HOUSE BILL NO. 510

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-137, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,  
2 TO REQUIRE SCHOOL CAFETERIAS TO PREPARE MENUS IN STRICT COMPLIANCE  
3 WITH THE FEDERAL NUTRITION STANDARDS ADOPTED BY THE UNITED STATES  
4 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE FOR THE CHILD NUTRITION SCHOOL BREAKFAST  
5 AND LUNCH PROGRAMS; TO REQUIRE EACH SCHOOL CAFETERIA TO DISPLAY  
6 PROMINENTLY THE NUTRITIONAL GUIDE CHART OR THE FOOD PYRAMID; AND  
7 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

9 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-13-137, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
10 amended as follows:

11 37-13-137. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt  
12 regulations as provided in this section not later than March 1,  
13 2008, which shall be effective for compliance by school districts  
14 beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, for the Child Nutrition  
15 School Breakfast and Lunch Programs that are not in conflict with  
16 the regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture  
17 (USDA). The regulations shall take into account the most recent  
18 and advanced scientific principles regarding good human health and  
19 fitness, and the effect of the regulations must be that the good  
20 health, well-being and fitness of Mississippi school children



21 shall be advanced. The regulations shall include, but not be  
22 limited to, the following areas:

23 (a) Healthy food and beverage choices;

24 (b) Healthy food preparation;

25 (c) Marketing of healthy food choices to students and  
26 staff;

27 (d) Food preparation ingredients and products;

28 (e) Minimum and maximum time allotment for students and  
29 staff lunch and breakfast periods;

30 (f) The availability of food items during the lunch and  
31 breakfast periods of the Child Nutrition School Breakfast and  
32 Lunch Programs; and

33 (g) Methods to increase participation in the Child  
34 Nutrition School Breakfast and Lunch Programs.

35 (2) The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of  
36 Education shall provide comprehensive training for  
37 superintendents, business managers, food service directors and  
38 food service managers of a local school district, or the designees  
39 appointed by those individuals for training purposes, as required  
40 by the department on marketing healthy foods, creating a healthy  
41 cafeteria environment, effective and efficient food service  
42 operations, the standards and expectations of food service staff,  
43 and other topics as identified by the department. The department  
44 may determine the time and location of the trainings and the  
45 frequency with which they are held. Persons employed by a local



46 school district having the certification as a Food Service  
47 Administrator III or IV shall be exempt from the training  
48 requirements of this subsection.

49 (3) Local school districts may adopt rules and regulations  
50 that may be more stringent but not in conflict with those adopted  
51 by the State Board of Education under this section.

52 (4) Local school districts shall require each school  
53 cafeteria to prepare menus in strict compliance with the federal  
54 nutrition standards adopted by the United States Department of  
55 Agriculture for the Child Nutrition School Breakfast and Lunch  
56 Programs. Each school cafeteria shall display prominently the  
57 nutritional guide chart or the food pyramid.

58 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
59 and after July 1, 2018.
