## HOUSE BILL NO. 519

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-4-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD TO IMPLEMENT THE INTEGRATED CAREER PATHWAYS INITIATIVE KNOWN AS "MISSISSIPPI INTEGRATED BASIC EDUCATION AND SKILLS TRAINING (MI-BEST)" ON A STATEWIDE BASIS AND TO RECEIVE AND DISTRIBUTE FUNDING FOR THE MI-BEST PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8 SECTION 1. Section 37-4-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9 amended as follows:

10 37-4-3. (1) From and after July 1, 1986, there shall be a 11 Mississippi Community College Board which shall receive and 12 distribute funds appropriated by the Legislature for the use of 13 the public community and junior colleges and funds from federal and other sources that are transmitted through the state 14 15 governmental organization for use by said colleges. This board shall provide general coordination of the public community and 16 junior colleges, assemble reports and such other duties as may be 17 18 prescribed by law.

19 (2) The board shall consist of ten (10) members of which 20 none shall be an elected official and none shall be engaged in the H. B. The Governor shall appoint two (2) 22 members from the First Mississippi Congressional District, one (1) who shall serve an initial term of two (2) years and one (1) who 23 shall serve an initial term of five (5) years; two (2) members 24 25 from the Second Mississippi Congressional District, one (1) who 26 shall serve an initial term of five (5) years and one (1) who 27 shall serve an initial term of three (3) years; and two (2) 28 members from the Third Mississippi Congressional District, one (1) 29 who shall serve an initial term of four (4) years and one (1) who 30 shall serve an initial term of two (2) years; two (2) members from 31 the Fourth Mississippi Congressional District, one (1) who shall 32 serve an initial term of three (3) years and one (1) who shall 33 serve an initial term of four (4) years; and two (2) members from 34 the Fifth Mississippi Congressional District, one (1) who shall 35 serve an initial term of five (5) years and one (1) who shall 36 serve an initial term of two (2) years. All subsequent appointments shall be for a term of six (6) years and continue 37 38 until their successors are appointed and qualify. An appointment 39 to fill a vacancy which arises for reasons other than by 40 expiration of a term of office shall be for the unexpired term 41 only. No two (2) appointees shall reside in the same junior 42 college district. All members shall be appointed with the advice 43 and consent of the Senate.

44 (3) There shall be a chairman and vice chairman of the45 board, elected by and from the membership of the board; and the

H. B. No. 519 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 18/HR26/R993 PAGE 2 (RKM\KW) 46 chairman shall be the presiding officer of the board. The board 47 shall adopt rules and regulations governing times and places for 48 meetings and governing the manner of conducting its business.

(4) The members of the board shall receive no annual salary, but shall receive per diem compensation as authorized by Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, for each day devoted to the discharge of official board duties and shall be entitled to reimbursement for all actual and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including mileage as authorized by Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972.

56 (5) The board shall name a director for the state system of public junior and community colleges, who shall serve at the 57 58 pleasure of the board. Such director shall be the chief executive 59 officer of the board, give direction to the board staff, carry out 60 the policies set forth by the board, and work with the presidents 61 of the several community and junior colleges to assist them in carrying out the mandates of the several boards of trustees and in 62 63 functioning within the state system and policies established by 64 the Mississippi Community College Board. The Mississippi Community College Board shall set the salary of the Director of 65 66 the Board. The Legislature shall provide adequate funds for the Mississippi Community College Board, its activities and its staff. 67 68 (6) The powers and duties of the Mississippi Community College Board shall be: 69

70 (a) To authorize disbursements of state appropriated
71 funds to community and junior colleges through orders in the
72 minutes of the board.

73 (b) To make studies of the needs of the state as they74 relate to the mission of the community and junior colleges.

75 (c) To approve new, changes to and deletions of76 vocational and technical programs to the various colleges.

(d) To require community and junior colleges to supply such information as the board may request and compile, publish and make available such reports based thereon as the board may deem advisable.

81 (e) To approve proposed new attendance centers (campus 82 locations) as the local boards of trustees should determine to be 83 in the best interest of the district. Provided, however, that no 84 new community/junior college branch campus shall be approved 85 without an authorizing act of the Legislature.

86 (f) To serve as the state approving agency for federal 87 funds for proposed contracts to borrow money for the purpose of 88 acquiring land, erecting, repairing, etc. dormitories, dwellings 89 or apartments for students and/or faculty, such loans to be paid 90 from revenue produced by such facilities as requested by local 91 boards of trustees.

92 (g) To approve applications from community and junior
 93 colleges for state funds for vocational-technical education
 94 facilities.

95 (h) To approve any university branch campus offering96 lower undergraduate level courses for credit.

97 (i) To appoint members to the Post-Secondary98 Educational Assistance Board.

99 (j) To appoint members to the Authority for Educational100 Television.

101 (k) To contract with other boards, commissions, 102 governmental entities, foundations, corporations or individuals 103 for programs, services, grants and awards when such are needed for 104 the operation and development of the state public community and 105 junior college system.

(1) To fix standards for community and junior colleges to qualify for appropriations, and qualifications for community and junior college teachers.

(m) To have sign-off approval on the State Plan for Vocational Education which is developed in cooperation with appropriate units of the State Department of Education.

112 (n) To approve or disapprove of any proposed inclusion 113 within municipal corporate limits of state-owned buildings and 114 grounds of any community college or junior college and to approve 115 or disapprove of land use development, zoning requirements, building codes and delivery of governmental services applicable to 116 117 state-owned buildings and grounds of any community college or junior college. Any agreement by a local board of trustees of a 118 119 community college or junior college to annexation of state-owned

120 property or other conditions described in this paragraph shall be 121 void unless approved by the board and by the board of supervisors 122 of the county in which the state-owned property is located.

123 (o) To implement on a statewide basis, through

124 collaboration with all Mississippi community and junior colleges,

125 the integrated career pathways initiative known as "Mississippi

126 Integrated Basic Education and Skills Training (MI-BEST)" and to

127 receive and distribute funds appropriated by the Legislature and

128 from the federal government and other sources to the community and 129 junior colleges for the support of MI-BEST.

130 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 131 and after July 1, 2018.
