## HOUSE BILL NO. 441

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-131, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM TO INCLUDE COMPONENTS IN HEALTHY LIVING, DRUG AND ALCOHOL EDUCATION 3 AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION; TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-135, MISSISSIPPI 4 5 CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS TO ADOPT PLANS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION 6 7 PROGRAM INTO THE LOCAL SCHOOL CURRICULUM; TO AMEND SECTION 8 37-14-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE PUBLIC SCHOOL NURSES TO PROVIDE INSTRUCTION IN EACH OF THE COMPONENTS OF THE 9 COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE 10 OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 11 12 SUBMIT RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR THE 13 ADOPTION OF ANY RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PROGRAM; AND 14 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 37-13-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 16 17 amended as follows: 18 37-13-131. (1) The State Department of Education is 19 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration and supervision of the Comprehensive School Health Education 20 Program as an educational curriculum in the State of Mississippi. 21 It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made available 22

to the State Department of Education for the purpose of

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- comprehensive school health education shall be administered by the State Department of Education.
- 26 (2) Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of this
- 27 section, the State Department of Education is authorized to
- 28 establish an Office of Comprehensive School Health Education
- 29 within the framework of the State Department of Education for the
- 30 purpose of developing standards, procedures and criteria for the
- 31 administration and supervision of a statewide program of health
- 32 education in Kindergarten through Grade 12. The State Department
- 33 of Education, through the Office of Comprehensive School Health
- 34 Education, shall assume the further responsibility for promoting a
- 35 statewide effort designed to prepare local school faculties and
- 36 staffs to incorporate the comprehensive health education concept
- 37 into their local educational programs.
- 38 (3) The Mississippi Department of Health, in conjunction
- 39 with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related
- 40 Services of the State Department of Education, shall develop a
- 41 long-range strategic plan for a Comprehensive School Health
- 42 Education Program in Grades K through 12. The Comprehensive
- 43 School Health Education Program shall encompass \* \* \* six (6)
- 44 interdependent components: (a) health education and healthy
- 45 living; (b) health service; (c) physical education and
- 46 fitness; \* \* \* (d) a healthful school environment; (e) drug and
- 47 <u>alcohol education; and (f) conflict resolution</u>. These curriculum
- 48 components shall be designed to develop decision-making

- 49 competencies related to health and health behavior. Such
- 50 curriculum components are intended to motivate health maintenance
- 51 and promote wellness, not only to prevent disease or
- 52 disability.

- SECTION 2. Section 37-13-135, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 55 amended as follows:
- 56 37-13-135. (1) In addition to all other authority, duties
- 57 and powers the school boards of the school districts of this state
- 58 may now have, each \* \* \* local school board shall adopt plans for
- 59 the implementation of the Comprehensive School Health Education
- 60 Program into the local school curriculum.
- 61 (2) School boards shall appoint a local health education
- 62 council to make recommendations regarding a comprehensive health
- 63 education curriculum.
- 64 (3) There shall be cooperation between the State Department
- of Education, Office of Comprehensive School Health Education, and
- 66 the school boards of the several school districts in implementing
- 67 this program as it best suits the needs of the individual
- 68 districts.
- 69 (4) The Commission on School Accreditation shall encourage
- 70 the development of plans of comprehensive school health education
- 71 and the implementation thereof.
- 72 **SECTION 3.** Section 37-14-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

73 amended as follows:

- 74 (1)The State Department of Education is 75 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration 76 and supervision of the school nurse program as an education and 77 wellness curriculum in the public schools of the State of 78 Mississippi. The public school nurse program administered by the 79 State Department of Education shall be known and may be cited as 80 the "Mary Kirkpatrick Haskell-Mary Sprayberry Public School Nurse 81 Program." It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made 82 available to the State Department of Education for the purpose of 83 employing school nurses shall be administered by the State
- 85 The State Department of Education, through the Office of Healthy Schools, shall develop standards, procedures and criteria 86 87 for the public school nurse programs in Kindergarten through Grade 88 The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of 89 Education shall assume the responsibility for promoting a statewide school nurse program designed to prepare local school 90 91 districts to incorporate the school program into their local 92 educational programs.
- 93 (3) From and after July 1, 2007, the School Nurse
  94 Intervention Program administered and funded by the State
  95 Department of Health shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy
  96 Schools of the State Department of Education. Any administrative
  97 personnel employed by the State Department of Health for the
  98 administration of school nurses under the School Nurse

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Department of Education.

99	Intervention Program may be considered for employment by the
100	Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education for
101	the purpose of coordinating the employment of school nurses in the
102	school districts. Any administrative personnel formerly employed
103	by the Partnership for a Healthy Mississippi, Inc., for the
104	administration of school nurses in the public schools may be
105	considered for employment by the Office of Healthy Schools of the
106	State Department of Education for the purpose of coordinating the
107	employment of school nurses in the school districts. All records
108	and unexpended balances of accounts in the School Nurse
109	Intervention Program relating to the employment of school nurses
110	shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy Schools in the State
111	Department of Education in accordance with the transfer of

113 (4) The nurses in the Mary Kirkpatrick Haskell-Mary
114 Sprayberry Public School Nurse Program shall have the following
115 specific responsibilities:

- 132 students to health careers.
- 133 (5) The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of
- 134 Education shall provide resources to all public school nurses so
- 135 that those schools with school nurses will be prepared to provide
- 136 health education in Mississippi schools and support the
- 137 Mississippi Comprehensive Health Framework, Mississippi Physical
- 138 Education Framework, Wellness Policy, coordinated approach to
- 139 school health, and other resources required by the State Board of
- 140 Education.
- 141 (6) In administering the Mary Kirkpatrick Haskell-Mary
- 142 Sprayberry Public School Nurse Program, the Office of Healthy
- 143 Schools of the State Department of Education shall perform the
- 144 following duties:
- 145 (a) Execute any contracts, agreements or other
- 146 documents with any governmental agency or any person, corporation,

- 148 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this chapter;
- 149 Receive grants or any other contributions made to
- 150 the State Board of Education to be used for specific purposes
- 151 related to the goals of this chapter;
- 152 (C) Submit to the State Auditor any financial records
- 153 that are necessary for the Auditor to perform an annual audit of
- 154 the \* \* \* department as required by law;
- 155 (d) \* \* \* Submit recommendations to the State Board of
- 156 Education for the adoption of any rules or regulations that are
- 157 necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
- 158 Develop criteria to measure the effectiveness of a
- 159 school nurse;
- 160 (f)Communicate to superintendents and principals how
- 161 to maximize the effectiveness of a public school nurse;
- 162 (g) Develop recommended salary structure for school
- districts to use when hiring a school nurse; 163
- 164 (h) Communicate to superintendents, principals and
- 165 other appropriate school officials regarding the statutes and
- regulations prohibiting the use of tobacco by school personnel on 166
- 167 school property and at school events, and to monitor the
- effectiveness of this ban; 168
- 169 (i) Implement policies to reduce unnecessary paperwork
- 170 by public school nurses; and

(j) Take any other actions that are necessary to car	ry
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- 172 out the purposes of this chapter.
- 173 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 174 and after July 1, 2018.
