- 7 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Joint Legislative PEER Committee shall

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 9 includes the following for each state agency that was affected by
- 10 the provisions of the federal Patient Protection and Affordable
- 11 Care Act of 2010 (PPACA):
- 12 (a) A listing of all rules and regulations changed as a
- 13 result of or in relation to the PPACA and a description of each
- 14 change;

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- 15 (b) A listing of all federal grants received to
- 16 implement the PPACA and its related rules and regulations, which
- 17 shall include:

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- 19 completion dates and its corresponding Catalog of Federal Domestic

- 21 (ii) Whether the grant will be renewed and under

- 25 will provide funding; and
- 26 (iv) Copies of any memoranda of understanding,
- 27 maintenance of effort agreements, agreement or contracts entered

- 30 (c) A fiscal impact analysis for any rule or regulation
- 31 change that has increased or is expected to increase, as
- 32 applicable, health insurance premiums, consumer or business costs,
- or taxes by more than one percent (1%); or otherwise has had or
- 34 will have a negative fiscal impact on the private sector in excess
- 35 of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) annually. This

- 67 prepare the report required by this section.

- 69 House and Senate Committees on Medicaid, Insurance, Public Health
- 70 and Human Services, Public Health and Welfare, Ways and Means and
- 71 Finance, and shall be posted prominently on the PEER Committee
- 72 website.
- 73 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 74 and after its passage.
