HOUSE BILL NO. 32

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-29-305, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT FOR FISCAL YEARS 2019, 2020 AND 2021, THE AMOUNT 3 APPROPRIATED BY THE LEGISLATURE TO THE COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR 4 COLLEGES FOR MID-LEVEL FUNDING SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN FORTY-THREE 5 MILLION DOLLARS PER YEAR; AN ACT TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL 6 COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES AND 7 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING IN FISCAL YEARS 2019 AND 2020 IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO FIVE PERCENT EACH YEAR; TO DIRECT THE 8 9 APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS NECESSARY TO FULLY FUND THE SALARY 10 INCREASES EACH YEAR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11

12 SECTION 1. Section 37-29-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

13 amended as follows:

37-29-305. (1) In funding community and junior colleges, 14 15 the actual amount of the annual appropriation of the community and junior colleges general support bill shall be computed as follows: 16

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(a) Calculate the state funding per student for Grades K-12 by dividing the total revenue from state funds by the ADA. 18 Both the funding and ADA figures shall be provided by the State 19 20 Department of Education.

21 Calculate the state funding per FTE for regional (b) 22 universities by dividing the state funds for E & G operations by

23 FTE enrollment. Both funding and enrollment figures shall come 24 from the SREB State Data Exchange.

25 Mid-level funding for community and junior colleges (C) 26 shall be the average as computed from paragraphs (a) and (b) of 27 this subsection multiplied by the total community and junior 28 college FTEs. This amount shall be appropriated annually by the Legislature to the community and junior colleges. 29 For fiscal years 2019, 2020 and 2021, the amount appropriated by the 30 31 Legislature to the community and junior colleges for mid-level 32 funding shall not be less than Forty-three Million Dollars 33 (\$43,000,000.00) per year.

34 (2) Data used in the calculation of paragraphs (a), (b) and
35 (c) of subsection (1) shall be the most current available data
36 utilizing the same fiscal year for all entities involved.
37 Information from the SREB State Data Exchange shall be used to
38 ensure common denominators in the calculation of FTE enrollment
39 and to ensure consistent reporting of financial data.

For the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 40 SECTION 2. (1) 41 2018, and the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2019, the annual 42 compensation of each employee of the community and junior colleges 43 and of each employee of the state institutions of higher learning 44 shall be increased by an amount equal to five percent (5%) of that employee's salary in effect on the day immediately preceding the 45 first day of the fiscal year in which the increase is to take 46 effect. 47

No. 32 18/HR43/R724 PAGE 2 (DJ\EW) 48 (2)If the increase in compensation provided for in this 49 section would cause the salary of any employee of a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning to be in 50 excess of the compensation of the president of the community or 51 52 junior college or the state institution of higher learning at 53 which that employee is employed, then the employee's compensation 54 may be increased only to the extent that the employee's salary 55 will be equal in amount to the compensation of the president of 56 the community or junior college or state institution of higher 57 learning.

58 SECTION 3. If any employee of a community or junior college 59 or state institution of higher learning is unable to receive the 60 full amount of the salary increase provided for in Section 1 of this act because to award the entire allowable increase would 61 62 cause that employee's base salary to exceed the end step of an 63 applicable job classification, the end step of that particular job 64 classification shall be increased. The increase shall be in an amount necessary to enable all employees in that particular job 65 66 classification to be eligible to receive the full salary increase 67 to which they are entitled under this act.

68 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The Legislature shall appropriate the funds 69 necessary for fiscal years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 to provide full 70 funding each fiscal year for the increases in compensation 71 provided for in this act.
