HOUSE BILL NO. 1012

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-6-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD ON LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER 3 STANDARDS AND TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 45-6-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 6 45-6-5. (1) There is hereby created the Board on Law 7 Enforcement Officer Standards and Training, which shall consist of 8 9 thirteen (13) members. (2) (a) The Governor shall appoint \* \* \* five (5) members 10 11 of the board from the following specified categories: 12 (i) **\* \* \*** One (1) member who is a chief of police of a municipality in this state \* \* \*. 13 14 (ii) One (1) member who is a sheriff in this 15 state. 16 (iii) One (1) member who is a district attorney in 17 this state. 18 (iv) One (1) member who is a representative of 19 higher education and who has a degree in one (1) of the following 20 areas of study: corrections, criminal justice or public 21 administration.

(v) One (1) member who is a nonsupervisoryrank-and-file law enforcement officer.

24 The initial appointments to the board shall be made (b) 25 by the Governor no later than twenty (20) days after April 7, 1981, as follows: the chief of police and the representative of 26 27 higher education each shall be appointed for a term of two (2) 28 years; and the sheriff and the district attorney each shall be 29 appointed for a term of three (3) years. Upon the expiration of 30 the terms of the initial appointees to the board, each subsequent appointment shall be made for a term of three (3) years, beginning 31 on the date of the expiration of the previous term. A vacancy in 32 33 any appointed position on the board \* \* \* before the expiration of 34 a term shall be filled by appointment of the Governor only for the balance of the unexpired term. Appointments shall be made within 35 36 sixty (60) days of the occurrence of the vacancy.

37 (c) Any member appointed under this subsection who 38 fails to attend three (3) consecutive meetings of the board shall 39 be subject to removal by the Governor. The president of the board 40 shall notify the Governor in writing when a member has failed to 41 attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings.

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42 (3) The remaining \* \* \* eight (8) members of the board shall
43 be the following:

44 (a) The Attorney General, or his <u>or her</u> designee.
45 (b) The Director of the Mississippi Highway Safety
46 Patrol, or his or her designee.

47 (c) The President of the Mississippi Municipal
48 Association, or his <u>or her</u> designee who is a member of the
49 association.

50 (d) The President of the Mississippi Association of 51 Supervisors, or his <u>or her</u> designee who is a member of the 52 association.

53 (e) The President of the Mississippi Constable 54 Association, or his <u>or her</u> designee who is a member of the 55 association.

(f) The President of the Mississippi Campus Law
Enforcement Officers Association, or his <u>or her</u> designee who is a
member of the association.

(g) The President of the Mississippi Sheriffs'
Association, or his <u>or her</u> designee who is a member of the
association.

62 (h) The President of the Mississippi Association of 63 Chiefs of Police, or his or her designee who is a member of the 64 association.

The Attorney General, the Director of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol and the respective presidents of the foregoing

associations, or their designees, shall serve only for theirrespective terms of office.

69 (4) Members of the board shall serve without compensation, 70 but shall be entitled to receive reimbursement for any actual and 71 reasonable expenses incurred as a necessary incident to such 72 service, including mileage, as provided in Section 25-3-41.

(5) There shall be a \* \* \* <u>chair</u> and a vice \* \* \* <u>chair</u> of the board, elected by and from the membership of the board. The board shall adopt rules and regulations governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner of conducting its business, but the board shall meet at least every three (3) months.

78 (6) The Governor shall call an organizational meeting of the79 board not later than thirty (30) days after April 7, 1981.

(7) If a person appointed to the board no longer occupies
the status qualifying that person's appointment, that position on
the board shall be immediately vacated and filled ex officio or by
appointment of the Governor as otherwise provided in this section.
(8) The board shall report annually to the Governor and the
Legislature on its activities, and may make such other reports as

86 it deems desirable.

(9) The training officers of all police academies in the state whose curricula are approved by the board shall be advisors to the board. They shall be entitled to all privileges of the board members, including travel expenses and subsistence, but shall not be eligible to vote at board meetings.

92 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 93 and after its passage.
