COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1047

1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-25-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL CLOTHING ALLOWANCE ALLOWED TO EACH PLAINCLOTHES INVESTIGATOR EMPLOYED BY A SHERIFF'S OFFICE FROM \$400.00 TO \$700.00; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 19-25-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	19-25-13. The sheriff shall, at the July meeting of the
9	board of supervisors, submit a budget of estimated expenses of his
10	or her office for the ensuing fiscal year beginning October 1 in
11	such form as shall be prescribed by the Director of the State
12	Department of Audit. The board shall examine this proposed budget
13	and determine the amount to be expended by the sheriff in the
14	performance of his or her duties for the fiscal year and may
15	increase or reduce * * * $\frac{1}{2}$ that amount as it deems necessary and
16	proper.
17	The budget shall include amounts for compensating the
18	deputies and other employees of the sheriff's office, for
19	insurance providing protection for the sheriff and his or her

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    deputies in case of disability, death and other similar coverage,
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    for travel and transportation expenses of the sheriff and
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    deputies, for feeding prisoners and inmates of the county jail,
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    and for * * * any other expenses * * * that may be incurred in the
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    performance of the duties of the office of sheriff. In addition,
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    the budget shall include amounts for the payment of premiums on
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    bonds and insurance for the sheriff and his or her deputies which,
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    in the opinion of the board of supervisors, are deemed necessary
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    to protect the interests of the county or the sheriff and his or
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    her deputies. * * * The amounts may include official bonds and
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    any bonds required of his or her deputies by the sheriff;
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    liability insurance; insurance against false arrest charges;
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    insurance against false imprisonment charges; theft, fire and
    other hazards insurance; and hospitalization insurance as provided
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    for in Sections 25-15-101 and 25-15-103. The board may authorize
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    the reimbursement of the sheriff and deputies for the use of
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    privately owned automobiles or other motor vehicles in the
    performance of official duties at the rate provided by law for
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    state officers and employees, or may authorize the purchase by the
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    sheriff of such motor vehicles and such equipment as may be needed
    for operation of the sheriff's office, * * * the vehicles and
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    equipment to be owned by the county. In counties * * * that have
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    elected to purchase the motor vehicles and * * * the equipment for
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    the operation of the sheriff's office, if a sheriff or deputy
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shall be required in the performance of his or her official

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- 45 duties, in the event of an emergency, to use his or her privately 46 owned automobile or other motor vehicle, the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, authorize the reimbursement for * * * that 47 48 use at the rate per mile provided by law for state officers and 49 employees. This shall not be construed as giving an officer a 50 choice of whether to use his or her own or the county's vehicle, but shall be construed so as not to penalize an officer who must 51 52 use his or her own vehicle because the county's vehicle was not
- The board of supervisors, in its discretion, may include in 54 55 its annual budget for the sheriff's office an amount not to exceed 56 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), which may be expended by the 57 sheriff to provide food, water and beverages for the sheriff, the sheriff's deputies, state, national and local law enforcement 58 officers, emergency personnel, county employees and members of the 59 60 general public who the sheriff requests to assist him or her and 61 his or her office while in the performance of search and rescue missions, disasters or other emergency operations. 62
- The board of supervisors may acquire one or more credit

 cards * * * that may be used by the sheriff and his or her

 deputies to pay expenses incurred by them when traveling in or out

 of state in the performance of their official duties. The

 chancery clerk or county purchase clerk shall maintain complete

 records of all credit card numbers and all receipts and other

 documents relating to the use of * * * those credit cards. The

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    sheriff shall furnish receipts for the use of * * * the credit
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    cards each month to the chancery clerk or purchase clerk who shall
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    submit a written report monthly to the board of supervisors, which
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    report shall include an itemized list of all expenditures and use
    of the credit cards for the month, and * * * the expenditures may
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    be allowed for payment by the county in the same manner as other
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    items on the claims docket. The issuance of a credit card to a
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    sheriff or his or her deputy under the provisions of this section
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    shall not be construed to authorize * * * the sheriff or deputy
    sheriff to use * * * \underline{\text{the}} credit card to make any expenditure * * *
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    that is not otherwise authorized by law.
         The board of supervisors is hereby authorized and empowered,
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    in its discretion, to appropriate and pay a sum not to
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    exceed * * * Seven Hundred Dollars ($700.00) annually as a
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    clothing allowance to each plainclothes investigator employed by
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    the sheriff's office of * * * that county.
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    supervisors of any county bordering on the Gulf of Mexico and
    having a population of more than thirty-one thousand seven hundred
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    (31,700) but less than thirty-one thousand eight hundred (31,800)
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    according to the 1990 Federal Census may appropriate and pay a sum
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    not to exceed * * * Seven Hundred Dollars ($700.00) annually as a
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    clothing allowance to the administrator of the county jail.
         The board of supervisors shall, at its first meeting of each
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    quarter beginning on October 1, January 1, April 1 and July 1,
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appropriate a lump sum for the sheriff for the expenses of his or

- 95 her office during the current quarter. The quarterly
- 96 appropriation shall be one-fourth (1/4) of the amount approved in
- 97 the annual budget unless the sheriff requests a different amount.
- 98 Except in case of emergency, as provided in the county budget law,
- 99 the appropriation for the quarter beginning in October of the last
- 100 year of the sheriff's term shall not exceed one-fourth (1/4) of
- 101 the annual budget.
- The sheriff shall file a report of all expenses of his or her
- 103 office incurred during the preceding month with the board of
- 104 supervisors for approval at its regular monthly meeting in a form
- 105 to be prescribed by the Director of the State Department of Audit,
- 106 and upon filing thereof, and approval by the board, the clerk of
- 107 the board shall issue warrants in payment thereof but not to
- 108 exceed the budget appropriation for that quarter. Any
- 109 appropriated funds \star \star \star that are unexpended at the end of the
- 110 fiscal year shall remain in the county general fund.
- 111 The budget for the sheriff's office may be revised at any
- 112 regular meeting by the board of supervisors. Upon recommendation
- 113 of the sheriff, the board may at any regular meeting make
- 114 supplemental appropriations to the sheriff's office.
- Any fees previously required to be paid by a sheriff shall be
- 116 paid by the board of supervisors by including the estimates
- 117 therefor in the sheriff's budget. All fees and charges for
- 118 services heretofore collected by sheriffs shall be collected
- 119 by * * * the sheriff and paid monthly into the general fund of the

- 120 concerned county. However, any fees heretofore collected by * * *
- 121 those sheriffs from the county shall not be paid.
- 122 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 123 and after July 1, 2018.
