## HOUSE BILL NO. 592

- AN ACT TO CODIFY NEW SECTION 3-3-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DESIGNATE THE SONG "QUEEN OF THE SOUTH" AS AN OFFICIAL STATE SONG IN ADDITION TO THE PRESENT STATE SONG OF MISSISSIPPI, "GO, MISSISSIPPI"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that many states of the
- 6 United States have two (2) or more official state songs,
- 7 including: Tennessee, which has six (6) official state songs;
- 8 West Virginia, which has three (3) official state songs; and
- 9 Arkansas, Florida, Louisiana and South Carolina, which have two
- 10 (2) official state songs each; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Mississippi presently has an official state song,
- 12 "Go, Mississippi" by Houston Davis, which was adopted by the
- 13 Legislature in House Concurrent Resolution No. 67, 1962 Regular
- 14 Session; and
- WHEREAS, while "Go, Mississippi" is used sometimes for
- 16 special occasions and specific events, the lyrics and melody of
- 17 the song do not lend themselves easily for Mississippians to sing
- 18 at informal gatherings and by Mississippians individually as they
- 19 go about their daily lives; and

| 30 | 3-3-63. (1) The lyrics and music in the song entitled                |
| 31 | "Queen of the South" by Rick Cox are designated as an official       |
| 32 | state song of the State of Mississippi, in addition to the present   |
| 33 | official state song, "Go, Mississippi" by Houston Davis, adopted     |
| 34 | by the Legislature in House Concurrent Resolution No. 67, 1962       |
| 35 | Regular Session.   |
| 36 | (2) The lyrics of "Queen of the South" consist of three (3)          |
| 37 | verses and two (2) choruses, as follows:                             |
