SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 558

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS OF FORMER 6TH
2 DISTRICT CHANCELLOR EDWARD C. (ED) PRISOCK OF LOUISVILLE,
3 MISSISSIPPI, AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

4 WHEREAS, respected Chancellor and member of The Mississippi
5 Bar, Edward C. (Ed) Prisock, passed away on July 30, 2015; and

6 WHEREAS, Ed was born on February 23, 1941, in Philadelphia,
7 Mississippi, to the late Neal and Athalia Jones Prisock. He lived
8 all of his life in Louisville, Mississippi, where he met and
9 married his beloved wife of 44 years, Edna Joy Caperton Prisock;

11 WHEREAS, Ed was a graduate of Louisville High School,
12 Mississippi State University and University of Mississippi Law
13 School; and

14 WHEREAS, he served as Chancery Judge for the 6th District for
15 30 years; and

16 WHEREAS, he was instrumental in the founding and early
17 direction of both Grace Christian School and Covenant Presbyterian



18 Church in Louisville. Up until his death, he was an Elder at
19 Grace Presbyterian Church in Starkville, Mississippi; and

20 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Edna Joy; son, Robert
21 (Reagan); daughter, Jessica (Zachary) Madison; one grandchild,
22 Mary Grace Madison; and one niece, Jo Ellen (Johnny) Cantrell. He
23 was preceded in death by his sister, Ellen (Jim) Prisock Maxwell;

25 WHEREAS, Chancellor Prisock insisted on the professional
26 standards of the practice, including ethics, integrity, civility,
27 courtesy and adherence to the Golden Rule and his life honored
28 both The Mississippi Bar and this great state that he loved and
