HOUSE BILL NO. 585

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 2 CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY OF SCHOOL DISTRICT SPENDING AND 3 FINANCIAL EFFICIENCY, THROUGH WHICH IT SHALL IDENTIFY SCHOOL 4 DISTRICTS AND INDIVIDUAL SCHOOLS THAT USE RESOURCE ALLOCATION 5 PRACTICES THAT CONTRIBUTE TO HIGH ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AND 6 COST-EFFECTIVE OPERATIONS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE STUDY FOCUS ON 7 METHODS TO ASSIST SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND SCHOOLS IN ELIMINATING TOP-END COSTS TO OPTIMIZE EFFICIENCY IN ADMINISTRATIVE AND 8 9 OPERATIONAL FUNCTIONS OF DISTRICT AND SCHOOL THEREIN, AND 10 IMPLEMENTING NEW STANDARDS TO BE ADHERED TO BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO 11 PROMOTE GRADE LEVEL PROFICIENCY; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO 12 DEVELOP A REVIEW PROCESS TO ANTICIPATE THE FUTURE FINANCIAL 13 SOLVENCY OF EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO DEVELOP AN ELECTRONIC-BASED PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO USE IN 14 15 SUBMITTING INFORMATION TO THE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE 16 STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL ADOPT RULES UNDER THIS SUBSECTION 17 TO ALLOW A DISTRICT TO ENTER ESTIMATES OF CRITICAL DATA INTO THE 18 PROGRAM BEFORE THE DISTRICT ADOPTS ITS BUDGET; TO REQUIRE DISTRICTS TO PROVIDE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTS TO THE DEPARTMENT 19 20 IF THE REVIEW PROCESS INDICATES A PROJECTED DEFICIT FOR A SCHOOL 21 DISTRICT GENERAL FUND WITHIN THE FOLLOWING THREE SCHOOL YEARS; AND 22 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 24 SECTION 1. (1) The State Department of Education shall

25 conduct a feasibility study of school district spending and

26 financial efficiency, through which it shall identify school

27 districts and individual schools that use resource allocation

28 practices that contribute to high academic achievement and

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29 cost-effective operations. The department's study shall focus on 30 methods to be employed by school districts and schools statewide to eliminate top-end costs as means of optimizing efficiency in 31 32 the administrative and operational functions of the school district and individual schools therein, in addition to 33 34 implementing new standards to be adhered to by school districts to promote grade level proficiency. In identifying districts and 35 36 individual schools, the department shall:

37 (a) Evaluate existing academic accountability and38 financial data by integrating the data;

39 (b) Rank the results of the evaluation under paragraph
40 (a) to identify the relative performance of districts and
41 individual schools; and

42 (c) Identify potential areas for district and43 individual school improvement.

44 (2) In reviewing resources allocation practices of districts
45 and individual schools under the department shall ensure resources
46 are being used for the instruction of students by evaluating:

47 (a) The operating cost for each student;
48 (b) The operating cost for each program; and
49 (c) The staffing cost for each student.

50 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The State Department of Education shall 51 develop a review process to anticipate the future financial 52 solvency of each school district. The review process shall 53 analyze:

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56 (b) Projected district revenues and expenditures for 57 the current school year and the following two (2) school years.

(2) In analyzing the information under subsection (1), the
review process developed must consider, for the preceding school
year, the current school year, and the following two (2) school
years, as appropriate:

62 (a) Student-to-staff ratios relative to expenditures,
63 including average staff salaries;

64 (b) The rate of change in the district unreserved65 general fund balance;

(c) The number of students enrolled in the district;
(d) The adopted tax rate of the district;

68 (e) Any independent audit report prepared for the69 district; and

70 (f) Actual district financial information for the first71 quarter.

72 (3) The department shall consult school district financial
73 officers and public finance experts in developing the review
74 process under this section.

75 (4) The department shall develop an electronic-based program 76 for school districts to use in submitting information to the 77 department for purposes of this section. Each district shall 78 update information for purposes of the program within the period

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79 prescribed by the State Board of Education. The State Board of 80 Education shall adopt rules under this subsection to allow a 81 district to enter estimates of critical data into the program 82 before the district adopts its budget. The program must: 83 Be capable of importing, to the extent practicable, (a) 84 data a district has previously submitted to the department; 85 Include an entry space that allows a district to (b) 86 enter information explaining any irregularity in data submitted; 87 and Provide alerts for: 88 (C) 89 (i) A student-to-staff ratio that is significantly 90 outside the norm; 91 (ii) A rapid depletion of the district general 92 fund balance; and 93 A significant discrepancy between actual (iii) 94 budget figures and projected revenues and expenditures. 95 An alert in the program developed under subsection (4) (5) must be developed to notify the department immediately on the 96 97 occurrence of a condition described by subsection (4)(c). After 98 the department is alerted, the department shall immediately notify 99 the affected school district regarding the condition triggering 100 the alert. If the review process under Section 2 of 101 **SECTION 3.** (1) 102 this act indicates a projected deficit for a school district general fund within the following three (3) school years, the 103

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104 district shall provide to the department interim financial 105 reports, supplemented by staff and student count data, as needed, 106 to evaluate the district's current budget status.

107 (2) If the interim financial data provided under subsection 108 (1) substantiates the projected deficit, the school district shall 109 develop a financial plan and submit the plan to the department for 110 approval. The department may approve the plan only if the 111 department determines the plan will permit the district to avoid 112 the projected insolvency.

113 (3) The State Board of Education shall assign a school 114 district an accredited-warned status if:

(a) The district fails to submit a plan as provided by subsection (2) of this section;

(b) The district fails to obtain approval from the department for a plan as provided by subsection (2);

119 (c) The district fails to comply with a plan approved120 by the department under subsection (2); or

(d) The department determines in a later school year, based on financial data submitted by the district, that the approved plan for the district is no longer sufficient or is not appropriately implemented.

125 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 126 and after July 1, 2018.
