## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 829

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-87, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 RECOMMEND A COMPREHENSIVE EYE EXAMINATION FOR ALL STUDENTS PRIOR 3 TO ENTERING OR ENROLLING FOR THE FIRST TIME IN A PUBLIC, PRIVATE 4 OR PAROCHIAL SCHOOL; TO PROVIDE STANDARDS FOR REQUIRED EYE 5 EXAMINATIONS; TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION WITH 6 INPUT FROM THE MISSISSIPPI VISION FOUNDATION TO DEVELOP AND ISSUE 7 REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING STANDARDS FOR THE STUDENT EYE EXAMINATION 8 PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

10 SECTION 1. Section 37-3-87, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

11 amended as follows:

12	37-3-87.	(1)	This	section	shall	be	known	and	may	be	cited

- 13 as the "Mississippi Vision for Better Learning Program."
- 14 (2) Beginning July 1, 2018, prior to a student entering or

15 enrolling for the first time in a Mississippi public, private or

16 parochial school approved and accredited by the State Board of

17 Education, every student may have a comprehensive eye examination

18 performed by an optometrist or ophthalmologist. Before the end of

19 the first semester of the start of the school year, the parent or

20 guardian of each student shall present, to the appropriate school

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21 personnel, evidence that the student passed an eye examination

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22	within the previous six (6) months or a waiver by the parent or				
23	guardian of each student opting out of the eye examination. For				
24	purposes of this subsection, the term "waiver" means any written				
25	notification from the parent or guardian in typed or handwritten				
26	format and signed by the parent or guardian. The waiver may also				
27	be in a form designed in accordance with the rules promulgated by				
28	the department. The State Department of Education, with the				
29	advice of the Mississippi Vision Foundation, on or before July 1,				
30	2018, shall promulgate rules establishing the criteria for meeting				
31	the requirements of this comprehensive eye examination, which				
32	shall include, but not be limited to, the following:				
33	(a) A measurement of visual acuity; ocular alignment				
34	and motility; depth perception-stereopsis; fusion; slit lamp;				
35	examination of the anterior segment, posterior segment and pupils;				
36	and cycloplegic refraction and dilated fundus examination when				
37	deemed appropriate by the examiner;				
38	(b) Any eye doctor who conducts a comprehensive eye				
39	examination of a student given in accordance with the provisions				
40	of this section shall forward a written report of the results of				
41	the examination to the parent or guardian of such student and the				
42	student's primary health care provider. It shall be the				
43	responsibility of the parent or guardian to forward a copy of the				
44	report to school health personnel. The report shall include, but				
45	not be limited to, the following:				
46	(i) The date of report;				

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47 The name, address and date of birth of the (ii) 48 student; 49 (iii) The name of the student's school; 50 (iv) The type of examination; 51 (v) A summary of significant findings, including 52 diagnosis, medication used, duration of action of medication, 53 treatment, prognosis and whether or not a return visit is 54 recommended, and if so, when; 55 (vi) Recommended educational adjustments and 56 accommodations for the student, if any, which may include: 57 preferential seating in the classroom, eyeglasses for full-time 58 use in school, eyeglasses for part-time use in school, 59 sight-saving eyeglasses or any other recommendations; and 60 (vii) The name, address and signature of the 61 examiner; and 62 (C) Enforcement of the provisions of this subsection 63 (2) shall be performed by the local school superintendent, or his 64 designee, the headmaster of the private or parochial school, or 65 his designee, or the director of the kindergarten program, as 66 appropriate. 67 ( \* \* \*3) In addition to the comprehensive eye examination 68 required under subsection (2) of this section, the State 69 Department of Education is hereby authorized and empowered to 70 establish a student vision-screening program to make eye-screening 71 services available to students in Grades K-12 in the public

Such eye-screening service shall be based on a process that is screening in nature, and not diagnostic, which is 74 75 intended to identify with a reasonably high probability, students 76 with a wide range of eye problems who should seek the services of 77 an eye care professional for examination, diagnosis and corrective recommendation. Each school shall be provided with a list of the 78 79 students screened, and their results. Statistical summaries of 80 the screening results shall be provided to each school, and 81 composite statistics by school system, county or district shall be 82 provided to the State Department of Education. The State Department of Education may contract with any legal entity to 83 84 administer the student vision-screening program on the school 85 district level, and such contract shall be let on a competitive 86 basis. State funding for said program shall only be available 87 subject to appropriation by the Legislature.

88 (\*\*\*<u>4</u>) The school board of any local school district 89 shall cooperate with the State Department of Education and any 90 entity under contract with the departments to implement the 91 student <u>eye examination or vision-screening programs</u> established 92 under this section.

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94 <u>(5) Any additional costs for student eye examinations that</u> 95 <u>are not covered by existing insurance or public assistance</u> 96 <u>programs shall be managed by the Mississippi Vision Foundation.</u>
