1 2 3 4	A RESOLUTION PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE CAREER AND CONTRIBUTIONS OF WARD EMLING, THE LONGEST-SERVING NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL FILM COMMISSIONER, UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AFTER 30 YEARS AS DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI FILM OFFICE.
5	WHEREAS, the Mississippi Film Office was established in 1973,
6	the second film commission in the world. Since that time,
7	hundreds of films, television projects, documentaries and
8	commercials have filmed in every corner and county of the state
9	and Mississippi has built a solid foundation in the film industry
10	by focusing on its greatest attributes: people, place and an
11	unparalleled storytelling heritage; and
12	WHEREAS, for 30 years Ward Emling has served as Director of
13	the Mississippi Film Office (1980-1983, 1990-2017). He is the
14	longest-serving Film Commissioner ever, anywhere in the world, and
15	is one of the longest-serving industrial developers in Mississippi
16	history; and
17	WHEREAS, Ward Emling was born in New Orleans and raised in
18	Jackson, Mississippi. He was educated in the Jackson Public

Schools and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in English from

- 20 Millsaps College. He then studied two years at the Guildhall
- 21 School of Music & Drama in London, England; and
- 22 WHEREAS, during Ward Emling's 30 years, film production
- 23 touched every county in Mississippi, creating opportunities for
- 24 tens of thousands of Mississippians and lifelong careers in the
- 25 film industry for hundreds. During those years, over 320 films
- 26 and documentaries, and countless commercials were produced in
- 27 Mississippi. The total production budgets for the film and
- 28 television projects were almost \$500 Million, with a financial
- 29 impact of well over \$1 Billion, and incalculable PR and community
- 30 development. Between 2012 and 2016, Mississippians working on
- 31 Mississippi films rose from just over \$600,000.00 to \$6.6 Million;
- 32 and
- 33 WHEREAS, Ward has guided in-state film productions, including
- 34 "Huck Finn," "A Time To Kill," "The Chamber," "Ghosts of
- 35 Mississippi, " "My Dog Skip, " "Cookie's Fortune, " "O Brother, Where
- 36 Apart Thou?, " "The Ponder Heart, " "Big Bad Love, " "Ballast, " "The
- 37 Help, ""Get On Up, " and "Dixieland," in addition to many short
- 38 films, documentaries and commercials; and
- 39 WHEREAS, Ward is a two-term past President of the Association
- 40 of Film Commissioners International (AFCI), the 300-member
- 41 organization of film commissions from around the world, and the
- 42 recipient of the 2008 Arthur Lowe Crystal Vision Award for
- 43 Outstanding Service to the AFCI. He has represented Mississippi

- 44 film and culture around the world, on four continents (North
- 45 America, Asia, Australia and Europe); and
- WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize a
- 47 Mississippian who is a respected member of his profession and has
- 48 maintained a competitive business environment for filmmaking in
- 49 Mississippi:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 51 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby pay tribute to the career and
- 52 contributions of Ward Emling, the longest-serving National and
- 53 International Film Commissioner, upon the occasion of his
- 54 retirement after 30 years as Director of the Mississippi Film
- 55 Office, and extend our best wishes to Ward for future successes.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 57 Ward Emling, forwarded to the Executive Director of the
- 58 Mississippi Development Authority and the Governor, and made
- 59 available to the Capitol Press Corps.
