## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## Senate Bill No. 2514

## **BY: Committee**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Legislature finds that:
- 6 (a) Compassionate groups of individuals have selflessly
- 7 aided this state in serving our most vulnerable residents and our
- 8 most debilitated neighborhoods.
- 9 (b) Inspired by faith and civic commitment, these
- 10 organizations have accomplished much in changing the lives of
- 11 thousands and resurrecting neighborhoods torn by the strife of
- 12 crime and poverty.
- 13 (c) It is essential that this state cooperate with
- 14 these organizations in order to provide an opportunity to



- 15 participate on an equal basis, regardless of each organization's
- 16 orientation, whether faith-based or secular.
- 17 (2) It is therefore the intent of the Legislature to
- 18 recognize the contributions of these organizations and to
- 19 encourage opportunities for faith-based and community-based
- 20 organizations to work cooperatively with government entities in
- 21 order to deliver services more effectively. The Legislature
- 22 further intends that the purpose of the council is to advise the
- 23 Governor and the Legislature on policies, priorities, and
- 24 objectives to enlist, equip, enable, empower, and expand the work
- of faith-based, volunteer, and other community organizations to
- 26 the full extent permitted by law.
- 27 (3) There is established within the Office of the Governor
- 28 the Mississippi Advisory Council on Faith-Based Initiatives.
- 29 (4) (a) The council shall be composed of not more than
- 30 twenty-five (25) members. Council members may include, but need
- 31 not be limited to, representatives from various faiths,
- 32 faith-based organizations, community-based organizations,
- 33 foundations, corporations, and municipalities.
- 34 (b) The council shall be composed of the following
- 35 members:
- 36 (i) Seventeen (17) members appointed by and
- 37 serving at the pleasure of the Governor.
- 38 (ii) Four (4) members appointed by and serving at
- 39 the pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor.



- 40 (iii) Four (4) members appointed by and serving at
- 41 the pleasure of the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 42 (c) Members of the council shall serve for terms of two
- 43 (2) years, and may continue to serve after the expiration of their
- 44 terms until a successor is appointed. Members shall be eligible
- 45 for reappointment and serve at the pleasure of the appointing
- 46 authority during their terms.
- 47 (d) The Governor shall designate a member of the
- 48 council to serve as chair for a term of two (2) years at the
- 49 pleasure of the Governor. The chair may continue to serve after
- 50 the expiration of the chair's term and shall be eligible for
- 51 redesignation by the Governor.
- 52 (e) (i) The heads of executive departments and
- 53 agencies shall, to the extent permitted by law, provide the
- 54 council with information it needs for purposes of carrying out its
- 55 mission.
- 56 (ii) The council may request and collect
- 57 information, hold hearings, establish task forces consisting of
- 58 members of the council or other individuals, as necessary to carry
- 59 out its mission.
- 60 (iii) The council may conduct analyses and develop
- 61 reports or other materials as necessary to perform its mission.
- 62 (iv) Members of the council shall serve without
- 63 compensation.



- 64 (f) The principal functions of the council are, to the 65 extent permitted by law:
- 66 (i) To develop and coordinate activities of
- 67 faith-based and community-based programs and initiatives, enhance
- 68 such efforts in communities, and seek such resources, legislation,
- 69 and regulatory relief as may be necessary to accomplish these
- 70 objectives;
- 71 (ii) To ensure that state policy decisions take
- 72 into account the capacity of faith-based and other community-based
- 73 initiatives to assist in the achievement of state priorities;
- 74 (iii) To identify and promote best practices and
- 75 successful modes of delivering social services through faith-based
- 76 and other community-based organizations;
- 77 (iv) To recommend changes in policies, programs,
- 78 and practices that affect the delivery of services by such
- 79 organizations and the needs of low-income and other underserved
- 80 persons in Mississippi communities;
- 81 (v) To coordinate public awareness of faith-based
- 82 and community nonprofit initiatives, such as demonstration pilot
- 83 programs or projects, public-private partnerships, volunteerism,
- 84 and special projects;
- 85 (vi) To encourage private charitable giving to
- 86 support faith-based and community-based initiatives;
- 87 (vii) To bring concerns, ideas, and policy options
- 88 to the Governor and Legislature for assisting, strengthening, and



- 89 replicating successful faith-based and other community-based
- 90 programs;
- 91 (viii) To develop and implement strategic
- 92 initiatives to strengthen the institutions of families and
- 93 communities in this state;
- 94 (ix) To showcase and herald innovative grassroots
- 95 nonprofit organizations and civic initiatives;
- 96 (x) To eliminate unnecessary legislative,
- 97 regulatory, and other bureaucratic barriers that impede effective
- 98 faith-based and other community-based efforts to address social
- 99 problems;
- 100 (xi) To monitor implementation of state policy
- 101 affecting faith-based and other community-based organizations;
- 102 (xii) To ensure that the efforts of faith-based
- 103 and other community-based organizations meet objective criteria
- 104 for performance and accountability.
- 105 (q) The council may not make any recommendation that
- 106 conflicts with the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment to
- 107 the United States Constitution or Section 18 of the Mississippi
- 108 Constitution.
- 109 (h) By December 1 of each year, the council shall
- 110 prepare a written report for the Governor, the Lieutenant
- 111 Governor, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 112 containing a summary of activities and recommendations of the
- 113 council.



- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 115 and after its passage.
