HOUSE BILL NO. 116

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 39-3-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ANY MUNICIPAL OR COUNTY 3 PUBLIC LIBRARY THAT IS LOCATED IN A RURAL COUNTY MAY REVISE THE 4 EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE PRESCRIBED BY THE LIBRARY 5 COMMISSION WHEN HIRING A LIBRARY SYSTEM DIRECTOR IN A COUNTY; TO 6 PROVIDE A CERTAIN DEFINITION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 SECTION 1. Section 39-3-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 9 10 39-3-17. (1) The trustees of the administrative board designated pursuant to Section 39-3-13(4), immediately after their 11 appointment or election, shall meet and organize by the election 12 13 of such officers as they deem necessary. They shall (a) adopt such bylaws, rules and regulations for their own guidance and for 14 15 the government of the library as they deem expedient; (b) meet at least once in each quarter; (c) have the supervision, care and 16 custody of all property of the library, including the rooms or 17 18 buildings constructed, leased or set apart therefor; (d) employ a library system director, prescribe his/her duties, fix his/her 19 20 compensation, and remove him/her for cause; (e) employ, upon the

- 21 recommendation of the library system director, such other staff as
- 22 may be necessary and fix their compensation; (f) submit annually
- 23 to the governing body a budget containing estimates for the
- 24 ensuing year; (g) have exclusive control of the finances of the
- 25 library system; (h) accept such gifts of money or property for
- 26 library purposes as they deem expedient; (i) on recommendation of
- 27 the library system director, purchase books, periodicals, maps,
- 28 equipment, insurance and supplies for the library system; (j)
- 29 dispose of equipment and discarded library materials as provided
- 30 in Section 19-7-5 * * *; and (k) do all other acts necessary for
- 31 the orderly and efficient management and control of the library
- 32 system. But no expenditure made or contracted by the trustees
- 33 shall be binding on any county or municipality so as to require
- 34 any payment in excess of funds made available for library purposes
- 35 under this article.
- 36 (2) (a) There shall be one (1) library director for each
- 37 library system. * * * The library system director shall have such
- 38 educational qualifications as are prescribed by the Mississippi
- 39 Library Commission. The library system director shall administer
- 40 and establish procedures according to policies established by the
- 41 administrative board of trustees. His or her duties shall
- 42 include: (* * *i) employment of staff with the approval of the
- 43 board of trustees; (* * *ii) prescription of staff duties;
- 44 (* * *iii) removal of staff for cause; (* * *iv) preparation of
- 45 the budget; (* * *v) financial and statistical management;

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- 47 acts necessary for the orderly and efficient administration of the
- 48 library system.
- 49 (b) In lieu of the educational requirements prescribed
- 50 by the Library Commission for hiring a library system director,
- 51 the board of trustees in any rural county may satisfy the
- 52 educational requirements for such director by equivalent
- 53 experience and a bachelor's degree in library science. As used in
- 54 this paragraph, "rural county" means the following:
- (i) A county that has a population of less than
- 56 fifty thousand (50,000) individuals;
- 57 (ii) An area that has less than five hundred (500)
- 58 individuals per square mile; or
- 59 (iii) A municipality of less than fifteen thousand
- 60 (15,000) individuals.
- 61 (3) In the event that a determination is made by the library
- 62 system director to remove a staff member for cause, written notice
- 63 of such decision shall be given to such staff member. A staff
- 64 member who has received such notice shall be entitled to:
- 65 (a) Written notice of the reasons for such action,
- 66 together with a summary of the factual basis therefor, which
- 67 notice shall be given at least five (5) days prior to any hearing;
- (b) An opportunity for a hearing before the board of
- 69 trustees at which to present matters relevant to the reasons given

- 70 for the decision, including any reasons alleged by the employee to
- 71 be the reason for such action;
- 72 (c) Receive a fair and impartial hearing before the
- 73 board;
- 74 (d) Be represented by legal counsel, at his own
- 75 expense.
- 76 If the staff member does not request a hearing, the decision
- 77 of the director shall be final.
- 78 (4) On at least a bi-monthly basis, the board of supervisors
- 79 of each county and the governing authority of each municipality
- 80 supporting a public library system shall transmit its warrant or
- 81 warrants constituting one-sixth (1/6) of the annual appropriation
- 82 for the support and maintenance thereof to the library director of
- 83 such system. All such warrants shall be deposited in one or more
- 84 public depositories previously selected by the board of trustees
- 85 of the library system. * * * Such board of trustees shall, by
- 86 appropriate order spread upon its minutes, authorize the library
- 87 director to expend such funds for lawful purposes only and in
- 88 accordance with its annual budget previously adopted. All such
- 89 funds shall be placed in the depository or depositories selected
- 90 by the administrative library board of trustees in the same manner
- 91 as provided in Section 27-105-305 for the selection of county
- 92 depositories, provided that the selection shall be effective on
- 93 July 1 of each year. Such depository shall place on deposit with

- 94 the library director the same securities as required in Section
- 95 27-105-315.
- 96 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 97 and after July 1, 2018.
