## SENATE BILL NO. 2724 (As Sent to Governor)

- AND ACT TO CREATE HARLIE'S LAW; TO AMEND SECTION 63-2-1,
  MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE ALL PASSENGERS OF A MOTOR
  VEHICLE TO WEAR SEAT BELTS EXCEPT THOSE REQUIRED TO USE A CHILD
  PASSENGER RESTRAINT SYSTEM; TO AMEND SECTION 63-2-7, MISSISSIPPI
  CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM THE PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO WEAR A
- 5 CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM THE PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO WEAR A
  6 PROPERLY FASTENED SEAT BELT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 63-2-1. (1) When a passenger motor vehicle is operated in
- 11 forward motion on a public road, street or highway within this
- 12 state, every operator \* \* \* and every passenger shall wear a
- 13 properly fastened safety seat belt system, required to be
- 14 installed in the vehicle when manufactured pursuant to Federal
- 15 Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 208.
- 16 (2) "Passenger motor vehicle" for purposes of this chapter
- 17 means a motor vehicle designed to carry fifteen (15) or fewer
- 18 passengers, including the driver, but does not include motorcycles
- 19 that are not autocycles as defined in Section 63-3-103, mopeds,
- 20 all-terrain vehicles or trailers.

- 21 (3) This section shall not apply to:
- 22 (a) Vehicles which may be registered for "farm" use,
- 23 including "implements of husbandry" as defined in Section
- 63-21-5 (d), and "farm tractors" as defined in Section 63-3-105 (a);
- 25 (b) An operator or passenger possessing a written
- 26 verification from a licensed physician that he is unable to wear a
- 27 safety belt system for medical reasons;
- 28 (c) A passenger car operated by a rural letter carrier
- 29 of the United States Postal Service or by a utility meter reader
- 30 while on duty; \* \*
- 31 (d) Buses \* \* \*; or
- 32 (e) A child who is required to be protected by the use
- 33 of a child passenger restraint device or system or a
- 34 belt-positioning booster seat system under the provisions of
- 35 Sections 63-7-301 through 63-7-311.
- 36 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-2-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 37 amended as follows:
- 38 63-2-7. (1) A violation of this chapter shall be a
- 39 misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00)
- 40 upon conviction; however, only the operator of a vehicle may be
- 41 fined for a violation of this chapter by the operator \* \* \* and
- 42 any passengers. The maximum fine that may be imposed against the
- 43 operator of a vehicle for a violation of this chapter by the
- 44 operator or for a violation of this chapter by one or more
- 45 passengers shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) in the aggregate.

46	(2) A violation of this chapter shall not be entered on the
47	driving record of any individual so convicted, nor shall any state
48	assessment provided for by Section 99-19-73, or any other state
49	law, be imposed or collected.

- 50 **SECTION 3.** This act shall be known as "Harlie's Law."
- 51 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 52 and after July 1, 2017.
