HOUSE BILL NO. 151

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-5-93, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ANY COUNTY TO MAKE A CERTAIN ANNUAL DONATION TO THE FANNIE LOU HAMER CANCER FOUNDATION TO SUPPORT THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF AN EDUCATION CENTER

5 PERTAINING TO THE PREVENTION OF CANCER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 19-5-93, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 19-5-93. The board of supervisors of each county is
- 10 authorized, in its discretion, to donate money for the objects and
- 11 purposes following, to wit:
- 12 (a) Confederate graves. For the location, marking,
- 13 care and maintenance of the grave or graves and graveyard of
- 14 Confederate soldiers or sailors who died in the Confederate
- 15 service, and the purchase, if necessary, of the land on which any
- 16 of the said graveyards may be situated, and the erection and
- 17 maintenance of appropriate monuments and appropriate inscriptions
- 18 thereon. In the exercise of this power the board is fully
- 19 authorized to accept donations of land on which any of said

- 21 any of the purposes in this section expressed.
- 22 Any board of supervisors may, in its discretion, contribute
- 23 money to be used for the upkeep of graves of the Confederate dead
- 24 in its county.
- 25 (b) Care of the aged. For the support and maintenance
- of such residents of the county who are worthy, indigent aged 26
- 27 inmates of the Old Ladies' Home of Jackson, Mississippi, or of the
- 28 Golden Age Nursing Home and Hospital for North Mississippi of
- 29 Greenwood, Mississippi, and not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars
- 30 (\$500.00) per annum for the support of the county's inmates of the
- Old Men's Home, located near Jackson, Mississippi, and in addition 31
- 32 thereto a sum not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per
- 33 annum to each of said institutions for their support and
- 34 maintenance in the care of the aged.
- 35 (C) King's Daughters. To the King's Daughters in their
- respective counties for charities under their supervision. 36
- 37 (d) Travelers Aid Society. A sum of money not
- exceeding Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) per month for the support of 38
- 39 the organization known as the Travelers Aid Society, provided the
- 40 same is nonsectarian.
- 41 Hospitals for pellagra sufferers. For the
- 42 establishment and maintenance of a hospital for the treatment of
- persons afflicted with pellagra. For this purpose the board may 43

- issue bonds and incur such indebtedness within the limits now authorized by law.
- Tubercular hospitals. For the establishment and 46 maintenance of a hospital for the care and treatment of persons 47 48 suffering from tuberculosis. In the execution of this power the 49 board may select trustees to establish and operate said hospital. 50 In counties having a population of more than forty thousand 51 (40,000) people, as shown by the latest United States census, the 52 board may set aside, appropriate and expend monies from the 53 general fund for the purpose of aiding in the maintenance and 54 support of hospitals maintained and operated in such county for 55 the care and treatment of persons suffering from tuberculosis. 56 The monies shall be expended by the board through such trustees, 57 not less than three (3) and not more than five (5), to be elected 58 by the board of supervisors annually. The trustees shall file 59 reports with the board at least once every six (6) months showing 60 in detail all expenditures made by them and the number of patients 61 which have been for the preceding period aided or cared for by the institution, and the board may otherwise require a strict 62 accounting of the administration of said funds. 63
- (g) Same -- additional provisions. The boards of
 supervisors of one or more counties are hereby authorized and
 empowered, in their discretion, separately or jointly, to acquire
 by gift, purchase or lease, real estate, for tubercular hospital
 purposes, and to own, erect, build, establish, maintain, regulate

- and support a tubercular hospital and to remodel buildings on such property to be used for such hospital purposes.
- 71 In the event the boards of supervisors of two (2) or more
- 72 counties agree to cooperate in establishing and maintaining such
- 73 hospital, the board of supervisors of each of said counties shall
- 74 adopt a resolution agreeing to the proportionate part each county
- 75 will contribute to the establishment and maintaining of such
- 76 hospital.
- 77 Each county operating under the provisions of this subsection
- 78 is hereby authorized and empowered to set aside, appropriate and
- 79 expend monies from the general fund for the purpose of erecting,
- 80 maintaining and operating such hospital.
- 81 (h) Charity wards in hospitals. A sum of money not
- 82 exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per month to maintain a
- 83 charity ward or wards in any hospital in their respective
- 84 counties, or in the event there shall be no hospital in such
- 85 county, then a like sum, in their discretion, to maintain a
- 86 charity ward or wards in any hospital in any adjoining county
- 87 receiving and treating patients from such county having no
- 88 hospital.
- 89 (i) Same -- coast counties. The several counties of
- 90 this state bordering on the tidewater of the Gulf of Mexico are
- 91 hereby authorized and empowered, in the discretion of the proper
- 92 authorities thereof, to appropriate such a sum of money as said
- 93 authorities shall deem reasonable, to provide and maintain a

