## HOUSE BILL NO. 1439

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN TO OBTAIN 3 CERTIFICATES OF EXEMPTION FROM VACCINATIONS FOR CONSCIENTIOUS BELIEFS IN ORDER FOR THE CHILD TO ATTEND SCHOOL; TO PROVIDE THAT 5 IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE EXEMPTION, THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN 6 MUST COMPLETE AN AFFIDAVIT ON AN EXEMPTION FORM PROVIDED BY THE 7 STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO PROVIDE THAT THE EXEMPTION FORM MUST CONTAIN A STATEMENT INDICATING THAT THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN 8 9 UNDERSTANDS THE BENEFITS AND RISKS OF VACCINATIONS AND THE 10 BENEFITS AND RISKS OF NOT BEING VACCINATED, AND MUST CONTAIN A 11 SECTION WHERE THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN CAN LIST THE SPECIFIC 12 VACCINATION OR VACCINATIONS FOR WHICH THE EXEMPTION APPLIES; TO 13 PROVIDE THAT THE EXEMPTION WILL BE VALID FOR ONE YEAR; AND FOR 14 RELATED PURPOSES. 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 16 17 amended as follows: 18 41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer 19 shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing 20 21 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary. Except as provided \* \* \* in this section, it shall be 22 23 unlawful for any child to attend any school, kindergarten or 24 similar type facility intended for the instruction of children

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25	(hereinafter called "schools"), either public or private, with the
26	exception of any legitimate home instruction $\operatorname{program}_{\underline{\prime}}$ as defined
27	in Section 37-13-91 * * * for ten (10) or * * * <u>fewer</u> children who
28	are related within the third degree computed according to the
29	civil law to the operator, unless they * * * have a certificate of
30	vaccination or have submitted to the school a certificate of
31	exemption from vaccination.
32	* * * (3) (a) A certificate of exemption from vaccination
33	for conscientious beliefs may be submitted to the school on behalf

35 (b) To claim an exemption from a required vaccination
36 for conscientious beliefs, the parent or a guardian of the child
37 must complete an affidavit on an exemption form provided by the
38 State Department of Health. The affidavit must be signed by the
39 parent or guardian and the affidavit must be notarized.

of a child by the child's parent or guardian.

- 40 (c) A blank exemption form for conscientious beliefs
  41 may be obtained by the parent or guardian by submitting a written
  42 request for the exemption form to the State Department of Health
  43 or the county health department or by downloading the exemption
  44 form from the website of the State Department of Health.
- (d) The exemption form for conscientious beliefs must

  contain a statement indicating that the parent or guardian

  understands the benefits and risks of vaccinations and the

  benefits and risks of not being vaccinated. In addition, it must

  contain a section where the parent or guardian can list the

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- 50 specific vaccination or vaccinations for which the exemption
- 51 applies. The completed and notarized exemption form shall expire
- 52 one (1) year from the date signed by the parent or guardian. The
- 53 parent or guardian must submit a new form every school calendar
- 54 year for which they are claiming an exemption from vaccination
- 55 requirements for conscientious beliefs.
- 56 (4) Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local
- 57 health officers or physicians on forms specified by the \*  $\star$  \*
- 58 State \* \* \* Department of Health. These forms shall be the only
- 59 acceptable means for showing compliance with \* \* \* the
- 60 immunization requirements of this section, and the responsible
- 61 school officials shall file the form with the child's record.
- 62 (5) If a child \* \* \*, who has not submitted a certificate of
- 63 exemption from vaccination, offers to enroll at a school without
- 64 having completed the required vaccinations, the local health
- officer may grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days
- 66 for \* \* \* that completion when, in the opinion of the health
- 67 officer, \* \* \* the delay will not cause undue risk to the child,
- 68 the school or the community. No child without a certificate of
- 69 exemption from vaccination shall be enrolled without having had at
- 70 least one (1) dose of each specified vaccine.
- 71 (6) Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall
- 72 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in
- 73 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health
- 74 officer, on forms provided by the \* \* \* State \* \* \* Department of

- 75 Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both,
- 76 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing
- 77 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination
- 78 by reason \* \* of a certificate of exemption.
- 79 (7) Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening
- 80 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge
- 81 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer
- 82 that all children enrolled who have not submitted a certificate of
- 83 exemption from vaccination are in compliance with the immunization
- 84 requirements of this section.
- 85 (8) For the purpose of assisting in supervising the
- 86 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or
- 87 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished
- 88 certificates of \* \* vaccination compliance by the school.
- 89 (9) It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge
- 90 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization and
- 91 exemption from vaccination. Any child who has not submitted a
- 92 certificate of exemption from vaccination who is not in compliance
- 93 at the end of ninety (90) days from the opening of the fall term
- 94 must be suspended until in compliance, unless the health
- 95 officer \* \* \* attributes the delay to lack of supply of vaccine or
- 96 some other such factor clearly making compliance impossible.
- 97 (10) Failure to enforce provisions of this \* \* \* section
- 98 shall constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punishable
- 99 by fine or imprisonment or both.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2017.
