HOUSE BILL NO. 144

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI SKILL STANDARDS BOARD AS AN 2 ADVISORY BOARD TO THE GOVERNOR, THE LEGISLATURE AND THE STATE 3 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STATEWIDE 4 SYSTEM OF INDUSTRY-DEFINED, INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED SKILL STANDARDS 5 AND CREDENTIALS FOR CERTAIN SKILLED OCCUPATIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR 6 THE COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD; TO PROVIDE THE DUTIES OF THE BOARD; 7 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Mississippi Skill Standards Board is 10 created as an advisory board to the Governor, the Legislature and 11 the state workforce development system for the development of a 12 statewide system of industry-defined, industry-recognized skill standards and credentials for all major skilled occupations that: 13 14 (a) Provide strong employment and earnings 15 opportunities in the state; 16 (b) Are nationally recognized; and 17 Require less than a baccalaureate degree. (C) 18 (2) The Mississippi Skill Standards Board, hereinafter referred to as the "board," is composed of thirteen (13) members 19 appointed by the Governor. The term of each board member shall 20

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21 run concurrently with the term of the Governor. The board 22 consists of the following members:

(a) Eight (8) members representing business, two (2) of
whom must be from business entities that employ fewer than fifty
(50) employees and one (1) each from the four-sector clusters as
defined by Innovate Mississippi;

(b) Two (2) members representing workers;
(c) One (1) member representing secondary education;
(d) One (1) member representing two-year public
postsecondary education; and

31 (e) One (1) member representing four-year public32 postsecondary education.

33 (3) The Governor shall appoint the presiding officer of the34 board from the members representing business.

35 (4) The board shall:

36 (a) Validate nationally established skill standards to
37 guide curriculum development, training, assessment and
38 certification of workforce skills;

39 (b) Convene industry groups to develop skill standards 40 and certification procedures for industries and occupations in 41 which standards have not been established or adopted and recognize 42 the skill standards and certification procedures;

43 (c) Review standards developed by other states and
44 nations and enter into agreements for mutual recognition of
45 credentials to enhance portability of skills;

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(d) Promote, in collaboration with the secondary and
postsecondary entities, the use of standards and credentials among
employers; and

49 (e) Develop a memorandum of understanding by and
50 between the workforce and education entities for the effective
51 development, implementation, operations and outcomes of the skills
52 standards effort.

(5) The board shall meet at the call of the presiding
officer as often as necessary to accomplish its work, and the
board shall meet a minimum of once each quarter in a fiscal year.
(6) A member of the board is not entitled to compensation
for service on the board but is entitled to reimbursement for
reasonable mileage and expenses incurred in performing board
duties as provided in Section 25-3-41.

60 (7) The Mississippi Community College Board shall provide61 staff support for the board as necessary.

62 (8) The board shall report periodically to the Governor and
63 shall provide annual reports to the Governor, the Legislature and
64 the Mississippi Community College Board.

65 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 66 and after July 1, 2018.
