HOUSE BILL NO. 804

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-573, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,

TO PROVIDE THAT DURING MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS, AN AFFIDAVIT VOTER WHO IS CASTING AN AFFIDAVIT BALLOT BECAUSE THE VOTER IS UNABLE TO PRESENT AN ACCEPTABLE FORM OF PHOTO IDENTIFICATION SHALL RETURN TO 5 THE MUNICIPAL CLERK'S OFFICE WITHIN FIVE BUSINESS DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE ELECTION TO PRESENT AN ACCEPTABLE FORM OF PHOTO 7 IDENTIFICATION, A MISSISSIPPI VOTER IDENTIFICATION CARD, OR TO FILE AN AFFIDAVIT OF RELIGIOUS OBJECTION IN ORDER TO HAVE HIS OR 8 9 HER VOTE COUNTED; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 23-15-563, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDES THE VOTER IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENT, 10 FOR THE PURPOSE OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 13 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-573, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 14 15 23-15-573. (1) If any person declares that he or she is a registered voter in the jurisdiction in which he or she offers to 16 17 vote and that he or she is eligible to vote in the election, but 18 his or her name does not appear upon the pollbooks, or that he or 19 she is not able to cast a regular election day ballot under a 20 provision of state or federal law but is otherwise qualified to vote, or that he or she has been illegally denied registration, or 21

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- 23 identification:
- 24 (a) A poll manager shall notify the person that he or
- 25 she may cast an affidavit ballot at the election.
- 26 (b) The person shall be permitted to cast an affidavit
- 27 ballot at the polling place upon execution of a written affidavit
- 28 before one (1) of the poll managers stating that the individual:
- 29 (i) Believes he or she is a registered voter in
- 30 the jurisdiction in which he or she desires to vote and is
- 31 eligible to vote in the election; or
- 32 (ii) Is not able to cast a regular election day
- 33 ballot under a provision of state or federal law but is otherwise
- 34 qualified to vote; or
- 35 (iii) Believes that he or she has been illegally
- 36 denied registration; or
- 37 (iv) Is unable to present an acceptable form of
- 38 photo identification.
- 39 (c) The poll manager shall allow the individual to mark
- 40 a paper ballot properly endorsed by the initialing poll manager or
- 41 alternate initialing poll manager in accordance with Section
- 42 23-15-541, which shall be delivered by him or her to the proper
- 43 election official who shall enclose it in an affidavit ballot
- 44 envelope, with the written and signed affidavit of the voter
- 45 affixed to the envelope, seal the envelope and mark plainly upon
- 46 it the name of the person offering to vote.

- 47 (2) The affidavit ballot envelope shall include:
- 48 (a) The complete name of the voter;
- 49 (b) A present and previous physical and mailing address
- 50 of the voter;
- 51 (c) Telephone numbers where the voter may be contacted;
- 52 (d) A statement that the affiant believes he or she is
- 53 registered to vote in the jurisdiction in which he or she offers
- 54 to vote;
- 55 (e) The signature of the affiant; and
- (f) The signature of the poll manager at the polling
- 57 place at which the affiant offers to vote.
- 58 (3) (a) A separate receipt book shall be maintained for
- 59 affidavit voters and the affidavit voters shall sign the receipt
- 60 book upon completing the affidavit ballot.
- (b) If the affidavit voter is casting an affidavit
- 62 ballot because the voter is unable to present an acceptable form
- 63 of photo identification and the voter's name appears in the
- 64 pollbook, then the poll manager shall write "NO ID" across from
- 65 the voter's name and in the appropriate column in the pollbook.
- 66 (c) In canvassing the returns of the election, the
- 67 executive committee in primary elections, or the election
- 68 commissioners in other elections, shall examine the records and
- 69 allow the ballot to be counted, or not counted as it appears
- 70 legal.

