- 3 " SECTION 4. (1) The school board of each school district or
- 4 school having an accreditation rating of "C," "D" F," as
- 5 defined by the State Board of Education, shall adopt policies and
- 6 procedures regarding the daily curriculum in schools, weekly
- 7 homework assignments, parental involvement, dress codes, school
- 8 holidays, parent-teacher conferences and a school syllabus. The
- 9 policies and procedures must include, but not necessarily be
- 10 limited to, the following:
- 11 (a) Every child must be assigned daily homework
- 12 assignments;

- (b) Every child must be taught to write in proper
 manuscript and cursive lettering, which must be reinforced through
 weekend homework assignments at every grade level;
- 16 (c) Every child must be assigned a daily reading 17 assignment;
- (d) Every child must be assigned a daily written

 19 assignment to accompany the daily reading assignment in order to

 20 assess the reading comprehension level of the child;
- (e) Every child must be assigned a minimum of five (5) words per week in each subject area to learn to spell, define and use in a sentence, which must be used to assess the child's retention of the assignment;
- 25 (f) Every child must be assigned a minimum of one (1)
 26 book to read per subject each month and must write a short report
 27 on the subject matter of the book, which report must be used to
 28 assess the child's learning ability. Children in primary grades
 29 may be allowed to draw pictures, elaborate orally or use any other
 30 alternative method to tell about their books;
- g) Every parent or guardian of a child shall
 participate in one (1) supportive service for the school district,
 such as assisting at the bus stop, working the concession stand
 for an athletic event, chaperoning a school sponsored event,
 serving in the Parent Teacher Association, or serving as a mentor,
 resource officer, tutor or other related activity that is deemed
 appropriate by the school or school district;

- 38 (h) Every teacher shall dress in a professional manner,
- 39 which does not include wearing blue jeans, denim jeans or tee

- 42 (i) Every child must be required to wear a school
- 43 uniform;
- (j) Permanent early release days are prohibited. Staff
- 45 development training may not be held during a regular school day;
- 46 however, staff development training may be offered after the

- 48 training must be relevant to the teaching experience and

(2) Alternative school programs in school districts or 66 schools having an accreditation rating of "C," "D" or "F," as 67 defined by the State Board of Education, shall adhere to the 68 policies required under subsection (1) of this section. 69 attending an alternative school must attend school for no less 70 than eight (8) hours per day and must attend school on one (1) 71 Saturday during each month school is in session for no more than 72 three (3) hours per day. At alternative schools, the designated 73 Saturday must be known as "Attitude Adjustment Day." During one 74 (1) Saturday of each month, the school districts or schools shall 75 arrange for retired military, first responders, volunteer mentors, 76 ministers, parents and any other community volunteers to attend 77 school with the alternative school students and to share their 78 skills and knowledge with the students, encouraging them to become 79 better students and citizens. The skills and knowledge shared as 80 described in this subsection (2) may be shared with the students 81 in a singular group or in multiple smaller groups. The skills and 82 knowledge shared may be held off of the actual school campus. 83 addition, the school district may authorize students to 84 participate in community service programs on Saturdays to help 85 build character and concern for their own school, family, 86 neighborhood and community." 87

SECTION S.

A school district participating in the MPAC program shall conduct a basic needs assessment of any student in the district who demonstrates a behavioral episode or is referred to an alternative school setting. Based upon the results of the assessment, the district shall refer the student to the appropriate state or local agency, including, but not limited to: the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Human Services; the State Department of Health; the county department of health; the Division of Medicaid; the Department of Human Services; the county department of public welfare; the Department of Mental Health; and the local regional mental health center. Any agency receiving a referral under this subsection must initiate action in response to the referral no later than seventy-two (72) hours after receipt of the referral.