94 charity ward or wards, in any of the hospitals in said counties, 95 or, in the discretion of said authorities, to make and enter into contracts with any such hospitals for the treatment and care in 96 such hospitals of the indigent sick of said counties, and to pay 97 therefor out of the general fund of such counties such sum or sums 98 99 as shall be a reasonable and just compensation to said hospital. 100 However, the board of supervisors of any county mentioned herein 101 may, in its discretion, make and enter into contracts with any 102 hospital in any adjoining county receiving and treating patients 103 from the respective counties mentioned herein in such hospitals of 104 the indigent sick of said counties, mentioned herein, and to pay 105 therefor out of the general fund of such county, such sum or sums that shall be reasonable and just to said hospitals. 106

(j) **Public libraries.** A sum not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per annum toward the support and maintenance of one or more public libraries situated in the county. In any county whose total assessed valuation, including railroads and all public utilities, is more than Eighteen Million Dollars (\$18,000,000.00) the board, in its discretion, may appropriate a sum not to exceed Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) per annum for public libraries.

The board may also give or donate any legislative journals, constitutional convention journals, printed official reports of any state or county officers, official reports of departments, bureaus or officers of the United States, and copies of the acts

119	of the Legislature or laws of Mississippi now or hereafter in the
120	county library of such county and not needed, in the opinion of
121	the board in the county library (but not including any Mississippi
122	reports and not including any acts of the Legislature or laws of
123	the state, unless such acts or laws be more than twenty (20) years
124	old) to any library or library association or foundation or
125	organization maintaining a free public library for reference or
126	otherwise, provided such library, association, foundation or
127	organization owns free from encumbrance a fireproof library
128	building located in this state, in which building said journals,
129	reports, acts and laws may be and shall be deposited where
130	received under this subsection and made accessible under
131	reasonable regulations to the general public. Such library,
132	association, foundation or organization shall not have the right
133	to sell or otherwise dispose of said journals, reports, acts and
134	laws. Said journals, reports, acts and laws may be returned to
135	the county library from which received without expense to the
136	county, or to the state library, without expense to the state, at
137	any time by the library, association, foundation or organization
138	receiving the same.
139	Any gift or donation made by the board of supervisors of any
140	county under the authority of this subsection shall be evidenced
141	by an order spread upon the minutes of said board. The county
142	shall bear no expense in connection with any donation. The

sheriff of the county, or the custodian of the county library,

144	shall deliver to the representative of the library, association,
145	foundation or organization entitled to receive the same any of
146	said journals, reports, acts, laws and official publications in
147	accordance with the directions contained in any order of the board
148	of supervisors for the delivery of the same, and shall take proper
149	receipt from the party receiving the same, and shall deliver such
150	receipt to the clerk of the board of supervisors of the county,
151	and the board of supervisors shall have the said receipt entered
152	in full on the minutes of the board.

Any library, association, foundation or organization receiving any gift or donation from any county under this subsection shall report in writing to the board of supervisors, from which such gifts or donations have been received every two (2) years, that the gifts and donations so received are still in the possession of the donee and are accessible to the general public. If any of the gifts or donations so received have been lost, destroyed or have otherwise disappeared, report thereof shall be made.

If any library, association, foundation or organization receiving gifts or donations under this subsection shall cease operating as a free public library or shall cease to be the owner of a fireproof building in which it keeps and maintains a free public library, for reference or otherwise, the said library, association, foundation or organization shall thereupon immediately return to the county library, without expense to the

169 county, or to the state library, without expense to the state, any 170 gifts or donations it may have received under this subsection.

