE A TRAFFICKED CHILD; AND FOR
- 3 RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4
- **SECTION 1.** Section 43-21-105, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5
- amended as follows: 6
- 43-21-105. The following words and phrases, for purposes of 7
- this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the 8
- 9 context clearly otherwise requires:
- (a) "Youth court" means the Youth Court Division. 10
- 11 "Judge" means the judge of the Youth Court
- 12 Division.
- (c) "Designee" means any person that the judge appoints 13
- 14 to perform a duty which this chapter requires to be done by the
- 15 judge or his designee. The judge may not appoint a person who is
- 16 involved in law enforcement to be his designee.

- 17 "Child" and "youth" are synonymous, and each means
- 18 a person who has not reached his eighteenth birthday. A child who

- 19 has not reached his eighteenth birthday and is on active duty for
- 20 a branch of the armed services or is married is not considered a
- 21 "child" or "youth" for the purposes of this chapter.
- (e) "Parent" means the father or mother to whom the
- 23 child has been born, or the father or mother by whom the child has
- 24 been legally adopted.
- 25 (f) "Guardian" means a court-appointed guardian of the
- 26 person of a child.
- 27 (g) "Custodian" means any person having the present
- 28 care or custody of a child whether such person be a parent or
- 29 otherwise.
- 30 (h) "Legal custodian" means a court-appointed custodian
- 31 of the child.
- 32 (i) "Delinquent child" means a child who has reached
- 33 his tenth birthday and who has committed a delinquent act.
- 34 (j) "Delinquent act" is any act, which if committed by
- 35 an adult, is designated as a crime under state or federal law, or
- 36 municipal or county ordinance other than offenses punishable by
- 37 life imprisonment or death. A delinquent act includes escape from
- 38 lawful detention and violations of the Uniform Controlled
- 39 Substances Law and violent behavior.
- 40 (k) "Child in need of supervision" means a child who
- 41 has reached his seventh birthday and is in need of treatment or
- 42 rehabilitation because the child:

43	(i) Is habitually disobedient of reasonable and
44	lawful commands of his parent, guardian or custodian and is
45	ungovernable; * * *
46	(ii) While being required to attend school,
47	willfully and habitually violates the rules thereof or willfully
48	and habitually absents himself therefrom; * * *
49	(iii) Runs away from home without good cause; or
50	(iv) Has committed a delinquent act or acts.
51	(1) "Neglected child" means a child:
52	(i) Whose parent, guardian or custodian or any
53	person responsible for his care or support, neglects or refuses,
54	when able so to do, to provide for him proper and necessary care
55	or support, or education as required by law, or medical, surgical,
56	or other care necessary for his well-being; however, a parent who
57	withholds medical treatment from any child who in good faith is
58	under treatment by spiritual means alone through prayer in
59	accordance with the tenets and practices of a recognized church or
60	religious denomination by a duly accredited practitioner thereof
61	shall not, for that reason alone, be considered to be neglectful
62	under any provision of this chapter; * * *
63	(ii) Who is otherwise without proper care,
64	custody, supervision or support; * * *

(iii) Who, for any reason, lacks the special care

made necessary for him by reason of his mental condition, whether

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67	the	mental	condition	is	having	mental	illness	or	having	an

- 68 intellectual disability; or
- (iv) Who, for any reason, lacks the care necessary
- 70 for his health, morals or well-being.
- 71 (m) "Abused child" means a child:
- 72 (i) Whose parent, guardian or custodian or any
- 73 person responsible for his care or support, whether legally
- 74 obligated to do so or not, has caused or allowed to be caused,
- 75 upon the child, sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, emotional
- 76 abuse, mental injury, nonaccidental physical injury or other
- 77 maltreatment.
- 78 (ii) Who is or has been trafficked within the
- 79 meaning of the Mississippi Human Trafficking Act (Section 97-3-54
- 80 et seq.) by any person, without regard to the relationship of the
- 81 trafficker to the child.
- 82 However, physical discipline, including spanking, performed on a
- 83 child by a parent, quardian or custodian in a reasonable manner
- 84 shall not be deemed abuse under this section.
- 85 (n) "Sexual abuse" means obscene or pornographic
- 86 photographing, filming or depiction of children for commercial
- 87 purposes, or the rape, molestation, incest, prostitution or other
- 88 such forms of sexual exploitation of children under circumstances
- 89 which indicate that the child's health or welfare is harmed or
- 90 threatened.



91 (o) "A child in need of special care" means a chi
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- 92 with any mental or physical illness that cannot be treated with
- 93 the dispositional alternatives ordinarily available to the youth
- 94 court.
- 95 (p) A "dependent child" means any child who is not a
- 96 child in need of supervision, a delinquent child, an abused child
- 97 or a neglected child, and which child has been voluntarily placed
- 98 in the custody of the Department of Human Services by his parent,
- 99 quardian or custodian.
- 100 (q) "Custody" means the physical possession of the
- 101 child by any person.
- 102 (r) "Legal custody" means the legal status created by a
- 103 court order which gives the legal custodian the responsibilities
- 104 of physical possession of the child and the duty to provide him
- 105 with food, shelter, education and reasonable medical care, all
- 106 subject to residual rights and responsibilities of the parent or
- 107 guardian of the person.
- 108 (s) "Detention" means the care of children in
- 109 physically restrictive facilities.
- 110 (t) "Shelter" means care of children in physically
- 111 nonrestrictive facilities.
- 112 (u) "Records involving children" means any of the
- 113 following from which the child can be identified:
- 114 (i) All youth court records as defined in Section
- 115 43-21-251;

- 118 (iii) All law enforcement records as defined in Section 43-21-255:
- 120 (iv) All agency records as defined in Section 121 43-21-257; and
- (v) All other documents maintained by any
 representative of the state, county, municipality or other public
 agency insofar as they relate to the apprehension, custody,
 adjudication or disposition of a child who is the subject of a
 youth court cause.
- 127 (v) "Any person responsible for care or support" means
 128 the person who is providing for the child at a given time. This
 129 term shall include, but is not limited to, stepparents, foster
 130 parents, relatives, nonlicensed baby-sitters or other similar
 131 persons responsible for a child and staff of residential care
 132 facilities and group homes that are licensed by the Department of
 133 Human Services.
- 134 (w) The singular includes the plural, the plural the 135 singular and the masculine the feminine when consistent with the 136 intent of this chapter.
- 137 (x) "Out-of-home" setting means the temporary

 138 supervision or care of children by the staff of licensed day care

 139 centers, the staff of public, private and state schools, the staff

 140 of juvenile detention facilities, the staff of unlicensed

141	residential	care	facilities	s and	group	homes	and	the	staff	of,	or
142	individuals	repre	esenting, o	churcl	nes, c	ivic o	r so	cial	organi	izat:	ions.

- "Durable legal custody" means the legal status 143 created by a court order which gives the durable legal custodian 144 145 the responsibilities of physical possession of the child and the 146 duty to provide * * * the child with care, nurture, welfare, food, 147 shelter, education and reasonable medical care. All these duties 148 as enumerated are subject to the residual rights and 149 responsibilities of the natural parent(s) or guardian(s) of the 150 child or children.
- 151 (z) "Status offense" means conduct subject to
 152 adjudication by the youth court that would not be a crime if
 153 committed by an adult.
- 154 (aa) "Financially able" means a parent or child who is 155 ineligible for a court-appointed attorney.
- 156 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 157 and after its passage.
