## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 2

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE PROFOUND SORROW ON THE LOSS OF

2 LINCOLN COUNTY DEPUTY SHERIFF WILLIAM DURR WHILE ON OFFICIAL DUTY AND EXTENDING OUR DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS BEREAVED FAMILY. 3 4 WHEREAS, Lincoln County Deputy Sheriff William Durr passed away on May 28, 2017, while serving and protecting the people of 5 Lincoln County, Mississippi, a job he loved, an event which has 6 7 saddened the State of Mississippi and the entire nation; and WHEREAS, Deputy Durr, 36, had served with the Lincoln County 8 9 Sheriff's Department for two years. He previously had been with the Brookhaven Police Department for four years; and 10 11 WHEREAS, he was born June 19, 1980, to Donald Jeffrey Durr and Debbie Cox Durr. Durr was a graduate of Mississippi College 12 13 with a bachelor's degree. He was part of the Brookhaven Masonic 14 Lodge and was a member of Moak's Creek Baptist Church. William 15 had a passion for children and youth ministries and would use his 16 talents as a ventriloquist to minister to them. He recently completed training in the Drug Abuse Resistance Education 17

- 18 (D.A.R.E.) Program. His other hobbies he loved were woodworking
- 19 and playing guitar; and
- 20 WHEREAS, the family of fallen Lincoln County Deputy William
- 21 Durr released this statement: William Durr was a wonderful
- 22 husband, father, son, brother, son-in-law and uncle to our family.
- 23 He was a terrific friend to many. He served his LORD with his
- 24 entire being. His love for others was portrayed in his service in
- 25 law enforcement. William enjoyed life because he truly wanted to
- 26 be a blessing to others. William had a love for young people. He
- 27 served various churches in numerous positions. His work with
- 28 preschoolers, children, youth and college students rendered
- 29 dividends many will not fathom. Only God Himself knows the true
- 30 extent of William's kingdom work. His service to God was not
- 31 reserved for Sundays alone. Time and again, William would share
- 32 God's love to those he encountered while serving as a deputy
- 33 sheriff or police officer. He would take the time and pray for
- 34 those in need of God's love and peace. His love for others knew
- 35 no boundaries. William will be missed by all who knew him. His
- 36 legacy of love and service will live long after his body is no
- 37 longer here; and
- 38 WHEREAS, survivors are his wife, Tressie C. Hall; son, Nash
- 39 Durr; mother Debbie Durr; sister, Megan Durr; a special friend he
- 40 loved like a brother, Timothy Kees; father and mother-in-law,
- 41 Johnny Ray and Brenda Hall; brothers-in-law, Stuart Hall and wife
- 42 Sarabeth, Wade Price and Adam Cook; and a sister-in-law, Briana

- 43 Hall Price; and nieces: Ashlyn Hall, Raylee Price and Amelia

- WHEREAS, Governor Phil Bryant ordered flags at public
- 46 buildings to be flown at half-staff in William Durr's honor. We
- 47 can never repay our debt to fallen law enforcement officers and
- 48 their families, but we must do what we can, with all that we have,
- 49 to live our lives in a way that pays tribute to their memory. We
- 50 should not pause and remember to thank law enforcement officers
- 51 only in the wake of tragedy, we should do it everyday:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 53 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby express profound sorrow on the loss
- of Lincoln County Deputy Sheriff William Durr while on official
- 55 duty and extend our deepest sympathy to his bereaved family.

- 57 the surviving family of Deputy William Durr, forwarded to the
- 58 Sheriff of Lincoln County and the Governor, and made available to
- 59 the Capitol Press Corps.
