HOUSE BILL NO. 621

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-11-49, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO PROHIBIT THE STATE BOARD OF FUNERAL SERVICE FROM ADOPTING RULES
 OR REGULATIONS REGULATING THE SIZE OF A FUNERAL HOME OR A FUNERAL
- 4 HOME CHAPEL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 73-11-49, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 73-11-49. (1) The board is authorized to select from its
- 9 own membership a chairman, vice chairman and secretary-treasurer.
- 10 Election of officers shall be held at the first regularly
- 11 scheduled meeting of the fiscal year.
- 12 (2) All members of the board shall be reimbursed for their
- 13 necessary traveling expenses and mileage incident to their
- 14 attendance upon the business of the board, as provided in Section
- 15 25-3-41, and shall receive a per diem as provided in Section
- 16 25-3-69 for every day actually spent upon the business of the
- 17 board, not to exceed twenty (20) days per year unless authorized
- 18 by a majority vote of the board.

- 19 (3) All monies received by the board shall be paid into a
 20 special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the board and
 21 shall be used by the board for paying the traveling and necessary
 22 expenses and per diem of the members of the board while on board
 23 business, and for paying other expenses necessary for the
 24 operation of the board in carrying out and involving the
 25 provisions of this chapter.
- 26 The board shall employ an administrator of the board, 27 who shall have complete supervision and be held responsible for the direction of the office of the board, shall have supervision 28 29 over field inspections and enforcement of the provisions of this 30 chapter, shall have such other duties as may be assigned by the 31 board, shall be responsible and answerable to the board. 32 board may employ such other clerical assistants and employees as 33 may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter, and 34 the terms and conditions of such employment shall be determined by 35 the board in accordance with applicable state law and rules and regulations of the State Personnel Board. 36
 - (5) Except as otherwise authorized in Section 7-5-39, the board, when it shall deem necessary, shall be represented by an assistant attorney general duly appointed by the Attorney General of this state, and may also request and receive the assistance of other state agencies and county and district attorneys, all of whom are authorized to provide the assistance requested.

- 45 The board shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations consistent with law concerning, but not limited to, 46 47 trainees, apprentices and preceptors, practitioners of funeral 48 service, funeral directors, embalmers and funeral establishments and branches. These rules and regulations shall not become 49 50 effective unless promulgated and adopted in accordance with the 51 provisions of the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law 52 (Section 25-43-1.101 et seq.).
 - inspections under this chapter, may employ an individual to perform such inspections or may contract with any other individual or entity to perform such inspections. Any individual or entity that performs such inspections shall have the right of entry into any place in which the business or practice of funeral service and/or funeral directing is carried on or advertised as being carried on, for the purpose of inspection, for the investigation of complaints coming before the board and for such other matters as the board may direct.
- 63 (9) The board shall not adopt any rule or regulation 64 regarding any of the following matters:
- 65 <u>(a)</u> Requiring dead bodies to be embalmed except as
 66 required by rule or otherwise by the State Department of Health;
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- (b) Regulating the size of a funeral home or a funeral
- 69 <u>home chapel</u>.
- 70 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 71 and after July 1, 2018.
