## HOUSE BILL NO. 471

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-19-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FULL POLICE POWERS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OF THE MISSISSIPPI FORESTRY COMMISSION; TO REQUIRE SUCH OFFICERS TO
- 4 COMPLETE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING ACADEMY OR EQUIVALENT
- 5 TRAINING PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE COMMISSION TO MAINTAIN A COMPLETE
- 6 RECORD OF ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING OF EACH EMPLOYEE IN HIS OR
- 7 HER RECORD OF EMPLOYMENT; TO PRESCRIBE THE POWERS, DUTIES AND
- 8 REQUIRED RESPONSIBILITIES OF SUCH OFFICERS; AND FOR RELATED
- 9 PURPOSES.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 49-19-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 13 49-19-3. The duties and powers of the commission shall be:
- 14 (a) To appoint a State Forester, who shall serve at the
- 15 will and pleasure of the commission and who is qualified to
- 16 perform the duties as set forth herein; and to pay \* \* \* the State
- 17 Forester a salary as is provided by the Legislature, and
- 18 allow \* \* \* the State Forester such office expenses incidental to
- 19 the performance of his or her official duties as the commission,
- 20 in its discretion, may deem necessary; and to charge \* \* \* the
- 21 State Forester with the immediate direction and control, subject

- 22 to the supervision and approval of the commission, of all matters
- 23 relating to forestry as authorized herein. Any person appointed
- 24 by the commission as State Forester shall have received a
- 25 bachelor's degree in forestry from an accredited school or college
- 26 of forestry and shall be licensed and registered under the
- 27 provisions of the Mississippi Foresters Registration Law (Section
- 28 73-36-1 et seq.) and, in addition, shall have had at least five
- 29 (5) years' administrative experience in a forestry-related field.
- 30 (b) To take such action and provide and maintain such
- 31 organized means as may seem necessary and expedient to prevent,
- 32 control and extinguish forest fires, including the enforcement of
- 33 any and all laws pertaining to the protection of forests and
- 34 woodland.
- 35 (c) To encourage forest and tree planting for the
- 36 production of a wood crop, for the protection of water supply, for
- 37 windbreak and shade, or for any other beneficial purposes
- 38 contributing to the general welfare, public hygiene and comfort of
- 39 the people.
- 40 (d) To cause to be made such technical investigations
- 41 and studies concerning forest conditions, the propagation, care
- 42 and protection of forest and shade trees, the care and management
- 43 of forests, their growth, yield and the products and by-products
- 44 thereof, and any other competent subject, including forest
- 45 taxation, bearing on the timber supply and needs of the state,
- 46 which the commission, in its discretion, may deem proper.

- 47 (e) To assist and cooperate with any federal or state
  48 department or institution, county, town, corporation or
  49 individual, under such terms as in the judgment of the commission
  50 will best serve the public interest, in the preparation and
  51 execution of plans for the protection, management, replacement, or
  52 extension of the forest, woodland and roadside or other ornamental
  53 tree growth in the state.
- 54 To encourage public interest in forestry by means (f) 55 of correspondence, the public press, periodicals, the publication 56 of bulletins and leaflets for general distribution, the delivery 57 of lectures in the schools and other suitable means, and to cooperate to the fullest extent with the extension department 58 59 services of the state colleges in promoting reforestation. 60 shall be the duty of the State Forester to cooperate with private 61 timber owners in laying plans for the protection, management and 62 replacement of forests and in aiding them to form protection 63 associations. It shall be \* \* \* the State Forester's duty to examine all timbered lands belonging to the state and its 64 65 institutions and report to the commission upon their timber 66 conditions and actual value, and also whether some of these lands 67 may not be held as state forests. \* \* \* The State Forester shall be responsible for the protection and management of lands donated, 68 69 purchased or belonging to the state or state institutions, and all 70 other lands reserved by the state as state forests.

- 71 (g) To control the expenditure of any and all funds
  72 appropriated or otherwise made available for the several purposes
  73 set forth \* \* \* in this section under suitable regulations and
  74 restrictions by the commission and to specifically authorize any
  75 officer or employee of the commission to incur necessary and
  76 stipulated expenses in connection with the work in which \* \* \*
- (h) To submit annually to the Legislature a report of
  the expenditures, proceedings and results achieved, together
  with \* \* any other matters including recommendations concerning
  legislation as are germane to the aims and purposes of this
  chapter.
- 83 (i) To create, establish and organize the State of 84 Mississippi into forestry districts for the most effective and 85 efficient administration of the commission.
- 86 (i) To appoint, upon the State Forester's 87 recommendation, six (6) individuals who shall be designated Mississippi Forestry Commission Law Enforcement Officers \* \* \*, 88 89 who shall be constituted peace officers with full police power and 90 may exercise such powers within any locality within the state. 91 All officers must have attended and satisfactorily completed the 92 training course required for law enforcement officers at the Law 93 Enforcement Officer's Training Academy or an equivalent facility. 94 All officers must be current with this certification. A complete

that person may be engaged.

96	shall be maintained in each employee's record of employment.
97	Officers, when acting in the scope of performance of their
98	official duties as a duly sworn law enforcement officer as defined
99	in Section 45-6-3, shall have the authority to:
100	(i) Bear arms or other weapons * * *;
101	(ii) Investigate and * * * arrest, with or without
102	warrant, any person who violates the laws of the State of
103	Mississippi or any rule of the Mississippi Forestry Commission;
104	and
105	(iii) * * * Issue citations for any violation of
106	those laws for recklessly or with gross negligence causing fire to
107	burn the lands of another * * $\star$ , provided that the citation issued
108	by a Forestry Commission law enforcement officer shall $\underline{:}$
109	1. Be issued on a uniform citation form
110	consisting of an original and at least two (2) copies * * $*$ ;
111	2. Show, among other necessary information,
112	the name of the issuing officer, the name of the court in which
113	the cause is to be heard and the date and time the person charged
114	with a violation is to appear to answer the charge $\star$ $\star$ $\star$ ; and
115	3. * * * Provide the information on the
116	uniform citation form that will constitute a complaint charging
117	the offense for which the citation was issued and, when duly sworn
118	to and filed with a court of competent jurisdiction, prosecution

may proceed under that complaint.

120	For the purposes of this paragraph (j), the fact that any
121	person is found to have a brush or debris pile or other material
122	which is or was being burned and reasonable and prudent efforts
123	were not taken to prevent the spread of the fire onto the lands of
124	another shall be evidence that such person recklessly or with
125	gross negligence caused the land to burn.

- This paragraph shall stand repealed on June 30, \* \* \* 2019.
- 127 (k) To discharge such duties, responsibilities and
  128 powers necessary to accomplish and implement the Forestry
- 129 Inventory and Strategic Planning Act under Section 49-19-401 et 130 seq.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2017.