71 (d) An affidavit ballot of a voter who was una	.ble to
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- 72 present an acceptable form of photo identification shall not be
- 73 rejected for this reason if the voter does either of the
- 74 following:
- 75 (i) Returns to the circuit clerk's office, or to
- 76 the municipal clerk's office for municipal elections, within five
- 77 (5) business days after the date of the election and presents an
- 78 acceptable form of photo identification;
- 79 (ii) Returns to the circuit clerk's office within
- 80 five (5) business days after the date of the election to obtain
- 81 the Mississippi Voter Identification Card, or in municipal
- 82 election, returns to the municipal clerk's office within five (5)
- 83 business days after the date of the election to present his or her
- 84 Mississippi Voter Identification Card or Temporary Mississippi
- 85 Voter Identification Card; or
- 86 (iii) Returns to the circuit clerk's office, or to
- 87 the municipal clerk's office for municipal elections, within five
- 88 (5) business days after the date of the election to execute a
- 89 separate Affidavit of Religious Objection.
- 90 (4) When a person is offered the opportunity to vote by
- 91 affidavit ballot, he or she shall be provided with written
- 92 information that informs the person how to ascertain whether his
- 93 or her affidavit ballot was counted and, if the vote was not
- 94 counted, the reasons the vote was not counted.

- 95 (5) The officials in charge of the election shall process
 96 all affidavit ballots by using the Statewide Elections Management
 97 System. The officials in charge of the election shall account for
 98 all affidavit ballots cast in each election, categorizing the
 99 affidavit ballots cast by reason and recording the total number of
 100 affidavit ballots counted and not counted in each such category in
 101 the Statewide Elections Management System.
- 102 The Secretary of State shall, by rule duly adopted, 103 establish a uniform affidavit ballot envelope that shall be used 104 in all elections in this state. The Secretary of State shall print and distribute a sufficient number of affidavit ballot 105 106 envelopes to the registrar of each county for use in elections. 107 The registrar shall distribute the affidavit ballot envelopes to 108 municipal and county executive committees for use in primary 109 elections and to municipal and county election commissioners for 110 use in all other elections.
- (7) County registrars and municipal registrars shall
 maintain a secure free access system that complies with the Help
 America Vote Act of 2002, by which persons who vote by affidavit
 ballot may determine if their ballots were counted, and if not,
 the reasons the ballot was not counted.
- 116 (8) Any person who votes in any election as a result of a

 117 federal or state court order or other order extending the time

 118 established by law for closing the polls on an election day, may

 119 only vote by affidavit ballot. Any affidavit ballot cast under

- 120 this subsection shall be separated and kept apart from other
- 121 affidavit ballots cast by voters not affected by the order.
- 122 **SECTION 2.** Section 23-15-563, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 123 brought forward as follows:
- 124 23-15-563. (1) Each person who appears to vote in person at
- 125 a polling place or the registrar's office shall be required to
- 126 identify himself or herself to a poll manager or the registrar by
- 127 presenting current and valid photo identification before such
- 128 person shall be allowed to vote.
- 129 (2) The identification required by subsection (1) of this
- 130 section shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 131 (a) A current and valid Mississippi driver's license;
- 132 (b) A current and valid identification card issued by a
- 133 branch, department, agency or entity of the State of Mississippi;
- 134 (c) A current and valid United States passport;
- 135 (d) A current and valid employee identification card
- 136 containing a photograph of the elector and issued by any branch,
- 137 department, agency or entity of the United States government, the
- 138 State of Mississippi, or any county, municipality, board,
- 139 authority or other entity of this state;
- 140 (e) A current and valid Mississippi license to carry a
- 141 pistol or revolver;
- 142 (f) A valid tribal identification card containing a
- 143 photograph of the elector;

- (h) A current and valid student identification card,

 containing a photograph of the elector, issued by any accredited

 college, university or community or junior college in the State of

 Mississippi; and
- 150 (i) An official Mississippi voter identification card
 151 containing a photograph of the elector.
- (3) (a) A person who appears to vote in person at a polling place and does not have identification as required by this section may vote by affidavit ballot. The affidavit ballot shall then be counted if the person shall present acceptable photo identification to the registrar within five (5) days.
- 157 (b) An elector who has a religious objection to being
 158 photographed may vote by affidavit ballot, and the elector, within
 159 five (5) days after the election, shall execute an affidavit in
 160 the registrar's office affirming that the exemption applies.
- 161 (4) The intentional failure of an election official to
 162 require a voter to present identification as required by this
 163 section shall be considered corrupt conduct under Section 97-13-19
 164 and shall be reported to the Secretary of State and the Attorney
 165 General.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
