HOUSE BILL NO. 736 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-11-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE EACH STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER LEARNING, COMMUNITY 3 AND JUNIOR COLLEGE TO INCLUDE A CURRENT CONDITIONS AND RATING 4 REPORT OF ALL ROOFS IN THEIR CAPITAL NEEDS ASSESSMENTS REQUIRED BY 5 THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; TO PROVIDE THAT EACH 6 ROOF OF BUILDINGS NOT PLANNED FOR DEMOLITION SHALL BE VISUALLY 7 INSPECTED BY INSTITUTION OR AGENCY FACILITIES' STAFF, A LICENSED ARCHITECT OR ENGINEER OR BY THERMAL IMAGING INSPECTION EVERY THREE 8 9 YEARS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO SUBMIT THE DETAILED REPORT TO 10 THE PUBLIC PROPERTY COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE AND SENATE ON OR 11 BEFORE SEPTEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR; TO REQUIRE THE REPORTS TO CONTAIN 12 PRIORITIZED LISTS OF PROJECTS RANKED ON THE BASIS OF NEED 13 CONSISTENT WITH THE PRIMARY GOAL OF PRESERVING EXISTING CAPITAL ASSETS WHERE POSSIBLE AND REPLACING EXISTING CAPITAL ASSETS WHERE 14 15 NECESSARY; TO PROVIDE THAT ANY REQUEST FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION SHALL 16 IDENTIFY THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF NONSTATE FUNDS AVAILABLE TO SUPPORT 17 THE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT AND ANY PROPOSED FUNDING SOURCE FOR 18 FUTURE OPERATING, REPAIR AND RENOVATION COSTS; AND FOR RELATED 19 PURPOSES.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 21 SECTION 1. Section 31-11-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 22 amended as follows:

- 23 31-11-27. (1) (a) The Department of Finance and
- 24 Administration shall conduct a detailed study of the building and
- 25 other capital needs at each state institution and at each
- 26 community college and junior college immediately prior to

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27 September first in each year. This study shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following matters: 28 29 An inventory of every state building and other (i) 30 capital facility which is the property of the State of 31 Mississippi; 32 (ii) The location, date of construction or acquisition, the purpose for which used, outstanding indebtedness 33 34 against such facility, if any, and cost of repairs for the 35 preceding fiscal year; 36 (iii) An examination of the condition of the building or other facility, including current conditions and 37 ratings of all roofs at each state agency, state institution of 38 39 higher learning, community college and junior college; 40 (iv) An estimate of the cost of repairs required 41 to place the facility in good condition; 42 (v) An estimate of the cost of major renovations, 43 if contemplated; and 44 (vi) A determination of the new building and other 45 facility needs of each institution with such needs classified 46 under immediate or long range requirements. 47 (b) All state agencies, departments and institutions are hereby * * * required and directed to cooperate with the 48 Department of Finance and Administration in carrying out the 49 50 provisions of this section. (c) The Department of Finance and Administration shall submit a detailed report to the Legislative Budget Office, the <u>House Public Property Committee and the Senate Public Property</u> <u>Committee</u> on or before September first of each year. Such report shall be in such detail and in such form as may be prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

The architect or building inspector of the 61 (d) Department of Finance and Administration shall make a biennial 62 inspection of the New Capitol, Old Capitol, Woolfolk State Office 63 64 Building, War Memorial Building, the Governor's Mansion, and all 65 other buildings under jurisdiction of the Department of Finance and Administration for structural or other physical needs or 66 67 defects of such buildings, and he shall further inquire of the 68 department or its representatives regarding the condition of the 69 buildings. He shall make a written report of his finding to the 70 Department of Finance and Administration, Governor, Lieutenant 71 Governor and Speaker of the House of Representatives. The report 72 shall also make recommendations for repairs and list, by number, 73 the priority which should be given to making necessary repairs.

(2) (a) In addition to any report required in subsection
(1) of this section, the Department of Finance and Administration
shall prepare and submit an annual report to the Legislative

103 (vi) The approximate cost for each project, 104 including, but not limited to, itemized estimates of costs for 105 preplanning, constructing, furnishing and equipping a project, and 106 costs for property acquisition;

107 (vii) The estimated beginning date and completion
108 date for each project;

109 (viii) Whether a project, as proposed, is a 110 complete project or a phase or part of a project;

111 (ix) How a project will affect the operating budget of the applicable agency, department or institution for the 112 113 upcoming five-year period, regarding such items as additional personnel requirements, utility costs, maintenance costs, security 114 115 costs, etc. Any request for new construction other than 116 replacement, or for purposes other than incidental expansion of 117 existing facilities, shall also identify the total amount of nonstate funds to support such project; 118

(x) The proposed method of financing each project and the effect such financing will have on the state budget, including an estimate of any required debt service for the project, and an estimate of any federal funds or other funds that the agency, department or institution may have access to because of the project; and

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125 (xi) A list of the projects requested by each 126 agency, department or institution for the five-year period, with 127 each project ranked by the appropriate agency, department or 128 institution on the basis of need.

To enable the Department of Finance and 129 (b) 130 Administration to prepare the report required in this subsection 131 (2), it may require all state agencies, departments and 132 institutions to file a capital improvements projects request with 133 such information and in such form and in such detail as the 134 department may deem necessary and advisable. Such request shall be filed with the Department of Finance and Administration no 135 136 later than August 1 of each year.

137 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 138 and after July 1, 2018.
