## HOUSE BILL NO. 499

AN ACT TO REQUIRE EMPLOYERS TO ALLOW THEIR EMPLOYEES TO TAKE 2 TWO HOURS OF TIME OFF IN CERTAIN SITUATIONS IN ORDER TO VOTE IN 3 ANY MUNICIPAL, COUNTY, STATE OR FEDERAL POLITICAL PARTY PRIMARY, GENERAL OR SPECIAL ELECTION; TO PROVIDE THE NOTICE THAT EMPLOYEES 4 5 MUST GIVE EMPLOYERS IN ORDER TO TAKE TIME OFF TO VOTE; TO ALLOW 6 EMPLOYERS TO SPECIFY WHEN EMPLOYEES MAY TAKE TIME OFF TO VOTE; TO 7 PROVIDE THAT EMPLOYEES MUST NOT BE PENALIZED FOR TAKING THE 8 PROVIDED TIME OFF TO VOTE; TO ESTABLISH THE PENALTIES FOR ANY 9 EMPLOYER WHO VIOLATES THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 12 **SECTION 1.** (a) Each employee in this state, who is a
- 13 qualified elector of the state, shall be permitted by his or her
- 14 employer to take two (2) hours of paid time off from his or her
- 15 employment or service to vote in any municipal, county, state or
- 16 federal political party primary, general or special election on
- 17 the day on which the election is held unless the required hours of
- 18 work for the employee begin at least two (2) hours after the polls
- 19 open or end at least two (2) hours before the polls close.
- 20 (b) The employee shall give at least one-day notice to
- 21 his or her employer if that employee wishes to take time off to

- 22 vote, and the employer may specify the hours during which the
- 23 employee may absent himself or herself to vote.
- 24 (c) Each employee who is employed and paid by the hour
- 25 shall receive his or her regular hourly wage for the period of his
- or her absence necessitated by voting, not to exceed two (2)
- 27 hours. No time shall be deducted from an employee's usual salary
- 28 or wages, and an employee shall not be penalized in any way,
- 29 including discharge from service or employment, for exercising his
- 30 or her right to vote under the provisions of this section.
- 31 (d) Refusal to allow an employee time off to vote under
- 32 the provisions of this section is a violation of the law. Any
- 33 employer who commits such violation shall be required to
- 34 immediately forfeit any tax exemption, tax credit or other tax
- 35 incentive, grant or other monetary benefit that has been afforded
- 36 the employer by any municipality, county, government agency, the
- 37 State of Mississippi or any other public or private entity. The
- 38 employer shall be unable to participate in or receive any new tax
- 39 exemption, tax credit or other tax incentive, grant or other
- 40 monetary benefit that it otherwise would be eligible to
- 41 participate in or receive for a period of five (5) years. During
- 42 the five-year period, the Secretary of State's office shall
- 43 monitor the employer to ensure the employer's compliance with the
- 44 provisions of this section.
- 45 **SECTION 2.** Section 1 of this act shall be codified as a new
- 46 section in Chapter 15, Title 23, Mississippi Code of 1972.

47 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

48 and after July 1, 2018.
