HOUSE BILL NO. 146

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE HEALTH OFFICER TO DEVELOP A 2 PROGRAM TO CLOSE THE GAP IN THE HEALTH STATUS OF ALL GENDER AND 3 RACIAL GROUPS; TO REQUIRE A STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT; TO ESTABLISH 4 MEASURABLE OUTCOMES; TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE; TO PROVIDE 5 FOR THE SELECTION OF CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS TO DEVELOP CRITERIA AND 6 PROCEDURES TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS ACT; TO COORDINATE 7 WITH OTHER PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES; TO REQUIRE EVALUATIONS AND 8 REPORTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. (1) It is the goal of the State of Mississippi 11 to decrease the disparities in all gender and racial groups in 12 many diseases and preventable conditions by 2022. In order to achieve this and other measurable outcomes, the State Health 13 14 Officer shall establish a program to close the gap in the health status of all gender and racial groups in the following priority 15 16 areas: infant mortality, breast and cervical cancer screening, HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases, adult and child 17 immunizations, cardiovascular disease, diabetes, accidental 18 19 injuries and violence. 20 The State Health Officer, in partnership with (2)

26 (3)The State Health Officer shall review current data to 27 support a statewide assessment of the risk behaviors associated with the health disparity priority areas identified in subsection 28 29 (1) of this section. The statewide assessment shall consist of 30 focus groups, needs assessment surveys and key informant 31 interviews. The statewide assessment must be used to establish a 32 baseline to measure the effect of activities that may be funded in future legislation. To the extent feasible, the assessment shall 33 34 be conducted so that the results may be compared to national data.

(4) The State Health Officer, in consultation with
community-based organizations and partners, shall establish
measurable outcomes to achieve the goal specified in subsection
(1) of this section.

The State Health Officer shall subcontract with an 39 (5)40 entity specializing in health disparities, which has at least four 41 (4) years experience and is located in the State of Mississippi, 42 to provide the necessary expertise to ensure that the planning 43 process is successful in reducing the health disparities identified in subsection (1) of this section. The State Health 44 45 Officer shall provide Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) in funding to the subcontracting entity to conduct 46

47 the needs assessment, develop outcomes, and manage the planning 48 process, coordination and evaluation.

The State Health Officer shall identify community-based 49 (6) 50 organizations and partners in all gender and racial groups, 51 develop the criteria and procedures to select these organizations 52 as planning partners and engage them in the process to plan to 53 eliminate health disparities. At the time the community-based 54 organizations and partners are selected, the State Health Officer 55 shall inform these organizations of the intent and purpose of the 56 outcomes to be jointly established according to subsection (4) of 57 this section. The plan shall include sections on morbidity and mortality for health disparities listed in subsection (1) of this 58 59 section, a review and report of the statewide needs assessment process, measurable outcomes and a complete description of a 60 61 community grant program for health disparities. The community 62 grant program shall describe, but not be limited to, the funding 63 purpose, eligibility criteria and program requirements and 64 activities.

65 (7) The State Health Officer shall coordinate the closing 66 the gap program with other projects and initiatives funded from 67 state and federal funds in order to avoid duplication and promote 68 complementary efforts.

69 (8) The State Health Officer shall conduct a biennial70 evaluation of the closing the gap program.

(9) The State Health Officer shall submit a biennial report to the Legislature on the closing the gap program. The report shall include information on activities that were conducted using grant funds, evaluation data, and outcome measures, if available. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2018.
