COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 539

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-2-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE ALL PASSENGERS, WHETHER IN THE FRONT OR BACK SEATS, TO WEAR SEAT BELTS; TO AMEND SECTION 63-2-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 63-2-1. (1) When a passenger motor vehicle is operated in
- 10 forward motion on a public road, street or highway within this
- 11 state, every operator, every * * * passenger, regardless of the
- 12 seat that the passenger occupies, and every child under seven (7)
- 13 years of age who is not required to be protected by the use of a
- 14 child passenger restraint device or system or a belt positioning
- 15 booster seat system under the provisions of Sections 63-7-301
- 16 through 63-7-311, regardless of the seat that the child occupies,
- 17 shall wear a properly fastened safety seat belt system, required
- 18 to be installed in the vehicle when manufactured pursuant to
- 19 Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 208.

- 20 (2) "Passenger motor vehicle" for purposes of this chapter
- 21 means a motor vehicle designed to carry fifteen (15) or fewer
- 22 passengers, including the driver, but does not include motorcycles
- 23 that are not autocycles as defined in Section 63-3-103, mopeds,
- 24 all-terrain vehicles or trailers.
- 25 (3) This section shall not apply to:
- 26 (a) Vehicles which may be registered for "farm" use,
- 27 including "implements of husbandry" as defined in Section
- 63-21-5 (d), and "farm tractors" as defined in Section 63-3-105 (a);
- 29 (b) An operator or passenger possessing a written
- 30 verification from a licensed physician that he is unable to wear a
- 31 safety belt system for medical reasons;
- 32 (c) A passenger car operated by a rural letter carrier
- 33 of the United States Postal Service or by a utility meter reader
- 34 while on duty; or
- 35 (d) Buses.
- 36 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-2-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 37 amended as follows:
- 38 63-2-7. (1) A violation of this chapter shall be a
- 39 misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00)
- 40 upon conviction; however, only the operator of a vehicle may be
- 41 fined for a violation of this chapter by the operator, for a
- 42 violation of this chapter by a * * * passenger, regardless of the
- 43 seat that the passenger occupies, or for a violation of this
- 44 chapter by a child who is under seven (7) years of age and who is

- 45 not required to be protected by the use of a child passenger
- 46 restraint device or system or a belt positioning booster seat
- 47 system under the provisions of Sections 63-7-301 through 63-7-311,
- 48 regardless of the seat that the child occupies. The maximum fine
- 49 that may be imposed against the operator of a vehicle for a
- 50 violation of this chapter by the operator or for a violation of
- 51 this chapter by one or more passengers shall be Twenty-five
- 52 Dollars (\$25.00) in the aggregate.
- 53 (2) A violation of this chapter shall not be entered on the
- 54 driving record of any individual so convicted, nor shall any state
- assessment provided for by Section 99-19-73, or any other state
- 56 law, be imposed or collected.
- 57 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 58 and after July 1, 2017.
