- 6 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Film Office was established in 1973,
- 7 the second film commission in the world. Since that time,
- 8 hundreds of films, television projects, documentaries and
- 9 commercials have filmed in every corner and county of the state
- 10 and Mississippi has built a solid foundation in the film industry
- 11 by focusing on its greatest attributes: people, place and an
- 12 unparalleled storytelling heritage; and
- 13 WHEREAS, for 30 years Ward Emling has served as Director of
- 14 the Mississippi Film Office (1980-1983, 1990-2017). He is the
- 15 longest-serving Film Commissioner ever, anywhere in the world, and
- 16 is one of the longest-serving industrial developers in Mississippi
- 17 history; and
- WHEREAS, Ward Emling was born in New Orleans and raised in 18
- 19 Jackson, Mississippi. He was educated in the Jackson Public

- 20 Schools and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in English from
- 21 Millsaps College. He then studied two years at the Guildhall
- 22 School of Music and Drama in London, England; and
- 23 WHEREAS, during Ward Emling's 30 years, film production
- 24 touched every county in Mississippi, creating opportunities for
- 25 tens of thousands of Mississippians and lifelong careers in the
- 26 film industry for hundreds. During those years, over 320 films
- 27 and documentaries, and countless commercials were produced in
- 28 Mississippi. The total production budgets for the film and
- 29 television projects were almost \$500 Million, with a financial
- 30 impact of well over \$1 Billion, and incalculable PR and community
- 31 development. Between 2012 and 2016, Mississippians working on
- 32 Mississippi films rose from just over \$600,000.00 to \$6.6 Million;
- 33 and
- 34 WHEREAS, Ward has guided in-state film productions, including
- 35 "Huck Finn," "A Time To Kill," "The Chamber," "Ghosts of
- 36 Mississippi, " "My Dog Skip, " "Cookie's Fortune, " "O Brother, Where
- 37 Apart Thou?, " "The Ponder Heart, " "Big Bad Love, " "Ballast, " "The
- 38 Help, ""Get On Up, " and "Dixieland, " in addition to many short
- 39 films, documentaries and commercials; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Ward is a two-term past President of the Association
- 41 of Film Commissioners International (AFCI), the 300-member
- 42 organization of film commissions from around the world, and the
- 43 recipient of the 2008 Arthur Lowe Crystal Vision Award for
- 44 Outstanding Service to the AFCI and recipient of the 2008 Arthur

- 45 Lowe Crystal Vision Award for Outstanding Service to the AFCI. He
- 46 has represented Mississippi film and culture around the world, on
- 47 four continents (North America, Asia, Australia and Europe); and
- WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize a
- 49 Mississippian who is a respected member of his profession and has
- 50 maintained a competitive business environment for filmmaking in
- 51 Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 53 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 54 we do hereby pay tribute to the career and contributions of Ward
- 55 Emling, the longest-serving National and International Film
- 56 Commissioner, upon the occasion of his retirement after 30 years
- 57 as Director of the Mississippi Film Office, and extend our best
- 58 wishes to Ward for future successes.
- 59 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 60 Ward Emling, forwarded to the Executive Director of the
- 61 Mississippi Development Authority and the Governor, and made
- 62 available to the Capitol Press Corps.
