SENATE BILL NO. 2802

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE DRIVERS UNDER THE AGE OF 17 TO HAVE COMPLETED A DRIVER'S 3 EDUCATION COURSE IN ORDER TO HOLD AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license, intermediate license or 8 9 regular learner's permit shall be issued pursuant to this article: 10 To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years (a) 11 except as provided in this article. 12 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked 13 14 or suspended by this state or any other state or territory of the 15 United States or the District of Columbia, if the revocation or suspension period has not expired. 16 17 (c) To any person who is *** * *** habitually under the

18 <u>influence of alcohol or</u> narcotic drugs.

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19 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of 20 physical or mental disability to safely operate a motor vehicle on the highways *** * ***. However, persons who have one (1) arm or leg, 21 22 or have arms or legs deformed, and *** * *** who drive a car provided 23 with mechanical devices * * * that allow the person * * * to drive 24 in a safe manner over the highways, if otherwise qualified, shall receive an operator's license the same as other persons. 25 26 Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to obtaining a license.

(e) To any person as an operator who has previously
been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental
disability and who has not at time of application been restored to
mental competency.

(f) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen (18) years who does not at the time of application present a diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a general educational development certificate issued to the person in this state or any other state; or on whose behalf documentation has not been received by the Department of Public Safety from that person or a school official verifying that the person:

47 (g) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years48 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.

49 (2) * * * (a) A regular learner's permit may be issued to
50 any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise
51 meets the requirements of this article.

52 (b) An intermediate license may be issued to any person 53 who is at least sixteen (16) years of age who otherwise meets the 54 requirements of this article and who has held a regular learner's 55 permit for at least one (1) year without any conviction under 56 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation and who completes a 57 driver's education course and provides evidence of a passing grade 58 or certificate from the completed driver's education course if the 59 course is approved by the Department of Education or taught by a person qualified as a driving instructor by the Department of 60 61 Education. Any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving 62 violation shall restart the one-year requirement for the holding 63 of a regular learner's permit before an applicant can qualify for 64 an intermediate license.

(c) A driver's license may be issued to any person who
is at least sixteen and one-half (16-1/2) years of age who
otherwise meets the requirements of this article and who has held

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68 an intermediate license for at least six (6) months without any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. 69 Anv 70 conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall 71 restart the six-month requirement for the holding of an 72 intermediate license before an applicant can qualify for a 73 driver's license. However, a person who is at least seventeen 74 (17) years of age who has been issued a regular learner's permit and who has never been convicted under Section 63-11-30 or of a 75 76 moving violation shall not be required to have held an 77 intermediate license or to complete a driver's education course.

78 (d) An applicant for a Mississippi driver's license 79 who, at the time of application, is at least sixteen and one-half 80 (16-1/2) years of age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's license issued by another state for at least six (6) 81 months shall not be required to hold a regular learner's permit or 82 83 an intermediate license before being issued a driver's license. 84 The commissioner shall ensure that the regular learner's (3)

88 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 89 and after October 1, 2017.

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