- 171 Patriotic organizations and memorials. A sum not 172 to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to build or aid any 173 post of the American Legion, any chapter of the Daughters of the 174 American Revolution, any chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, or any post, unit or chapter of any patriotic 175 organization within the county in building a memorial to the 176 177 veterans of World War I and World War II; and a sum not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to aid in defraying the cost of 178 179 the erection of suitable memorials to deceased soldiers, sailors 180 and marines of the late world wars. Such appropriation may be 181 made, even though no provision has been made therefor in the 182 county budget.
- 183 (1) American Red Cross. Any board of supervisors of
 184 any county in this state is hereby authorized and empowered, in
 185 its discretion, to donate annually, out of any monies in its
 186 respective treasury, to be drawn by warrant thereon, a sum not
 187 exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per million of assessed
 188 valuation to the support of a local chapter of the American Red
 189 Cross.
- 190 (m) **St. Jude Hospital**. For the payment of mileage
 191 expense for transporting persons to St. Jude Hospital in Memphis,
 192 Tennessee, for treatment. The mileage shall be based on a

- 195 Public museums. For the support and maintenance of (n) such public museums located in the county constituted under the 196 197 provisions of Chapter 9, Title 39, Mississippi Code of 1972.
 - (\circ) Domestic violence shelters. The board of supervisors of any county in this state is hereby authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to donate annually out of any money in the county treasury, such sums as the board deems advisable to support any domestic violence shelter or rape crisis center operating within or serving its area. For the purposes of this section, "rape crisis center" means a place established to provide care, counseling and related services to victims of rape, attempted rape, sexual battery or attempted sexual battery.
- 207 Literacy programs. The board of supervisors of any 208 county in this state is hereby authorized and empowered, in its 209 discretion, to donate out of the general fund of the county such 210 sum of money as the board deems reasonable to any literacy program 211 being conducted within the county.
- 212 Care of neglected children. The board of 213 supervisors of any county in this state, in its discretion, may 214 donate annually out of any money in the county treasury such sums 215 as the board deems advisable to support any residential group home 216 for the abused, abandoned or neglected children which operates 217 within or serves the county. For the purposes of this paragraph

- 220 home, for children who are the victims of abuse, neglect or
- 221 abandonment.
- 222 (r) Boys and Girls Club. To any chartered chapter of
- 223 the Boys and Girls Clubs of America located within the county, out
- 224 of any funds in the county treasury, provided that the cumulative
- 225 sum of donations to all chapters within the county does not exceed
- 226 the amount generated in the county by one-fourth (1/4) mill on all
- 227 of the taxable property within the county, during the fiscal year
- 228 in which the donations are made. Nothing in this paragraph
- 229 authorizes the imposition of additional tax.
- 230 (s) Mississippi Burn Care Fund. To the Mississippi
- 231 Burn Care Fund, subject to the limitations specified in Section
- 232 21-19-58.
- 233 (t) Court Appointed Special Advocates. To any chapter
- 234 of the Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), out of any funds
- 235 in the county treasury, provided that the cumulative sum of
- 236 donations to a chapter does not exceed the amount generated in the
- 237 county by one-fourth (1/4) mill on all of the taxable property
- 238 within the county, during the fiscal year in which the donations
- 239 are made. Nothing in this paragraph authorizes the imposition of
- 240 additional tax.
- 241 (u) National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster
- 242 (NVOAD). To a local chapter of NVOAD, whether in-kind

243	contributions or out of any funds in the county treasury, provided
244	that the cumulative sum of donations to a local NVOAD does not
245	exceed the amount generated in the county by one-fourth $(1/4)$ mill
246	on all of the taxable property within the county during the fiscal
247	year in which the donations are made. Nothing in this paragraph
248	authorizes the imposition of additional tax.

- (v) Farmers' markets. The board of supervisors of any county in this state, in its discretion, may donate annually out of any money in the county treasury, such sums as the board deems advisable to support any farmers' market that is certified by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce and operating within the county, not to exceed the amount that would be generated from the levy of a one-fourth (1/4) mill ad valorem tax upon all taxable property in the county.
- (w) Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA). To any chartered chapter of the YMCA located within the county, out of any funds in the county treasury, provided that the cumulative sum of donations to all chapters within the county does not exceed the amount generated in the county by one-fourth (1/4) mill on all of the taxable property within the county, during the fiscal year in which the donations are made. Nothing in this paragraph authorizes the imposition of additional tax.
- 265 (x) Fannie Lou Hamer Cancer Foundation. For the

 266 establishment and operation of an education center pertaining to

 267 the prevention of cancer as well as protection from cancer, the

268	board of supervisors of any county in this state is hereby
269	authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to donate to the
270	center annually out of any money in the county treasury, provided
271	that the cumulative sum of donations does not exceed the amount
272	generated in the county by one-fourth (1/4) mill on all of the
273	taxable property within the county, during the fiscal year in
274	which the donations are made.
275	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
276	and after July 1, 2018.
