HOUSE BILL NO. 1007

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-1-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 DECLARE THE POLICY OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO CONSERVE, 3 PROTECT AND ENCOURAGE THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPROVEMENT OF 4 AGRICULTURE AND AGRICULTURAL OPERATIONS CONDUCTED BY 5 MISSISSIPPIANS TO MAINTAIN A RIGHT TO FARM USING ALL GENERALLY 6 ACCEPTED FARMING AND LIVESTOCK PRODUCTION PRACTICES, INCLUDING THE 7 USE OF EVER-CHANGING TECHNOLOGY; TO PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE WITH REGARD TO PROTECTING 8 9 AND PROMOTING THOSE RIGHTS; TO AMEND SECTION 95-3-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE DEFINITION OF "AGRICULTURAL OPERATION" 10 UNDER THE "FREEDOM TO FARM ACT" TO INCLUDE THE USE OF SCIENTIFIC 11 12 AND TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS; TO EXEMPT AGRICULTURAL OPERATIONS 13 FROM NUISANCE ACTIONS SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS; AND FOR 14 RELATED PURPOSES.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

16 SECTION 1. Section 69-1-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

17 amended as follows:

18 69-1-1. (1) A Department of Agriculture and Commerce is 19 created and established under the management and control of a 20 public officer to be known as the Commissioner of Agriculture and 21 Commerce, who shall have competent knowledge of agriculture, 22 mining, manufacturing, statistics and general industries, must be 23 an experienced and practical agriculturist; and shall be elected 24 by the people at the time and in the manner that other state 25 officers are elected.

26 (2) (a) The Legislature declares that it is the policy of the state to conserve, protect and encourage the development and 27 improvement of agriculture, agricultural operations and 28 29 agricultural lands for the production of food, fuel, fiber and other agricultural products. Title 69, Mississippi Code of 1972, 30 31 shall be construed to protect the rights of farmers to choose 32 among all generally accepted farming and livestock production 33 practices, including the use of ever-changing technology. 34 The Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall (b) 35 promote the growth of agricultural operations by the following 36 methods: 37 (i) Assisting agricultural operations with the 38 permit process required to conduct the desired agricultural 39 practice in Mississippi; and 40 (ii) Serving as liaison between agricultural businesses, federal and state agencies, its political subdivisions 41 42 and local units of government. 43 SECTION 2. Section 95-3-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 44 amended as follows: 45 95-3-29. (1) (a) In any nuisance action, public or 46 private, against an agricultural operation, including forestry activity, proof that the agricultural operation, including 47 forestry activity, has existed for one (1) year or more is an 48 H. 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49	absolute defense to the nuisance action, if the operation is in		
50	compliance with all applicable state and federal permits.		
51	(b) An agricultural operation or any of its		
52	appurtenances is not and does not become a nuisance, private or		
53	public, by any changed conditions in the vicinity of the locality		
54	after the agricultural or industrial operation, as the case may		
55	be, has been in operation continuously on the locality for more		
56	than one (1) year if the following conditions exist:		
57	(i) There is no significant change in the type of		
58	operation. A significant change in the type of agricultural		
59	operation does not include the following:		
60	1. The conversion from one (1) type of		
61	agricultural operation to another type of agricultural operation;		
62	2. A change in the ownership or size of the		
63	agricultural operation;		
64	3. The enrollment or the reduction or		
65	cessation of participation of the agricultural operation in a		
66	government program; or		
67	4. Adoption of new technology by the		
68	agricultural operation; or		
69	(ii) The operation would not have been a nuisance		
70	at the time the agricultural operation began in that locality.		
71	(2) The following words and phrases as used in this section		
72	shall have the meanings given them in this section:		

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73 (a) "Agricultural operation" includes, without 74 limitation, any facility or production site for the production and 75 processing of crops, or products thereof, livestock, or products 76 thereof, farm-raised fish and fish products, livestock products, 77 honeybees, honey and other products of the beehive, wood, timber 78 or forest products, fowl or plants for breeding or sales and 79 poultry or poultry products for commercial or industrial purposes. "Agricultural operation" also includes the use of farm machinery, 80 81 equipment, devices, chemicals, products, scientific and 82 technological advancements for agricultural use, materials and 83 structures designed for agricultural use and used in accordance with best agricultural management practices and are in compliance 84 85 with any applicable state and federal permits.

(b) "Forestry activity" means any activity associated
with the reforesting, growing, managing, protecting and harvesting
of timber, wood and forest products including nongame species.

(c) "Traditional farm practices" means those accepted
customs and standards established and followed by similar
agricultural operations under similar circumstances.

92 <u>(d) "Scientific and technological advancements" means</u> 93 <u>the various farming techniques and methods that extend beyond the</u> 94 <u>scope of generally accepted customs and standards established and</u> 95 <u>used in traditional farm practices.</u>

99 (4) This section shall not affect actions commenced prior to100 July 1, 1980.

101 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 102 and after July 1, 2018.

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
