SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 598

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE SERVICE AND 2 CAREER OF DECORATED WORLD WAR II VETERAN, FORMER OLIVE BRANCH 3 ALDERMAN, DESOTO COUNTY SUPERVISOR, COMMUNITY LEADER AND 4 SUCCESSFUL BUSINESSMAN BILLY GRAY "BILL" ALLEN AND EXTENDING THE 5 PROFOUND SORROW OF THE LEGISLATURE TO HIS SURVIVING FAMILY ON HIS 6 PASSING.

7 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of 8 decorated World War II Veteran, Alderman, Supervisor and DeSoto 9 County Community leader and businessman Bill Allen on February 10, 10 2016; and

WHEREAS, Billy Gray "Bill" Allen was born on September 21, 11 1924, in Cockrum, Mississippi. His parents were William H. "Will" 12 Allen and Edith Nora French Allen. Mr. Allen grew up in Cockrum 13 14 and attended high school in Olive Branch, where he graduated in 15 the spring of 1942. After graduating from Olive Branch High School, he joined the United States Army Air Force at the age of 16 17 18 years old. He completed training at the Army Air Force Gunnery 18 School and was assigned to the 457th Bombardment Squadron of the 330th Bomb Group on the eleven-man crew of a Boeing B-29 19 20 Superfortress bomber called the City of San Jose. stationed on the island of Guam in the North Pacific and he flew on numerous bombing missions over Japan during his tour of duty. He was honorably discharged in February 1946, at the rank of Staff Sergeant after receiving the U.S. Army Air Medal; and

25 WHEREAS, in 1949, Mr. Allen met Marthola Smith while working 26 on a construction job in Dresden, Tennessee, and were married in 27 September of that year. Their marriage lasted 64 years, until 28 Marthola's death in March 2013. The couple have two daughters, 29 Dr. Edith Robinson and Mrs. Ellen Haraway; four grandchildren: 30 Mrs. Leigh Ellen Robinson Doddridge, Mrs. Maggie Robinson 31 Yacoubian, Mrs. Lucia Haraway Nelson, and Dr. Neil Haraway; and 10 32 great-grandchildren; and

33 WHEREAS, Mr. Allen had served the Olive Branch community in numerous ways throughout his life. He was elected Deacon in the 34 First Baptist Church of Olive Branch in 1959 and served as Deacon 35 36 Emeritus there until his death. He was on the Olive Branch Board 37 of Aldermen for 4 years; he represented Olive Branch on the DeSoto County Board of Supervisors for 8 years; and he was instrumental 38 39 in starting the Olive Branch Volunteer Ambulance Service where both he and his wife, Marthola, served as volunteer first 40 41 responders on the ambulance for 15 years. Additionally, he was a 42 charter member of the Olive Branch Chamber of Commerce. He was a member of the Rotary Club from its inception in Olive Branch, and 43 was presented the Rotary Club's Paul Harris Fellow Award in 2013. 44 Mr. Allen was also a charter member of and helped organize the 45

50 WHEREAS, Mr. Allen was a successful businessman in Olive 51 Branch for over 50 years. He was co-owner of the Allen-Davidson 52 Lumber Company in Olive Branch for several years and a partner in 53 Almac Construction Company. Almac built over 150 new homes in and 54 around Olive Branch from 1970 to 1990; and

55 WHEREAS, because of his legacy of dedicated service to the 56 Olive Branch community, Mr. Allen was selected for induction into 57 the Olive Branch Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame Induction 58 Ceremony for him and four other inductees is scheduled for this 59 April; and

60 WHEREAS, we pay tribute and cherish fondly the memory of this 61 most public-spirited citizen of Mississippi who leaves a legacy of 62 military and public service and business leadership in his 63 community and state:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That we do hereby pay tribute to the service and career of decorated World War II Veteran, former Olive Branch Alderman, DeSoto County Supervisor, Community Leader and successful businessman Billy Gray "Bill" Allen and extend the profound sorrow of the Legislature to his surviving family on his passing.
