HOUSE BILL NO. 981

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-21-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE ASSIGNMENT OF AN ASSISTANT TEACHER TO EVERY CLASSROOM FOR KINDERGARTEN THROUGH FOURTH GRADE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-21-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 37-21-7. (1) This section shall be referred to as the
- 8 "Mississippi Elementary Schools Assistant Teacher Program," the
- 9 purpose of which shall be to provide an early childhood education
- 10 program that assists in the instruction of basic skills. The
- 11 State Board of Education is authorized, empowered and directed to
- 12 implement a statewide system of assistant teachers in kindergarten
- 13 classes and in the first, second * * *, third and fourth grades.
- 14 The assistant teacher shall assist pupils in actual instruction
- 15 under the strict supervision of a licensed teacher.
- 16 (2) (a) Except as otherwise authorized under subsection
- 17 (7), each school district shall employ the total number of
- 18 assistant teachers funded under subsection (6) of this section.

- 19 The superintendent of each district shall assign the assistant
- 20 teachers to the kindergarten, first-, second- * * *, third- * * *
- 21 and fourth-grade classes in the district in a manner that will
- 22 promote the maximum efficiency, as determined by the
- 23 superintendent, in the instruction of skills such as verbal and
- 24 linguistic skills, logical and mathematical skills, and social
- 25 skills.
- 26 (b) If a licensed teacher to whom an assistant teacher
- 27 has been assigned is required to be absent from the classroom, the
- 28 assistant teacher may assume responsibility for the classroom in
- 29 lieu of a substitute teacher. However, no assistant teacher shall
- 30 assume sole responsibility of the classroom for more than three
- 31 (3) consecutive school days. Further, in no event shall any
- 32 assistant teacher be assigned to serve as a substitute teacher for
- 33 any teacher other than the licensed teacher to whom that assistant
- 34 teacher has been assigned.
- 35 (3) Assistant teachers shall have, at a minimum, a high
- 36 school diploma or a High School Equivalency Diploma equivalent,
- 37 and shall show demonstratable proficiency in reading and writing
- 38 skills. The State Department of Education shall develop a testing
- 39 procedure for assistant teacher applicants to be used in all
- 40 school districts in the state.
- 41 (4) (a) In order to receive funding, each school district
- 42 shall:

- 46 (ii) Develop a plan of educational accountability
 47 and assessment of performance, including pretests and posttests,

- 49 (b) Additionally, each school district shall:
- (i) Provide annually a mandatory preservice

 orientation session, using an existing in-school service day, for

 administrators and teachers on the effective use of assistant

 teachers as part of a team in the classroom setting and on the
- 55 (ii) Hold periodic workshops for administrators

role of assistant teachers, with emphasis on program goals;

- 56 and teachers on the effective use and supervision of assistant

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- 58 (iii) Provide training annually on specific
- 59 instructional skills for assistant teachers;
- 60 (iv) Annually evaluate their program in accordance
- 61 with their educational accountability and assessment of
- 62 performance plan; and
- (v) Designate the necessary personnel to supervise
- 64 and report on their program.
- 65 (5) The State Department of Education shall:
- 66 (a) Develop and assist in the implementation of a
- 67 statewide uniform training module, subject to the availability of

- 68 funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, which
- 69 shall be used in all school districts for training administrators,
- 70 teachers and assistant teachers. The module shall provide for the
- 71 consolidated training of each assistant teacher and teacher to
- 72 whom the assistant teacher is assigned, working together as a
- 73 team, and shall require further periodic training for
- 74 administrators, teachers and assistant teachers regarding the role
- 75 of assistant teachers;
- 76 (b) Annually evaluate the program on the district and
- 77 state level. Subject to the availability of funds specifically
- 78 appropriated therefor by the Legislature, the department shall
- 79 develop: (i) uniform evaluation reports, to be performed by the
- 80 principal or assistant principal, to collect data for the annual
- 81 overall program evaluation conducted by the department; or (ii) a
- 82 program evaluation model that, at a minimum, addresses process
- 83 evaluation; and
- 84 (c) Promulgate rules, regulations and such other
- 85 standards deemed necessary to effectuate the purposes of this
- 86 section. Noncompliance with the provisions of this section and
- 87 any rules, regulations or standards adopted by the department may
- 88 result in a violation of compulsory accreditation standards as
- 89 established by the State Board of Education and the Commission on
- 90 School Accreditation.
- 91 (6) In addition to other funds allotted under the Minimum
- 92 Education or Adequate Education Program, each school district

shall be allotted sufficient funding for the purpose of employing assistant teachers. No assistant teacher shall be paid less than the amount he or she received in the prior school year. No school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the aggregate amount of the local contribution to the salaries of assistant teachers by the district shall have been reduced below such amount for the previous year.

For the 2007-2008 school year and school years thereafter,
the minimum salary for assistant teachers shall be Twelve Thousand
Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500.00).

In addition, for each one percent (1%) that the Sine Die General Fund Revenue Estimate Growth exceeds five percent (5%) in fiscal year 2006, as certified by the Legislative Budget Office to the State Board of Education and subject to the specific appropriation therefor by the Legislature, the State Board of Education shall revise the salary scale in the appropriate year to provide an additional one percent (1%) across_the_board increase in the base salaries for assistant teachers. The State Board of Education shall revise the salaries prescribed above for assistant teachers to conform to any adjustments made in prior fiscal years due to revenue growth over and above five percent (5%). The assistant teachers shall not be restricted to working only in the grades for which the funds were allotted, but may be assigned to other classes as provided in subsection (2)(a) of this section.

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- 117 (7) (a) As an alternative to employing assistant teachers,
- 118 any school district may use the allotment provided under
- 119 subsection (6) of this section for the purpose of employing
- 120 licensed teachers for kindergarten, first-, second- * * *,
- 121 third- * * * and fourth-grade classes; however, no school district
- 122 shall be authorized to use the allotment for assistant teachers
- 123 for the purpose of employing licensed teachers unless the district
- 124 has established that the employment of licensed teachers using
- 125 such funds will reduce the teacher: student ratio in the
- 126 kindergarten, first-, second- * * *, third- * * * and fourth-grade
- 127 classes. All state funds for assistant teachers shall be applied
- 128 to reducing teacher: student ratio in Grades K-3.
- 129 It is the intent of the Legislature that no school district
- 130 shall dismiss any assistant teacher for the purpose of using the
- 131 assistant teacher allotment to employ licensed teachers. School
- 132 districts may rely only upon normal attrition to reduce the number
- 133 of assistant teachers employed in that district.
- 134 (b) Districts meeting the highest levels of
- 135 accreditation standards, as defined by the State Board of
- 136 Education, shall be exempted from the provisions of subsection (4)
- 137 of this section.
- 138 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 139 and after July 1, 2018.
