HOUSE BILL NO. 923

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-1-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE PENALTIES FOR ATTEMPTED CAPITAL OFFENSES; AND FOR RELATED 3 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 97-1-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 97-1-7. (1) Every person who shall design and endeavor to commit an offense, and shall do any overt act toward the 8 9 commission thereof, but shall fail therein, or shall be prevented from committing the same, on conviction thereof, shall, where no 10 11 other specific provision is made by law for the punishment of the attempt, be punished by imprisonment and fine for a period and for 12 an amount not greater than is prescribed for the actual commission 13 14 of the offense so attempted. (2) Every person who shall design and endeavor to commit an 15

act which, if accomplished, would constitute an offense of murder under Section 97-3-19, but shall fail therein, or shall be prevented from committing the same, shall be guilty of attempted

19 murder and, upon conviction, shall be imprisoned for life in the 20 custody of the Department of Corrections if the punishment is so 21 fixed by the jury in its verdict after a separate sentencing 22 proceeding. If the jury fails to agree on fixing the penalty at 23 imprisonment for life, the court shall fix the penalty at not less 24 than twenty (20) years in the custody of the Department of 25 Corrections.

26 (3) For any conviction for an attempted offense under this
27 section, the penalty ordered by the court shall not be greater
28 than the penalty imposed by law for the actual commission of the
29 offense, but in no case shall the death penalty be imposed.
30 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
31 and after July 1, 2018.
