HOUSE BILL NO. 1456

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO REVISE THE AUTHORITY FOR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SCHOOL-AGE 3 CHILDREN TO OBTAIN LETTERS OF EXEMPTION FROM VACCINATIONS OR 4 LIMITING THE NUMBER OF VACCINATIONS FOR MEDICAL REASONS IN ORDER 5 FOR THE CHILD TO ATTEND SCHOOL; TO PROVIDE THAT IN ORDER TO CLAIM 6 AN EXEMPTION FROM A REQUIRED VACCINATION FOR MEDICAL REASONS, THE 7 CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST PRESENT A LETTER FROM A PHYSICIAN 8 STATING THAT THE REQUIRED VACCINE IS MEDICALLY CONTRAINDICATED OR 9 POSES A SIGNIFICANT RISK TO OR WOULD BE INJURIOUS TO THE HEALTH 10 AND WELL-BEING OF THE CHILD OR ANY MEMBER OF THE CHILD'S 11 HOUSEHOLD; TO PROVIDE THAT EXEMPTIONS FROM VACCINATIONS FOR 12 MEDICAL REASONS WILL BE VALID THE DURATION OF THE CHILD'S 13 ATTENDANCE IN A SCHOOL DISTRICT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE OPINION OF THE PHYSICIAN WHO SIGNED THE LETTER IS FINAL AND THE SCHOOL TO 14 15 WHICH THE LETTER IS PRESENTED MUST ACCEPT THE LETTER; AND FOR 16 RELATED PURPOSES.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

18 SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

20 41-23-37. (1) Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer

21 shall specify such immunization practices as may be considered

22 best for the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing

23 shall be promulgated annually or more often, if necessary.

54 (c) If a letter of exemption from vaccination or letter 55 limiting the number of vaccinations meets the requirements of this 56 subsection, the opinion of the physician who signed the letter of 57 exemption is final and may be not contradicted or rejected by the 58 local health officer or the State Department of Health, and the 59 school to which the certificate is presented must accept the 60 letter of exemption.

61 Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local (4) health officers or physicians on forms specified by the 62 63 Mississippi State Board of Health. These forms shall be the only acceptable means for showing compliance with \* \* \* the 64 immunization requirements of this section, and the responsible 65 school officials shall file the form with the child's record. 66 67 If a child **\* \* \*** offers to enroll at a school without (5) 68 having completed the required vaccinations or submitting a letter 69 of exemption from vaccination or a letter limiting the number of 70 vaccinations, the local health officer may grant a period of time 71 up to ninety (90) days for \* \* \* that completion when, in the 72 opinion of the health officer, such delay will not cause undue risk to the child, the school or the community. No child without 73 74 a certificate of exemption from vaccination or letter limiting the 75 <u>number of vaccinations</u> shall be enrolled without having had at 76 least one (1) dose of each specified vaccine.

77 Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall (6) 78 term of school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in 79 charge of each school shall report to the county or local health 80 officer, on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of Health, the number of children enrolled by age or grade or both, 81 82 the number fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing 83 vaccination requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination by reason **\* \* \***  $\underline{o}f$  a letter of exemption. 84

85 <u>(7)</u> Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening 86 of the fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge 87 of each school shall certify to the local or county health officer 88 that all children enrolled are in compliance with <u>the</u> immunization 89 requirements <u>of this section or have submitted a letter of</u> 90 <u>exemption from vaccination or a letter limiting the number of</u> 91 vaccinations.

92 <u>(8)</u> For the purpose of assisting in supervising the 93 immunization status of the children the local health officer, or 94 his designee, may inspect the children's records or be furnished 95 certificates of **\* \* \*** <u>vaccination</u> compliance by the school.

96 <u>(9)</u> It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge 97 of each school to enforce the requirements for immunization <u>and</u> 98 <u>exemption from vaccination</u>. Any child not in compliance at the 99 end of ninety (90) days from the opening of the fall term must be

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100 suspended until in compliance, unless the health officer \* \* \*
101 attributes the delay to lack of supply of vaccine or some other
102 such factor clearly making compliance impossible.

103 <u>(10)</u> Failure to enforce provisions of this section shall 104 constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, be punishable by 105 fine or imprisonment or both.

106 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 107 and after July 1, 2017.
