## HOUSE BILL NO. 1037

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-161-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
  TO REQUIRE THAT PRIVATE PROVIDERS CHOSEN TO PROVIDE SERVICES TO
  THE MISSISSIPPI VIRTUAL PUBLIC SCHOOL PROGRAM BE SELECTED THROUGH
  THE MISSISSIPPI ONLINE LEARNING APPLICATION PROCESS; TO PROVIDE
  AUTHORITY TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO HAVE FINAL
  APPROVAL OF ALL COURSEWORK AND POLICY RELATED TO THE MISSISSIPPI
  VIRTUAL PUBLIC SCHOOL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-161-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 37-161-3. (1) The Legislature finds and declares the
- 12 following:
- 13 (a) Meeting the educational needs of children in our
- 14 state's schools is of the greatest importance to the future
- 15 welfare of the State of Mississippi;
- 16 (b) Closing the achievement gap between high-performing
- 17 students, including the achievement gap among at-risk students, is
- 18 a significant and present challenge;
- 19 (c) Providing a broader range of educational options to
- 20 parents and utilizing existing resources, along with technology,

- 21 may help students in the state improve their academic achievement;
- 22 and
- 23 (d) Many of the state's school districts currently lack
- 24 the capacity to provide other public school choices for students
- 25 whose schools are low performing.
- 26 (2) There is created the Mississippi Virtual Public School
- 27 Program, which is the responsibility of the State Department of
- 28 Education. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 29 Mississippi Virtual Public School established under this section
- 30 provides Mississippi families with an alternative choice to access
- 31 additional educational resources in an effort to improve academic
- 32 achievement. The Mississippi Virtual Public School must be
- 33 recognized as a public school and provide equitable treatment and
- 34 resources as are other public schools in the state. Private
- 35 providers, overseen by the State Department of Education, may be
- 36 selected by the State Board of Education to administer, manage or
- 37 operate virtual school programs in this state, including the total
- 38 operation of the Mississippi Virtual Public School Program. Any
- 39 private provider chosen to provide services under the provisions
- 40 of this subsection shall be chosen through \* \* \* the Mississippi
- 41 Online Learning Application Process.
- 42 (3) Nothing in this section may be interpreted as precluding
- 43 the use of computer- and Internet-based instruction for students
- 44 in a virtual or remote setting utilizing the Mississippi Virtual
- 45 Public School.

- 46 (4) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 47 have the meanings respectively ascribed unless the context clearly
- 48 requires otherwise:
- 49 (a) "Mississippi Virtual Public School" means a public
- 50 school in which the state uses technology in order to deliver
- 51 instruction to students via the Internet in a virtual or remote
- 52 setting.
- 53 (b) "Sponsor" means the public school district is
- 54 responsible for the academic process for each student including,
- 55 but not limited to, enrollment, awarding of credit and monitoring
- 56 progress.
- 57 (5) (a) The State Board of Education shall establish the
- 58 Mississippi Virtual Public School beginning in school year
- 59 2006-2007.
- 60 (b) Students who enroll in the Mississippi Virtual
- 61 Public School may reside anywhere in the State of Mississippi.
- 62 (6) Subject to appropriation, the Mississippi Virtual Public
- 63 School shall provide to each student enrolled in the school all
- 64 necessary instructional materials. Subject to appropriation, the
- 65 sponsored school must ensure that each student is provided access
- 66 to the necessary technology, such as a computer and printer, and
- 67 to an Internet connection for school work purposes.
- 68 (7) The State \* \* \* Department of Education shall have
- 69 approval authority for all coursework and policy of the
- 70 Mississippi Virtual Public School.

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- 72 delivery of instruction through the Mississippi Virtual Public
- 73 School must meet all qualifications for licensure in the State of
- 74 Mississippi.
- 75 (9) Any student who meets state residency requirements may
- 76 enroll in the Mississippi Virtual Public School.
- 77 (10) Enrollment in the Mississippi Virtual Public School
- 78 must be free of charge to students. The costs associated with the
- 79 operations of the virtual school must be shared by the State
- 80 Department of Education, subject to appropriation, and/or the
- 81 local school districts.
- 82 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 83 and after July 1, 2018.
