SENATE BILL NO. 2387

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-23-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
2	TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE STATE HEALTH OFFICER TO REQUIRE
3	ENTITIES PROVIDING VACCINES TO INCLUDE PATIENT VACCINE INFORMATION
4	STATEMENTS APPROVED BY FEDERAL CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND
5	PREVENTION TO BE SUPPLIED TO THE INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING THE
6	VACCINATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. Section 41-23-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 10 41-23-37. Whenever indicated, the State Health Officer shall
- 11 specify such immunization practices as may be considered best for
- 12 the control of vaccine preventable diseases. A listing shall be
- 13 promulgated annually or more often, if necessary.

- 14 Effective July 1, 2017, the State Health Officer shall
- 15 require entities providing vaccines to include patient vaccine
- 16 information statements as approved by the federal Centers for
- 17 Disease Control and Prevention to be supplied to the individual
- 18 receiving the vaccination.

amended as follows:

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- 19 Except as provided hereinafter, it shall be unlawful for any
- 20 child to attend any school, kindergarten or similar type facility

21	intended	for	the	instruction	of	children	(hereinafter	called

- 22 "schools"), either public or private, with the exception of any
- 23 legitimate home instruction program as defined in Section
- 24 37-13-91, Mississippi Code of 1972, for ten (10) or less children
- 25 who are related within the third degree computed according to the
- 26 civil law to the operator, unless they shall first have been
- 27 vaccinated against those diseases specified by the State Health
- 28 Officer.
- 29 A certificate of exemption from vaccination for medical
- 30 reasons may be offered on behalf of a child by a duly licensed
- 31 physician and may be accepted by the local health officer when, in
- 32 his opinion, such exemption will not cause undue risk to the
- 33 community.
- 34 Certificates of vaccination shall be issued by local health
- 35 officers or physicians on forms specified by the Mississippi State
- 36 Board of Health. These forms shall be the only acceptable means
- 37 for showing compliance with these immunization requirements, and
- 38 the responsible school officials shall file the form with the
- 39 child's record.
- 40 If a child shall offer to enroll at a school without having
- 41 completed the required vaccinations, the local health officer may
- 42 grant a period of time up to ninety (90) days for such completion
- 43 when, in the opinion of the health officer, such delay will not
- 44 cause undue risk to the child, the school or the community. No



- 45 child shall be enrolled without having had at least one (1) dose 46 of each specified vaccine.
- Within thirty (30) days after the opening of the fall term of 47 school (on or before October 1 of each year) the person in charge 48
- 49 of each school shall report to the county or local health officer,
- 50 on forms provided by the Mississippi State Board of Health, the
- number of children enrolled by age or grade or both, the number 51
- 52 fully vaccinated, the number in process of completing vaccination
- 53 requirements, and the number exempt from vaccination by reason for
- 54 such exemption.
- 55 Within one hundred twenty (120) days after the opening of the
- fall term (on or before December 31), the person in charge of each 56
- 57 school shall certify to the local or county health officer that
- all children enrolled are in compliance with immunization 58
- 59 requirements.
- 60 For the purpose of assisting in supervising the immunization
- 61 status of the children the local health officer, or his designee,
- may inspect the children's records or be furnished certificates of 62
- 63 immunization compliance by the school.
- 64 It shall be the responsibility of the person in charge of
- 65 each school to enforce the requirements for immunization.
- 66 child not in compliance at the end of ninety (90) days from the
- opening of the fall term must be suspended until in compliance, 67
- 68 unless the health officer shall attribute the delay to lack of

- 69 supply of vaccine or some other such factor clearly making
- 70 compliance impossible.
- 71 Failure to enforce provisions of this section shall
- 72 constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction be punishable by fine
- 73 or imprisonment or both.
- 74 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 2017.
