HOUSE BILL NO. 1155

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ESTABLISH AND PRESCRIBE THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MISSISSIPPI 3 BOARD FOR EDUCATOR STANDARDS AND LICENSURE (BESL); TO EMPOWER THE 4 BESL TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS OF ALL EDUCATOR PREPARATION PROGRAMS 5 IN THE STATE AND ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR EDUCATOR LICENSURE AND 6 RENEWAL; TO TRANSFER THE AUTHORITY AND PROGRAMS OF THE COMMISSION 7 ON TEACHER AND ADMINISTRATOR EDUCATION, CERTIFICATION AND 8 LICENSURE AND DEVELOPMENT TO THE BESL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. Section 37-3-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 11 12 37-3-2. Establishment of the Mississippi Board for Educator Standards and Licensure (BESL). (1) \* \* \* There is established 13 14 within the executive branch of the State of Mississippi the Mississippi Board for Educator Standards and Licensure (herein 15 16 referred to as BESL). 17 (2) The purpose of the BESL shall be to evaluate the education profession at all levels of practice in order to improve 18 19 educational outcomes in all regions of the state that will yield 20 and sustain a high quality work force.

21	(3) The Mississippi Board for Educator Standards and		
22	Licensure (BESL) has the authority and responsibility to carry out		
23	the following duties:		
24	(a) Establish and maintain standards for the review and		
25	approval of all educator preparation programs (EPP), including,		
26	public, nonpublic, nontraditional, and out-of-state providers.		
27	(b) Establish and maintain standards for educator		
28	licensure and renewal. Standards for EPP and educator licensure		
29	shall reflect national standards and shall address, at a minimum,		
30	the following:		
31	(i) Performance of EPP graduates based on		
32	established measures as determined by the BESL;		
33	(ii) Classroom and pedagogical practices based on		
34	scientifically based research, including effective early literacy

49	indicated, withdraw approval of programs that do not meet
50	standards set by the BESL or whose graduates do not perform

52	(d) Establish and develop guidelines for a purposeful
53	internship experience for pre-service candidates through a
54	seamless and effective system between teacher preparation,
55	district partnerships and classroom mentors.
56	(e) The BESL shall ensure a uniform and efficient
57	process for issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, or refusing
58	to issue or renew educator licenses.
59	(f) Establish and maintain a consistent and transparent
60	data dashboard to include all aspects of educator preparation and
61	licensure; and produce The Annual Review of Mississippi Educator

64	positions of executive director and other senior staff that
65	support the BESL.
66	(h) Recruit, select, employ and evaluate the Executive

69	(i) Adopt reasonable fees for the issuance, reissuance
70	and renewal of licenses as established by administrative
71	regulation as a part of BESL's fee-based operating budget.
72	(4) The Board for Educator Standards and Licensure
73	membership shall be composed of nine (9) members to represent a
74	cross-section of educator perspectives and roles and reflect the
75	geographic regions of the state. Members shall be appointed
76	according to the following structure and shall serve for
77	three-year staggered terms. The membership shall include the
78	following: three (3) educators representing K-12 education
79	appointed by the Governor, one (1) of which shall be for an

95	each year. A member may serve up to two (2) consecutive terms.
96	(a) School-based personnel who serve on the BESL will
97	receive leave time without infringement on employment benefits and
98	necessary travel and expense reimbursement for all BESL-related

121 (5) To support an effective transition of this function, the 122 Mississippi Department of Education shall transfer all existing documents and data systems, historical and current, and minutes 123 124 from the former Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure to the new BESL. On July 1, 2017, all 125 126 duties, responsibilities, authority, power, assets, liabilities, 127 contractual rights and obligations and property rights, whether 128 accruing or vesting in the former commission before or after July 129 1, 2017, are vested in the new BESL. All employees of the former 130 commission holding positions with the State Department of 131 Education on July 1, 2017, shall be transferred to and become 132 employees of the BESL. The Executive Director of the BESL shall 133 be authorized to combine or abolish employee positions as 134 necessary to carry out the provisions of this act, and the 135 executive director is authorized to reorganize such offices, 136 services, programs or other activities so as to achieve economy 137 and efficiency and if the executive director finds such action to be in the public interest. Whenever the term "Commission on 138 139 Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure" 140 appears in the statutes or regulations of the State of 141 Mississippi, that term shall mean the "BESL." 142 \*
