HOUSE BILL NO. 803

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-239, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSIONERS SHALL DESIGNATE ONE POLL MANAGER PER PRECINCT, INSTEAD OF TWO, TO COMPLETE THE ONLINE 3 TRAINING PROGRAM TO BECOME A "CERTIFIED POLL MANAGER"; TO PROVIDE 4 5 THAT THE COMPENSATION PAID TO THE CERTIFIED POLL MANAGER SHALL BE 6 PAID BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE AND NOT THE HELP MISSISSIPPI VOTE 7 FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-169.7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING SECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
 10 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-239, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 11 amended as follows:

[Until January 1, 2020, this section shall read as follows:] 12 23-15-239. (1) The executive committee of each county, in 13 14 the case of a primary election, or the election commissioners of 15 each county, in the case of all other elections, in conjunction 16 with the circuit clerk, shall, in the years in which counties conduct an election, sponsor and conduct, not less than five (5) 17 days before each election, not less than four (4) hours and not 18 19 more than eight (8) hours of poll manager training to instruct poll managers as to their duties in the proper administration of 20 21 the election and the operation of the polling place. 22 manager who completes the online training course provided by the 23 Secretary of State shall only be required to complete two (2) 24 hours of in-person poll manager training. No poll manager shall 25 serve in any election unless he or she has received these 26 instructions once during the twelve (12) months immediately 27 preceding the date upon which the election is held; however, nothing in this section shall prevent the appointment of an 28 29 alternate poll manager to fill a vacancy in case of an emergency. 30 The county executive committee or the election commissioners, as appropriate, shall train a sufficient number of alternates to 31 32 serve in the event a poll manager is unable to serve for any 33 reason.

Poll managers shall not be 61 62 compensated for more than sixteen (16) hours of attendance at the 63 training sessions regardless of the actual amount of time that they attended the training sessions. 64

(4) The time and location of the training sessions required pursuant to this section shall be announced to the general public by posting a notice thereof at the courthouse and by delivering a copy of the notice to the office of a newspaper having general circulation in the county five (5) days before the date upon which the training session is to be conducted. Persons who will serve as poll watchers for candidates and political parties, as well as

(5) Subject to the following annual limitations, the election commissioners shall be entitled to receive a per diem in the amount of Eighty-four Dollars (\$84.00), to be paid from the county general fund, for every day or period of no less than five (5) hours accumulated over two (2) or more days actually employed in the performance of their duties for the necessary time spent in conducting training sessions as required by this section:

(a) In counties having less than fifteen thousand

census, not more than five (5) days per year;

(b) In counties having fifteen thousand (15,000)

(g) In counties having two hundred thousand (200,000) residents according to the latest federal decennial census but less than two hundred twenty-five thousand (225,000) residents according to the latest federal decennial census, not more than nineteen (19) days per year;

(h) In counties having two hundred twenty-five thousand (225,000) residents or more according to the latest federal decennial census, not more than twenty-two (22) days per year * * *.

(6) Election commissioners shall claim the per diem authorized in subsection (5) of this section in the manner provided for in Section 23-15-153(6).
