7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. Section 25-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9	amended as follows:

37	SECTION 2. Section 25-3-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
38	brought forward as follows:
39	25-3-39. (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this
40	section, no public officer, public employee, administrator, or
41	executive head of any arm or agency of the state, in the executive
42	branch of government, shall be paid a salary or compensation,
43	directly or indirectly, greater than one hundred fifty percent
44	(150%) of the salary fixed in Section 25-3-31 for the Governor,
45	nor shall the salary of any public officer, public employee,

- 46 administrator, or executive head of any arm or agency of the
- 47 state, in the executive branch of government, be supplemented with
- 48 any funds from any source, including federal or private funds.
- 49 Such salaries shall be completely paid by the state. All academic
- officials, members of the teaching staffs and employees of the
- 51 state institutions of higher learning, the Mississippi Community
- 52 College Board, and community and junior colleges, and licensed
- 53 physicians who are public employees, shall be exempt from this
- 54 subsection. All professional employees who hold a bachelor's
- 55 degree or more advanced degree from an accredited four-year
- 56 college or university or a certificate or license issued by a
- 57 state licensing board, commission or agency and who are employed
- 58 by the Department of Mental Health shall be exempt from this
- 59 subsection if the State Personnel Board approves the exemption.
- 60 The Commissioner of Child Protection Services is exempt from this
- 61 subsection. From and after July 1, 2018, the Executive Director
- of the Public Employees' Retirement System and the Chief
- 63 Investment Officer of the Public Employees' Retirement System
- 64 shall be exempt from this subsection.
- 65 (b) The Governor shall fix the annual salary of the
- 66 Executive Director of the Mississippi Development Authority, the
- 67 annual salary of the Commissioner of Child Protection Services,
- 68 and the annual salary of the Chief of Staff of the Governor's
- 69 Office. The salary of the Governor's Chief of Staff shall not be
- 70 greater than one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the salary of the

- 71 Governor and shall be completely paid by the state without
- 72 supplementation from another source. The salary of the Executive
- 73 Director of the Mississippi Development Authority may be greater
- 74 than one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the salary of the
- 75 Governor and may be supplemented with funds from any source,
- 76 including federal or private funds; however, any state funds used
- 77 to pay the salary of the Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 78 Development Authority shall not exceed one hundred fifty percent
- 79 (150%) of the salary of the Governor. If the executive director's
- 80 salary is supplemented with private funds, the Mississippi
- 81 Development Authority shall publish on its website the amount of
- 82 the supplement and the name of the donor of the private funds.
- 83 (2) No public officer, employee or administrator shall be
- 84 paid a salary or compensation, directly or indirectly, in excess
- 85 of the salary authorized to be paid the executive head of the
- 86 state agency or department in which he is employed. The State
- 87 Personnel Board, based upon its findings of fact, may exempt
- 88 physicians and actuaries from this subsection when the acquisition
- 89 of such professional services is precluded based on the prevailing
- 90 wage in the relevant labor market.
- 91 (3) The executive head of any state agency or department
- 92 appointed by the Governor, in such executive head's discretion,
- 93 may waive all or any portion of the salary or compensation
- 94 lawfully established for the position.

95 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 96 and after July 1, 2018.
