HOUSE BILL NO. 1047 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-25-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL CLOTHING ALLOWANCE ALLOWED TO EACH 3 PLAINCLOTHES INVESTIGATOR EMPLOYED BY A SHERIFF'S OFFICE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 19-25-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 19-25-13. The sheriff shall, at the July meeting of the 8 9 board of supervisors, submit a budget of estimated expenses of his 10 office for the ensuing fiscal year beginning October 1 in such form as shall be prescribed by the Director of the State 11 12 Department of Audit. The board shall examine this proposed budget and determine the amount to be expended by the sheriff in the 13 14 performance of his duties for the fiscal year and may increase or reduce * * * that amount as it deems necessary and proper. 15 The budget shall include amounts for compensating the 16 17 deputies and other employees of the sheriff's office, for insurance providing protection for the sheriff and his deputies in 18 19 case of disability, death and other similar coverage, for travel H. 20 and transportation expenses of the sheriff and deputies, for 21 feeding prisoners and inmates of the county jail, and for * * * any other expenses * * * that may be incurred in the performance 22 of the duties of the office of sheriff. In addition, the budget 23 24 shall include amounts for the payment of premiums on bonds and 25 insurance for the sheriff and his deputies which, in the opinion of the board of supervisors, are deemed necessary to protect the 26 27 interests of the county or the sheriff and his deputies. * * * 28 The amounts may include official bonds and any bonds required of 29 his deputies by the sheriff; liability insurance; insurance 30 against false arrest charges; insurance against false imprisonment 31 charges; theft, fire and other hazards insurance; and 32 hospitalization insurance as provided for in Sections 25-15-101 and 25-15-103. The board may authorize the reimbursement of the 33 34 sheriff and deputies for the use of privately owned automobiles or 35 other motor vehicles in the performance of official duties at the 36 rate provided by law for state officers and employees, or may authorize the purchase by the sheriff of such motor vehicles and 37 38 such equipment as may be needed for operation of the sheriff's 39 office, * * * the vehicles and equipment to be owned by the 40 county. In counties * * * that have elected to purchase the motor vehicles and * * * the equipment for the operation of the 41 42 sheriff's office, if a sheriff or deputy shall be required in the performance of his official duties, in the event of an emergency, 43 44 to use his privately owned automobile or other motor vehicle, the

No. 1047 18/HR26/R1805SG PAGE 2 (OM\KW) 45 board of supervisors may, in its discretion, authorize the 46 reimbursement for * * * that use at the rate per mile provided by 47 law for state officers and employees. This shall not be construed 48 as giving an officer a choice of whether to use his own or the 49 county's vehicle, but shall be construed so as not to penalize an 50 officer who must use his own vehicle because the county's vehicle 51 was not available.

52 The board of supervisors, in its discretion, may include in 53 its annual budget for the sheriff's office an amount not to exceed 54 One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), which may be expended by the 55 sheriff to provide food, water and beverages for the sheriff, the 56 sheriff's deputies, state, national and local law enforcement 57 officers, emergency personnel, county employees and members of the general public who the sheriff requests to assist him and his 58 59 office while in the performance of search and rescue missions, 60 disasters or other emergency operations.

61 The board of supervisors may acquire one or more credit cards * * * that may be used by the sheriff and his deputies to 62 63 pay expenses incurred by them when traveling in or out of state in 64 the performance of their official duties. The chancery clerk or 65 county purchase clerk shall maintain complete records of all 66 credit card numbers and all receipts and other documents relating to the use of * * * those credit cards. The sheriff shall furnish 67 receipts for the use of * * * the credit cards each month to the 68 chancery clerk or purchase clerk who shall submit a written report 69

No. 1047 18/HR26/R1805SG PAGE 3 (OM\KW) 70 monthly to the board of supervisors, which report shall include an 71 itemized list of all expenditures and use of the credit cards for 72 the month, and * * * the expenditures may be allowed for payment 73 by the county in the same manner as other items on the claims 74 docket. The issuance of a credit card to a sheriff or his deputy 75 under the provisions of this section shall not be construed to 76 authorize * * * the sheriff or deputy sheriff to use * * * the 77 credit card to make any expenditure * * * that is not otherwise 78 authorized by law.

79 The board of supervisors is hereby authorized and empowered, 80 in its discretion, to appropriate and pay a sum not to exceed * * * One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually as a 81 82 clothing allowance to each plainclothes investigator employed by 83 the sheriff's office of *** * *** that county. The board of supervisors of any county bordering on the Gulf of Mexico and 84 85 having a population of more than thirty-one thousand seven hundred 86 (31,700) but less than thirty-one thousand eight hundred (31,800) 87 according to the 1990 Federal Census may appropriate and pay a sum 88 not to exceed *** * *** One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually as a 89 clothing allowance to the administrator of the county jail. 90 The board of supervisors shall, at its first meeting of each 91 quarter beginning on October 1, January 1, April 1 and July 1, 92 appropriate a lump sum for the sheriff for the expenses of his 93 office during the current quarter. The quarterly appropriation shall be one-fourth (1/4) of the amount approved in the annual 94

Except in 96 case of emergency, as provided in the county budget law, the 97 appropriation for the quarter beginning in October of the last 98 year of the sheriff's term shall not exceed one-fourth (1/4) of 99 the annual budget.

100 The sheriff shall file a report of all expenses of his office 101 incurred during the preceding month with the board of supervisors 102 for approval at its regular monthly meeting in a form to be 103 prescribed by the Director of the State Department of Audit, and 104 upon filing thereof, and approval by the board, the clerk of the 105 board shall issue warrants in payment thereof but not to exceed 106 the budget appropriation for that quarter. Any appropriated 107 funds * * * that are unexpended at the end of the fiscal year 108 shall remain in the county general fund.

109 The budget for the sheriff's office may be revised at any 110 regular meeting by the board of supervisors. Upon recommendation 111 of the sheriff, the board may at any regular meeting make 112 supplemental appropriations to the sheriff's office.

Any fees previously required to be paid by a sheriff shall be paid by the board of supervisors by including the estimates therefor in the sheriff's budget. All fees and charges for services heretofore collected by sheriffs shall be collected by * * * the sheriff and paid monthly into the general fund of the concerned county. However, any fees heretofore collected by * * * those sheriffs from the county shall not be paid.

120 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 121 and after July 1, 2018.
