## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 9

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE INCUMBENT URGENCY AND NECESSITY CONCERNING AN APPLICATION TO THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS FOR AN ARTICLE V CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF THE STATES FOR PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION WHICH IMPOSE FISCAL RESTRAINTS ON THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, LIMIT THE POWER AND JURISDICTION OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND LIMIT THE TERMS OF OFFICE FOR ITS OFFICIALS AND FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.
8	WHEREAS, the drafters of the Constitution of the United
9	States empowered state legislators to be the guardians of liberty
10	against future abuses of power by the federal government; and
11	WHEREAS, the federal government has created a crushing
12	national debt through improper and imprudent spending; and
13	WHEREAS, the federal government has invaded the legitimate
14	roles of the states through the manipulative process of federal
15	mandates, most of which are unfunded to a great extent; and
16	WHEREAS, the federal government has ceased to live under a
17	proper interpretation of the Constitution of the United States;
18	and
19	WHEREAS, it is imperative in nature as state elected
20	officials tasked with the responsibility of preserving the

- 21 integral rights of citizens and inherent power of the state
- 22 sovereignty affirmed under the 10th Amendment of the Constitution
- 23 of the United States, that the State of Mississippi expresses its
- 24 compelling interest in the need for a Constitutional Convention of
- 25 the states for the matter herein specified; and
- 26 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to protect the
- 27 liberty of our people, particularly for generations to come by
- 28 proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States
- 29 through a Convention of the States under Article V for the purpose
- 30 of restraining these and related abuses of power:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 32 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 33 THEREIN, That the Mississippi Legislature, acting on behalf of the
- 34 entire population of the State of Mississippi, hereby applies to
- 35 Congress, under the provisions of Article V of the Constitution of
- 36 the United States, for the calling of a convention of the states
- 37 limited to proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United
- 38 States that impose fiscal restraints on the federal government,
- 39 limit the power and jurisdiction of the federal government, and
- 40 limit the terms of office for its officials and for members of
- 41 Congress.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this application shall be deemed
- 43 an application for a convention to address each or all of the
- 44 subjects herein stated, for the purposes of determining whether
- 45 two-thirds (2/3) of the states have applied for a convention

- 46 addressing any of the subjects stated herein, this application is
- 47 to be aggregated with the applications of any other state
- 48 legislatures for the single subjects of balancing the federal
- 49 budget, limiting the power and jurisdiction of the federal
- 50 government or limiting the terms of federal officials.
- 51 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate is
- 52 hereby directed to transmit copies of this application to the
- 53 President and Secretary of the United States Senate and to the
- 54 Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of Representatives,
- 55 to transmit copies to the members of the United States Senate and
- 56 United States House of Representatives from this state, and to
- 57 transmit copies hereof to the presiding officers of each of the
- 58 legislative houses in the several states, requesting their
- 59 cooperation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this application constitutes a
- 61 continuing application in accordance with Article V of the
- 62 Constitution of the United States until the legislatures of at
- 63 least two-thirds of the several states have made applications on
- 64 the same subject.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mississippi delegates are
- 66 instructed not to support term limits for members of Congress.
